

## Funsters Card

These cute fun monsters make great embellishments for boys cards. Print off the template sheet. You can use the sheet two ways -print direct or draw around. To print direct cut out small pieces of patterned paper or plain card to cover the images you would like to use on the sheet. Tape the edges down with masking tape or low tack tape and then pop it back in your printer and print the sheet again so it prints in the same place but prints on the piece of card. Cut out the embellishments and use them to decorate your choice of card. You can add extra detail to the finished embellishments adding colour with pens.

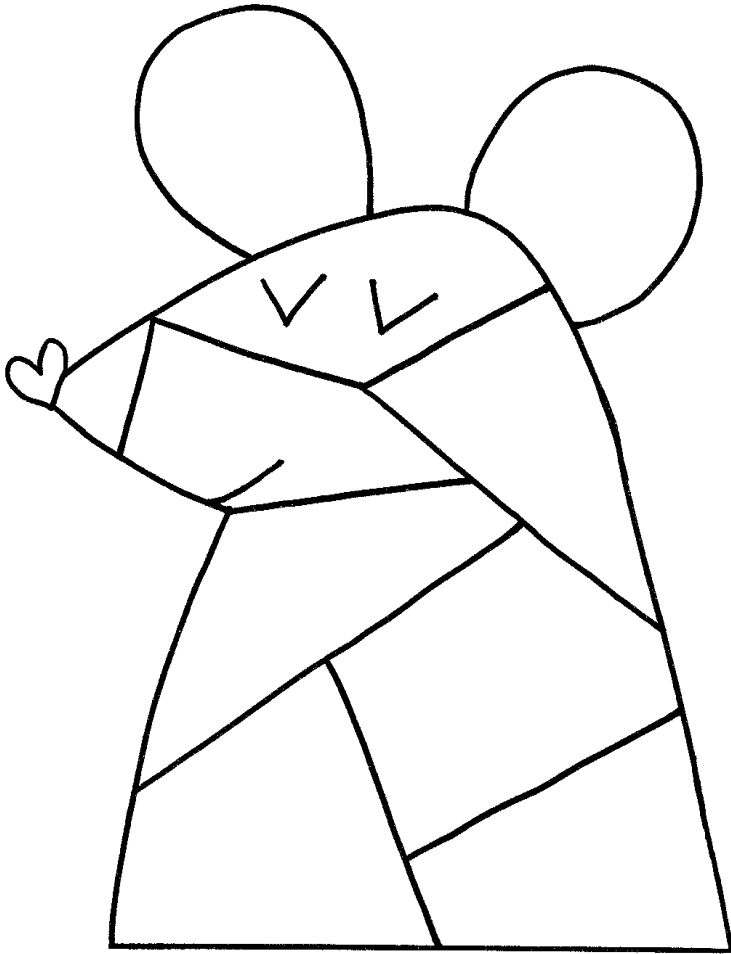
You can also use them as templates by cutting out the sizes you would like to use then drawing around them then adding your own doodling copying the detail from the template.

Experiment making these embellishments from other materials like felt and adding buttons and stitches for the eyes and other details.

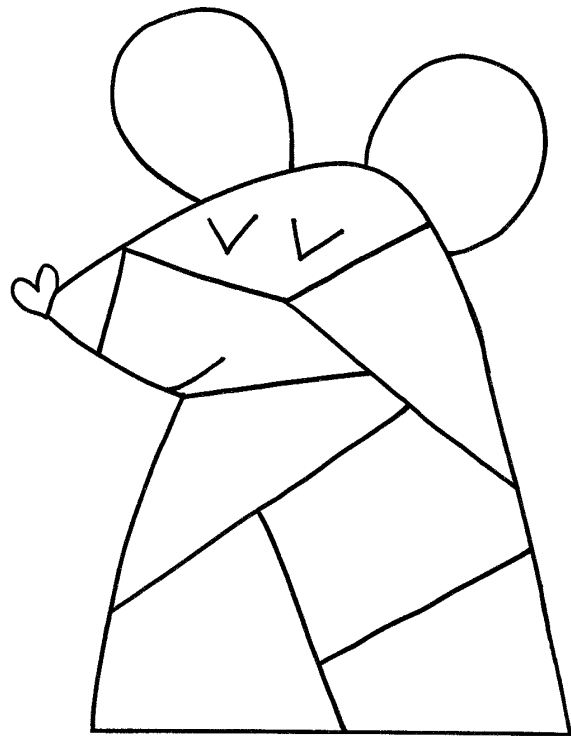

**Patch the mouse**

## Patch the mouse Card

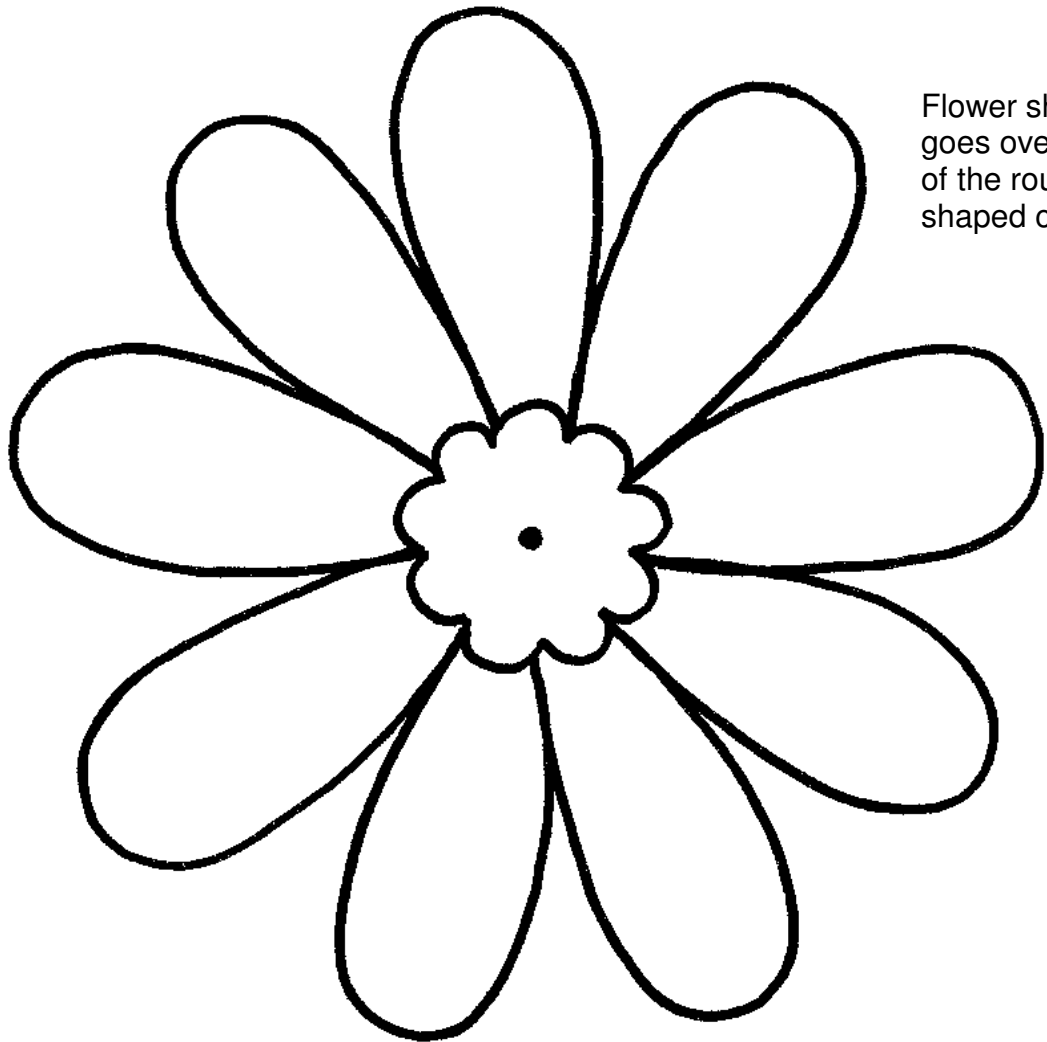
This is a great way to use up small pieces of paper to make an embellishment with a patchwork effect. Print off the template sheet and choose which size you would like to use. Cut out the corresponding template and place it on a piece of card then draw around it and cut it out. To make the patchwork effect, on the template piece number each of the patches on the mouse and put these numbers in the same place on the card piece to act as a guide. Cut the mouse template into the patchwork pieces and draw around each one in turn on to patterned paper then cut them out and attach them to the card mouse shape you cut out earlier using the numbers as a guide of where to put each piece. When you've completed decorating your mouse draw on the details of this nose and eyes and pop him on the front of your choice of card.

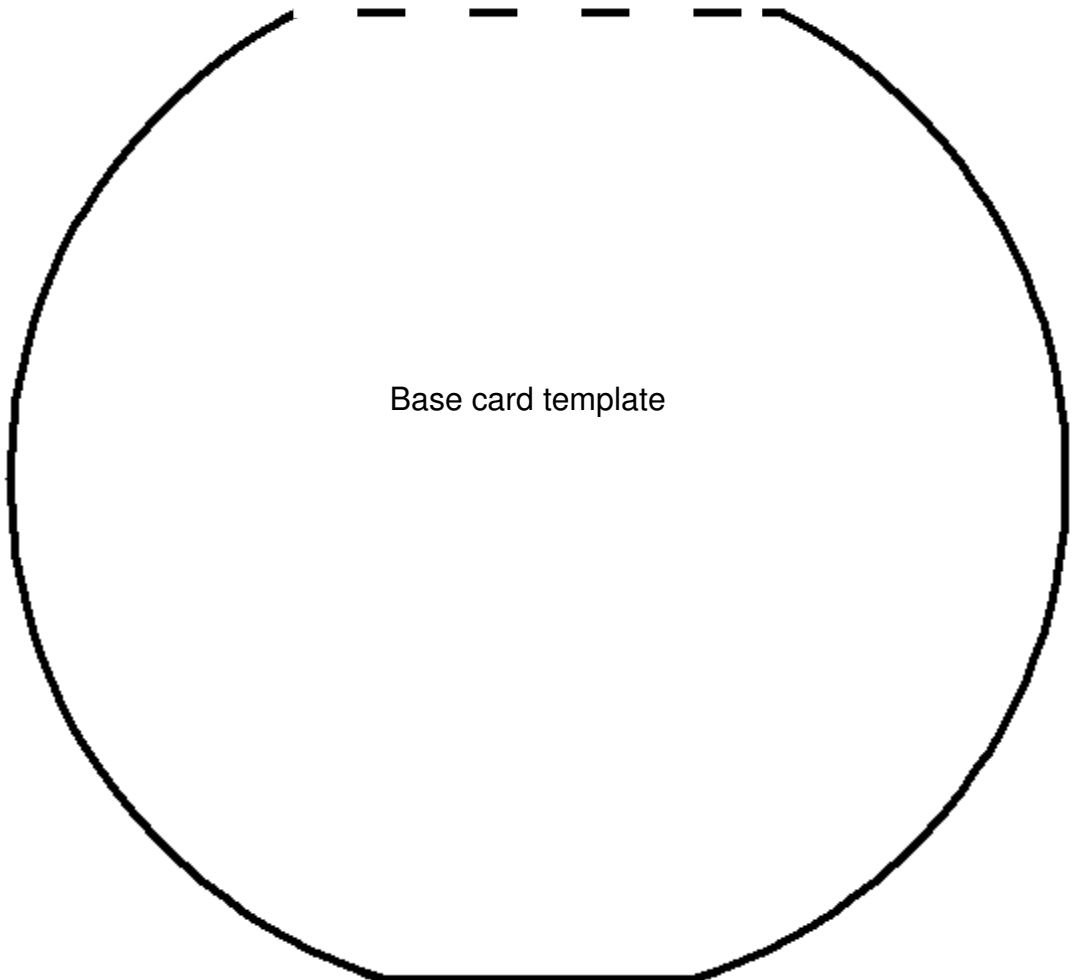

**Round Flower Card**

## Round Flower Card

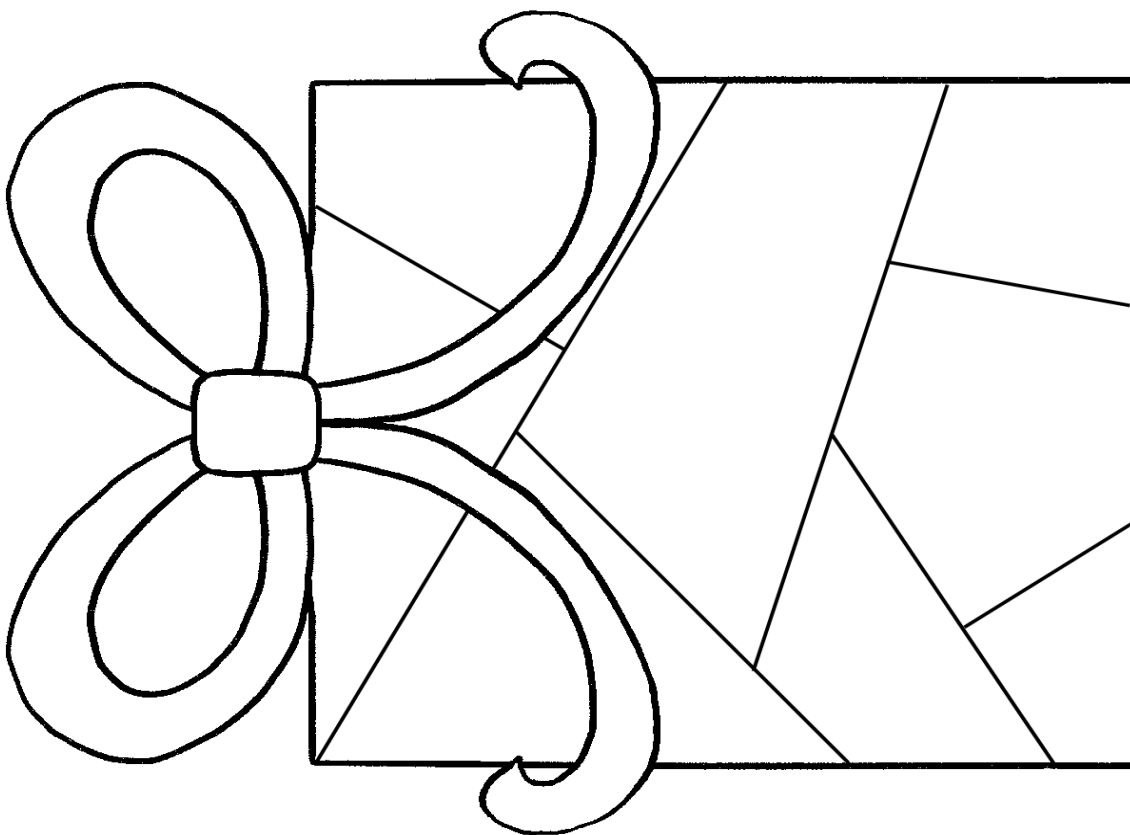
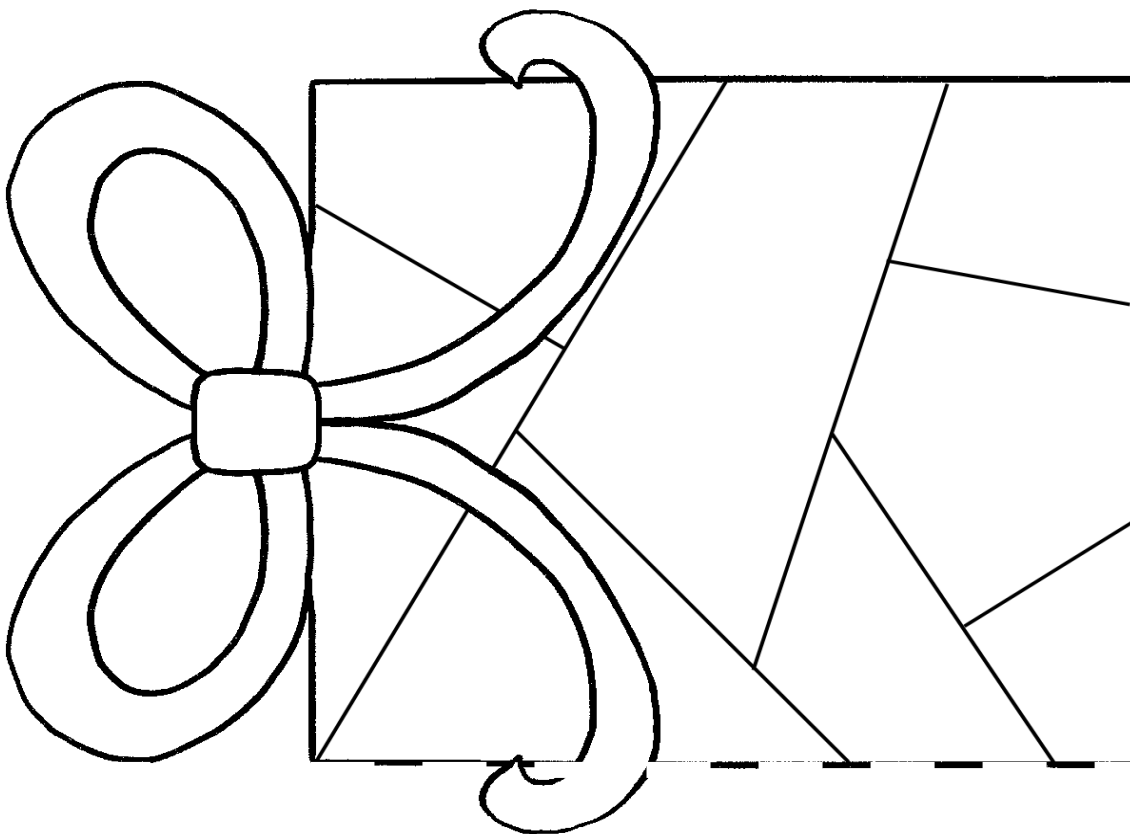
Print off the template sheet. Cut out the base card template first. Fold a piece of A4 card in half and place the base card template on it matching the dashed line up to the fold. Draw around the shape and keeping the card folded cut it out to make your round base card. You can use this round card template for other cards and decorate however you like too.

To make the flower that goes on the top cut out the flower template from the template sheet and draw around it on a piece of card. To make the petals patchwork you need to pick out at least three different patterned papers because there are nine petals. You can pick out a different patterned paper for each petal if you wanted. To make the petals number each one and then write these same numbers on the card piece you cut out earlier this is so you know where each petal goes. Cut the template up in to the petals and the middle section and draw around the petal pieces starting with the piece you marked 1 and then sticking that piece down on your cut out flower shape and moving on to piece 2 doing the same with that and so on until all nine petals are covered with paper. Finish off the flower by drawing around the middle section template piece on to card and cutting it out then attaching it to the middle of the flower. You can alternatively use a ready made embellishment as in the card sample bellow. Once you've finished your flower attach it to the front of your base card.

**Patchwork Present Card**

## Patchwork Present Card

Print off the template sheet and cut out both the present templates. Fold a piece of card in half (you can use A4 or A5) and place the present template with the dashed line on the card matching the dashed line up to the fold. Draw around the shape and keeping the card folded cut out the shape to make your base card.

To make the decorative patchwork effect use the other present template and cut out each of the patches one at a time drawing around them as you go on to patterned paper, cutting them out and sticking them down on your base card. Don't bother trying to cut around the bow on this piece just cut straight across it. Cut the bow shape from the other template piece and draw around that on to patterned or coloured card, cut it out and attach it onto your card. Draw around the edges of the bow to finish.

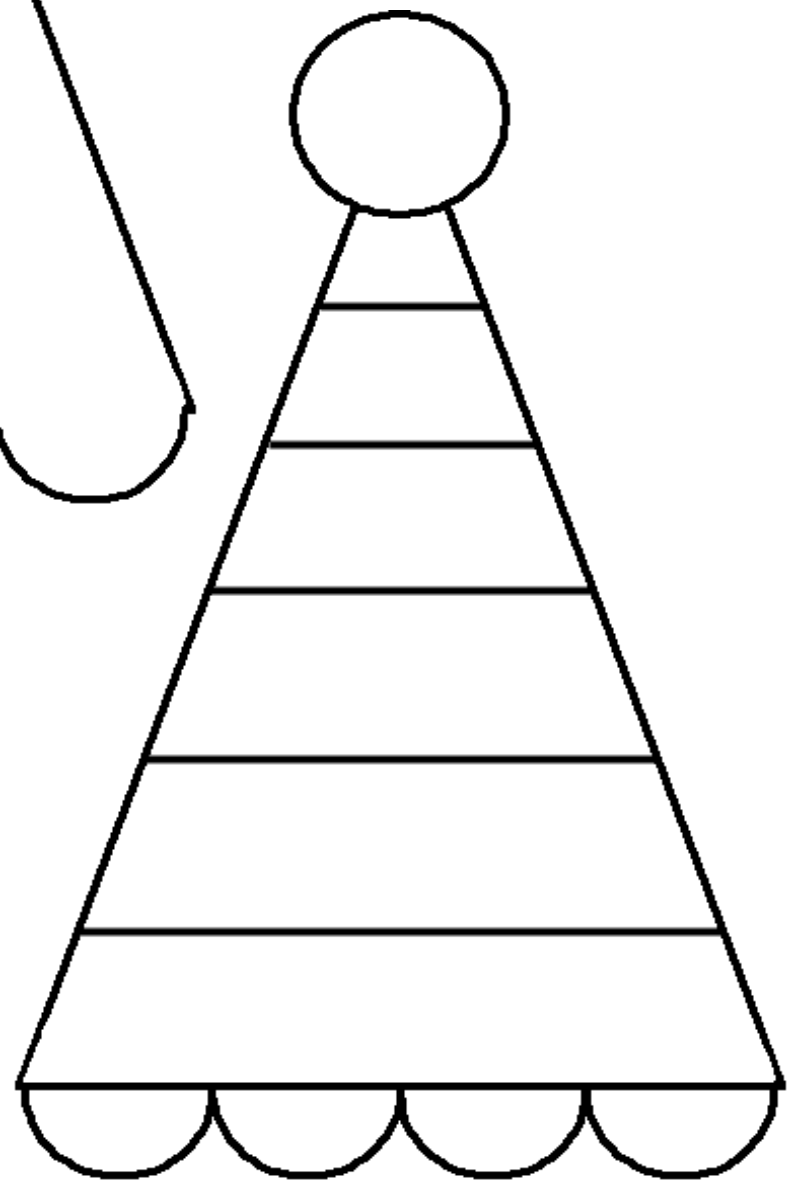
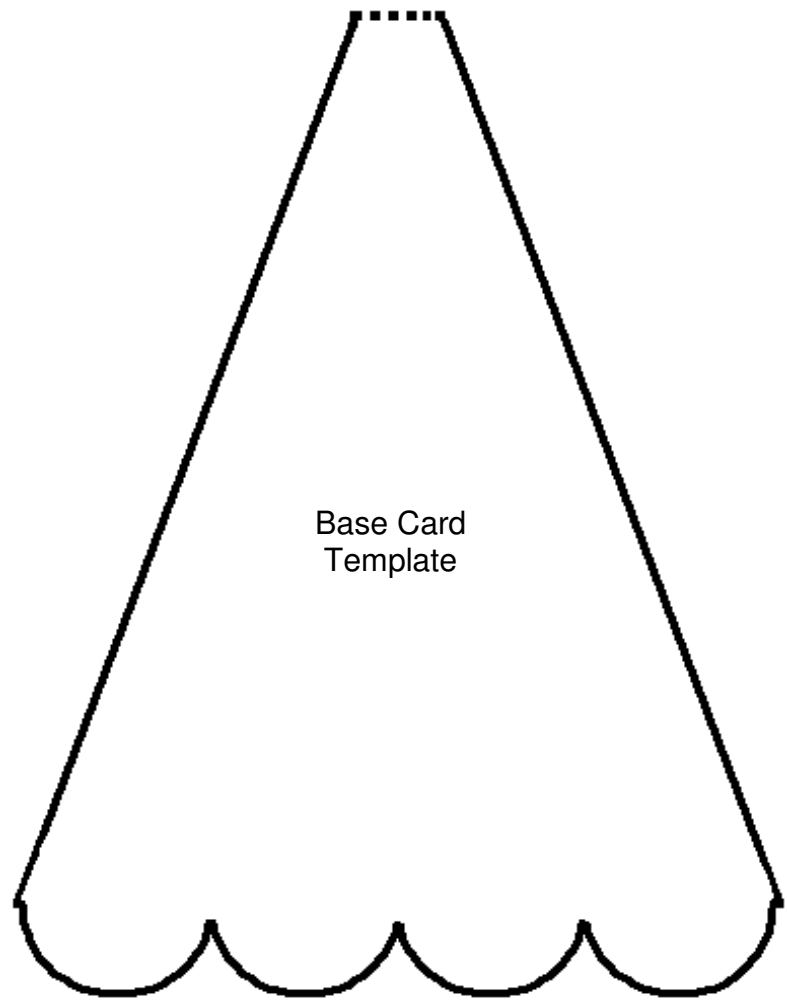

**Patchwork Party Hat Card**

## Patchwork Party Hat Card

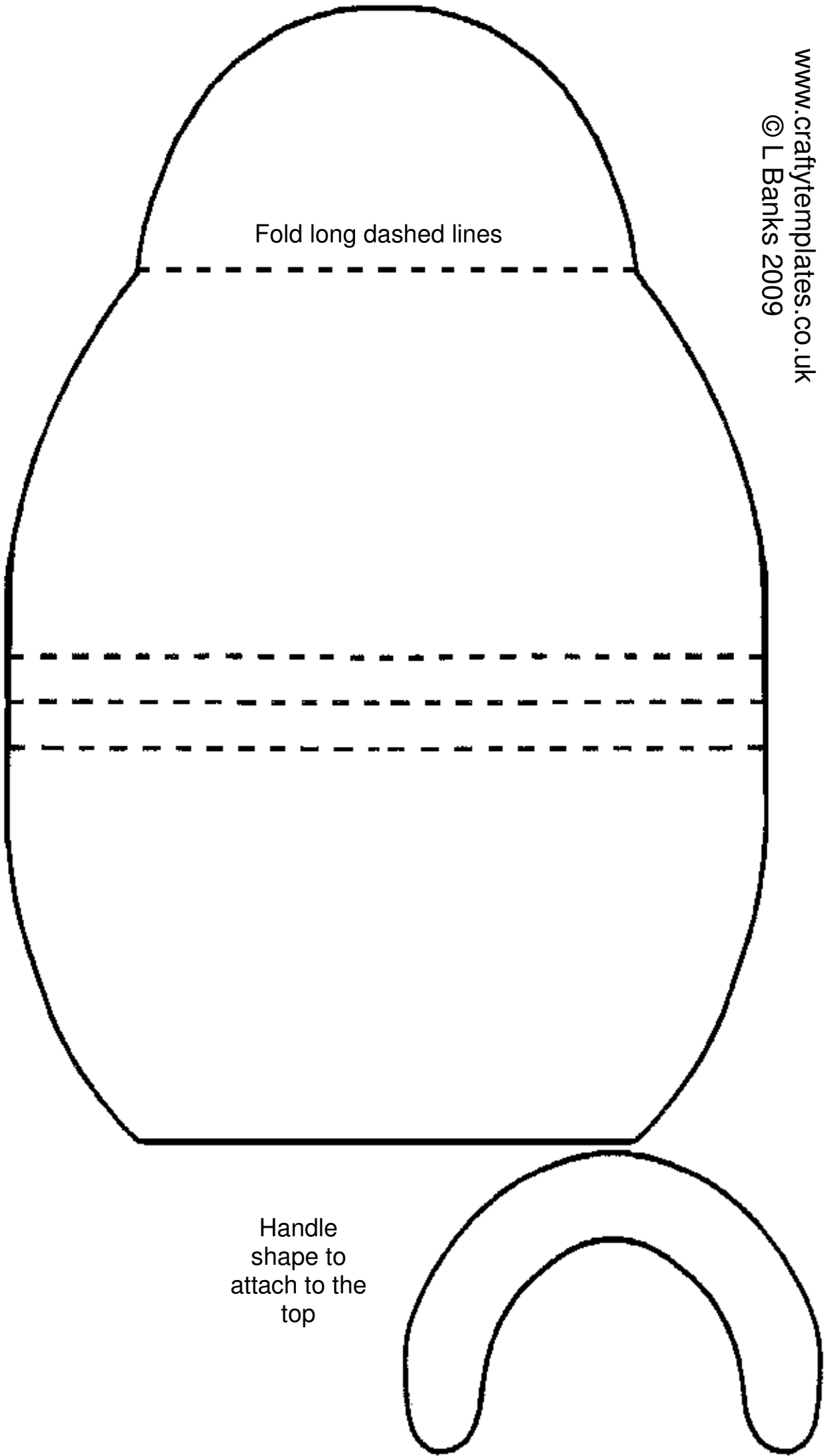
Print off the template sheet and cut out the base card template. Fold a piece of A4 or 6x12" card in half and place the base card template on it matching the dashed line up to the fold. Draw around the shape and cut it out keeping the card folded to make your shaped base card. To decorate the card cut out the other template on the sheet and draw around it on to a piece of card then cut it out. Stick this piece over the top of your base card to create the hat shape. Next to make the striped patchwork pieces cut the at template into the sections and draw around each one on to alternating patterned papers (you can use a different paper for each of the stripes if you preferred). Stick these pieces onto your card. Finish by adding a round piece to the top. You can also add a badge like in the card bellow or you can add something else like a pompom?

**Fold Over Bag Card**



## Fold Over Bag Card

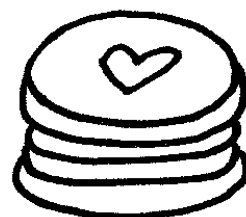
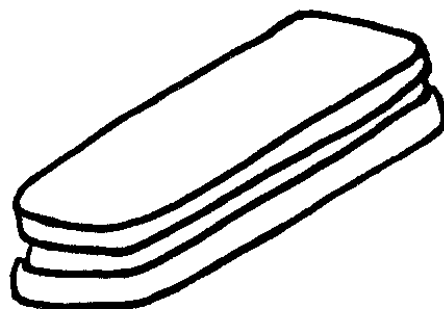
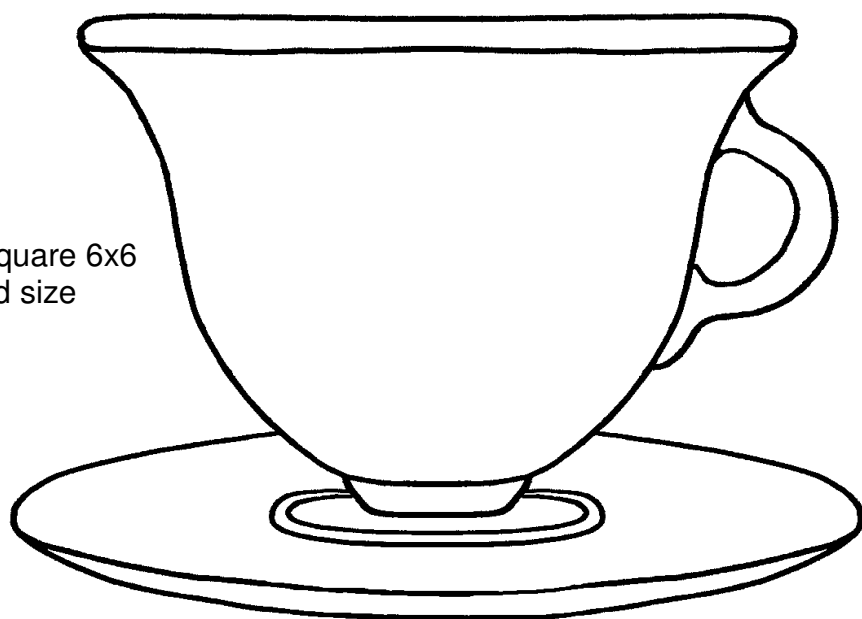
Print off the template sheet and cut out the template. Place it on a piece of card or card weight patterned paper and draw around the shape then cut it out. Keeping the template on the card piece score along the dashed lines so you're scoring through the template and onto the card. Turn the bag shape so the back is facing you and starting at the bottom fold the first line upwards. Fold the next line downward and the next line upwards then finally fold the flap at the top downwards so it folds over the bottom edge and makes the bag shape. It should stand up on its own. Cut out and draw around the handle template on to a piece of card. Place the bag shape on a C6 envelope and stick the handle to the back of your card using the envelope as a guide to how far down it needs to go so it still fits the envelope. It should stick up about 3cm from the top of your card. Decorate the inside of your card and add a message then when you're done stick down the card flap with a little square of double sided tape so it's easy for the recipient to undo and open the bag to reveal the message.

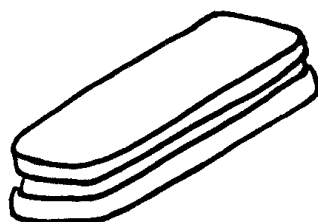

**Teacup Embellishment**



## Teacup Embellishment Card

Print off the template sheet and decide which size you would like to use. Cut out the template and place it on a piece of patterned paper, the pattern you would like the saucer to be and draw around the template onto it then cut it out. Next take the template piece again and cut off the teacup shape from the saucer. Draw around the teacup shape on to a different patterned paper, this time the pattern you want for your teacup. Draw around this and cut it out. Stick it over the top of the first shape you cut out so it covers the teacup shape and just leaves the saucer shape showing.

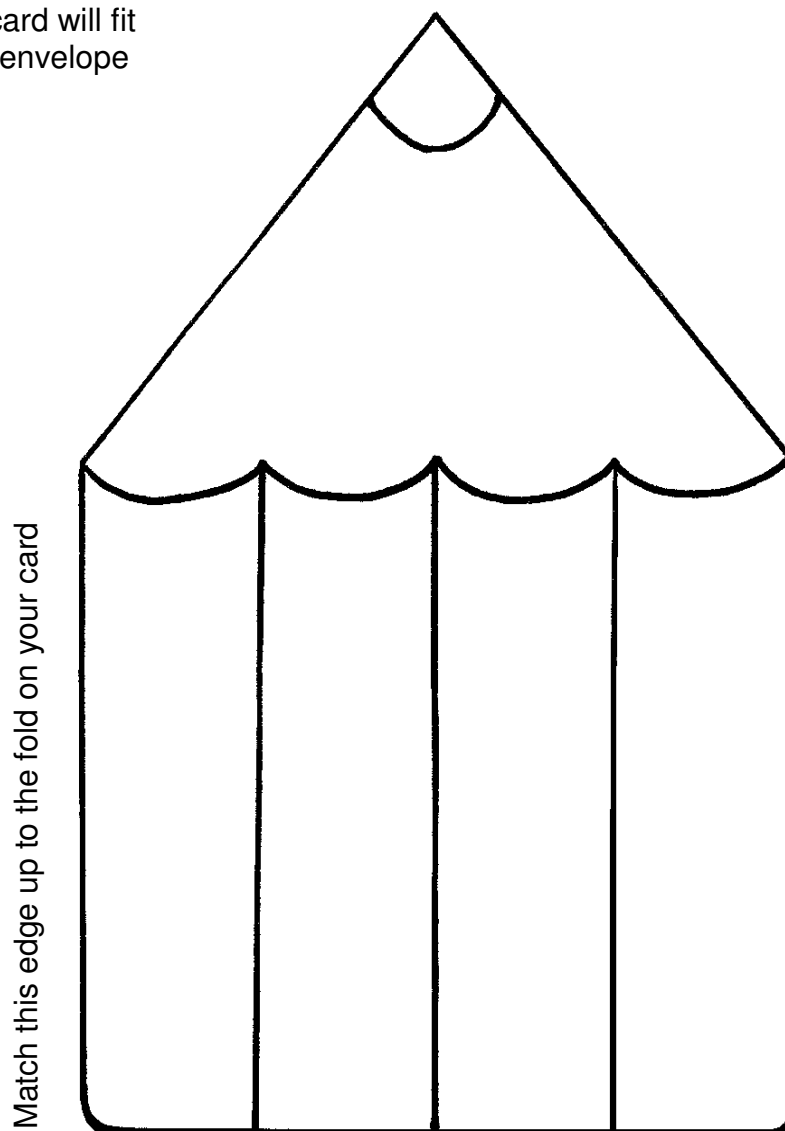
Draw around the edge with a black pen to highlight it. That's your teacup embellishment done. To make a biscuit embellishment cut out the shapes from the template sheet and place them on cream coloured card. Draw around them and cut them out then use coloured pens to add on the detail. Attach to your teacup embellishment. Finish by adding your embellishment to your choice of card blank.

**Chunky Pencil Card**

## Chunky Pencil Card

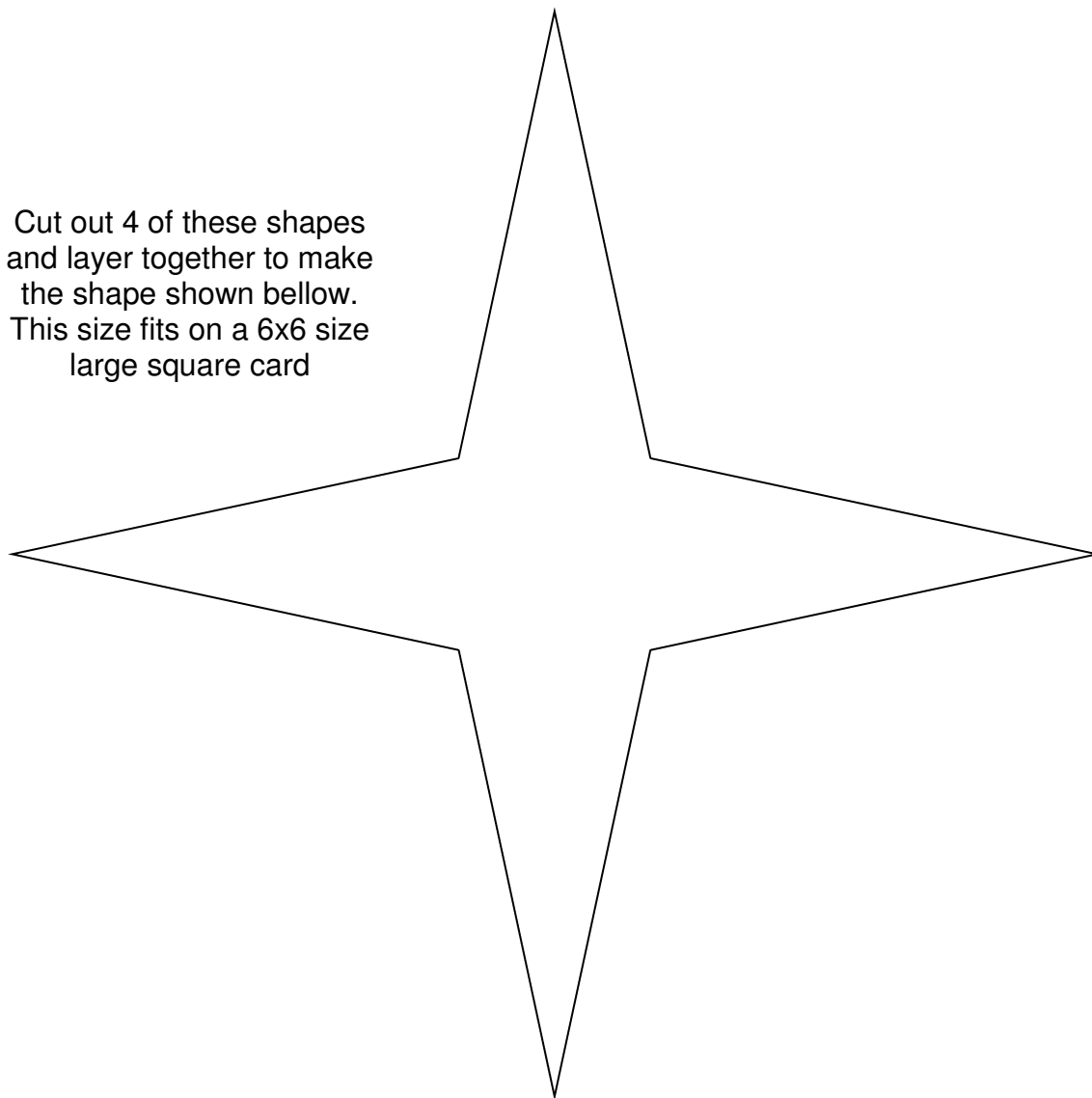
Print off the template sheet and cut out the template. Fold a piece of A4 or A5 sized card in half and place the template on it matching the left side up to the fold on the card. Draw around the shape and keeping the card folded cut out the shape to make your base card. To decorate the card cut out the pieces on the template that make up the pencil shape and draw around the bottom half on to patterned paper or coloured card and the top half onto plain card. Draw around the pencil nib on to a plain colour then attach all the pieces together on the front of your base card. Finish off your card by adding some doodling around the edges and a message. This will make a great well done card for passing exams or a different card for someone who loves drawing or just a cut card of children.

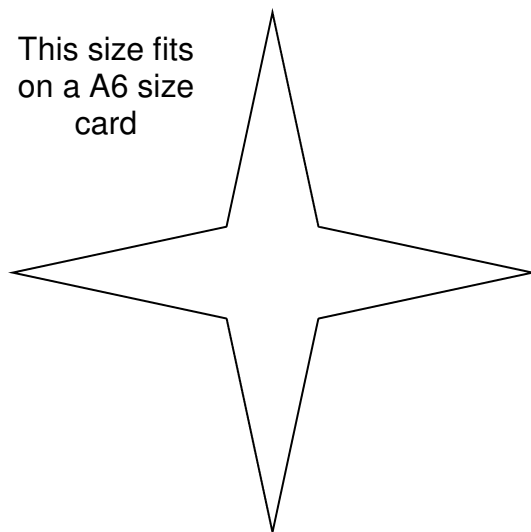

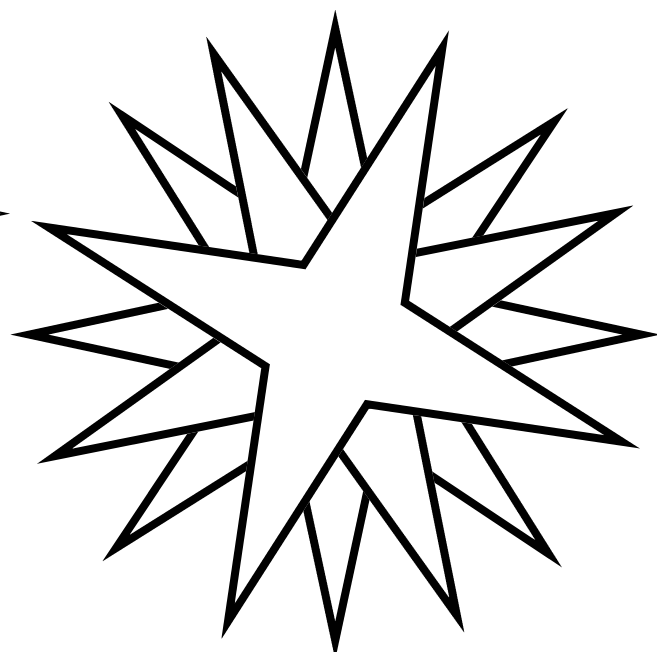

Print off the template sheet. Decide which size you would like to use and cut out the corresponding size template. Pick out some patterned papers or coloured card and draw around the template four times on to different papers then cut them out. Use the guide on the template sheet to layer them up and stick all the pieces together to make the star burst shape. Pick out something to put in the center a blossom or a greeting or maybe a stamped image. Add your finished embellishment to your choice of card blank.
