

Midnight Star Card

Midnight Star Card

This template would be perfect for new years party invites or table decorations.

To make a card like the one bellow simply cut out the two star shapes on the template sheet. Draw around the largest one on to some silver card and cut it out. Draw around the smaller star on to some patterned paper and cut it out. Cut out the two clock hand shapes from the template sheet, draw around them on to silver card and cut them out. Fix them together with a silver brad so the smaller one layers over the larger one. Tie a little bit of ribbon around the smaller clock hand. Stick the two stars together so the smaller one layers over the larger one and then attach the clock hands to the center.

Attach your star to a card blank of your choice and finish with a cut out of the '12' numbers and a party time message.

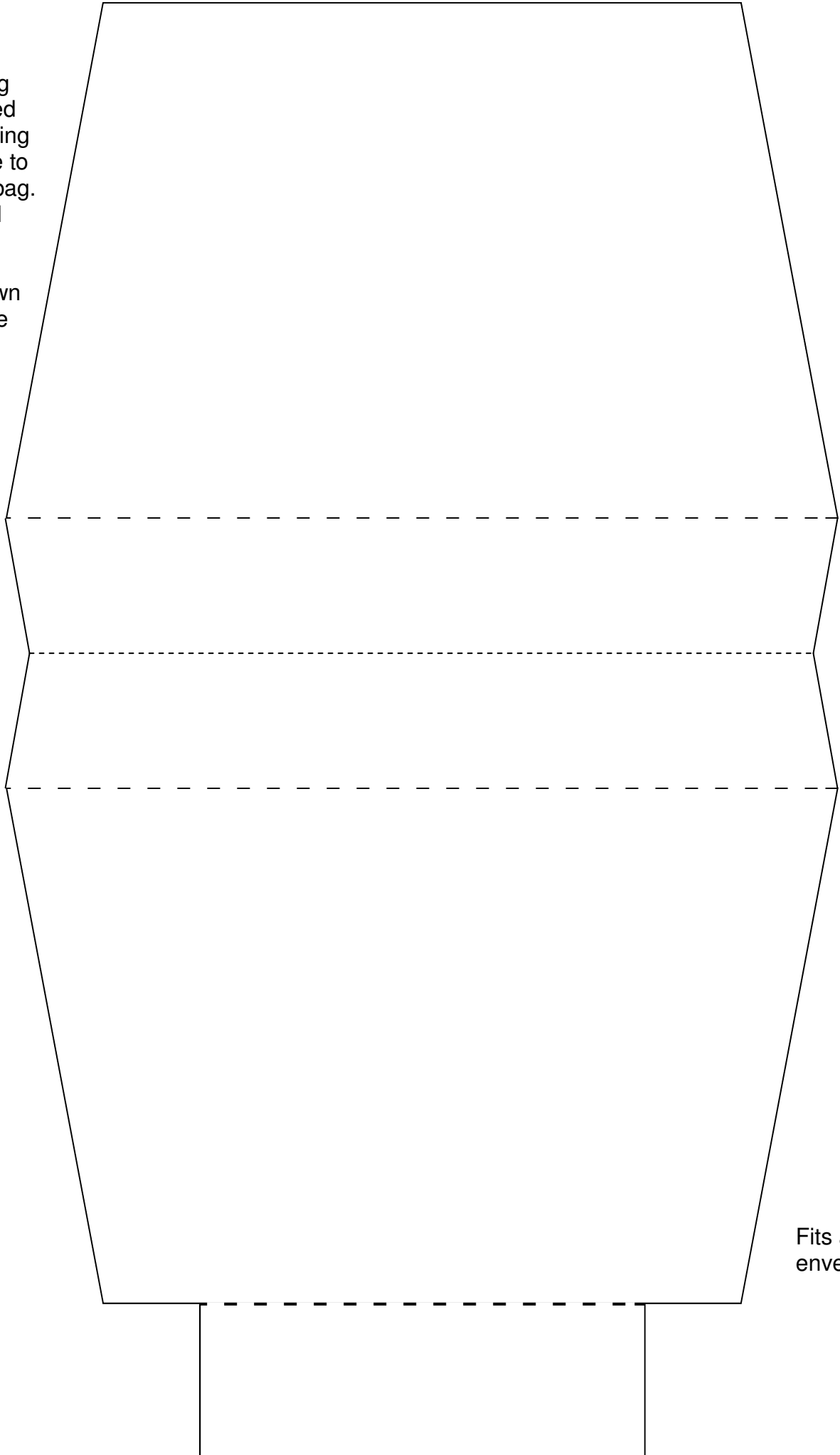
You can also stick numbers around your star to dress it more like a clock and use that as an embellishment without a message with just the hands pointing to 12.

Fold along the dashed lines, folding the shape to create a bag. The small flap folds over and sticks down to seal the card.

Paris Handbag Card

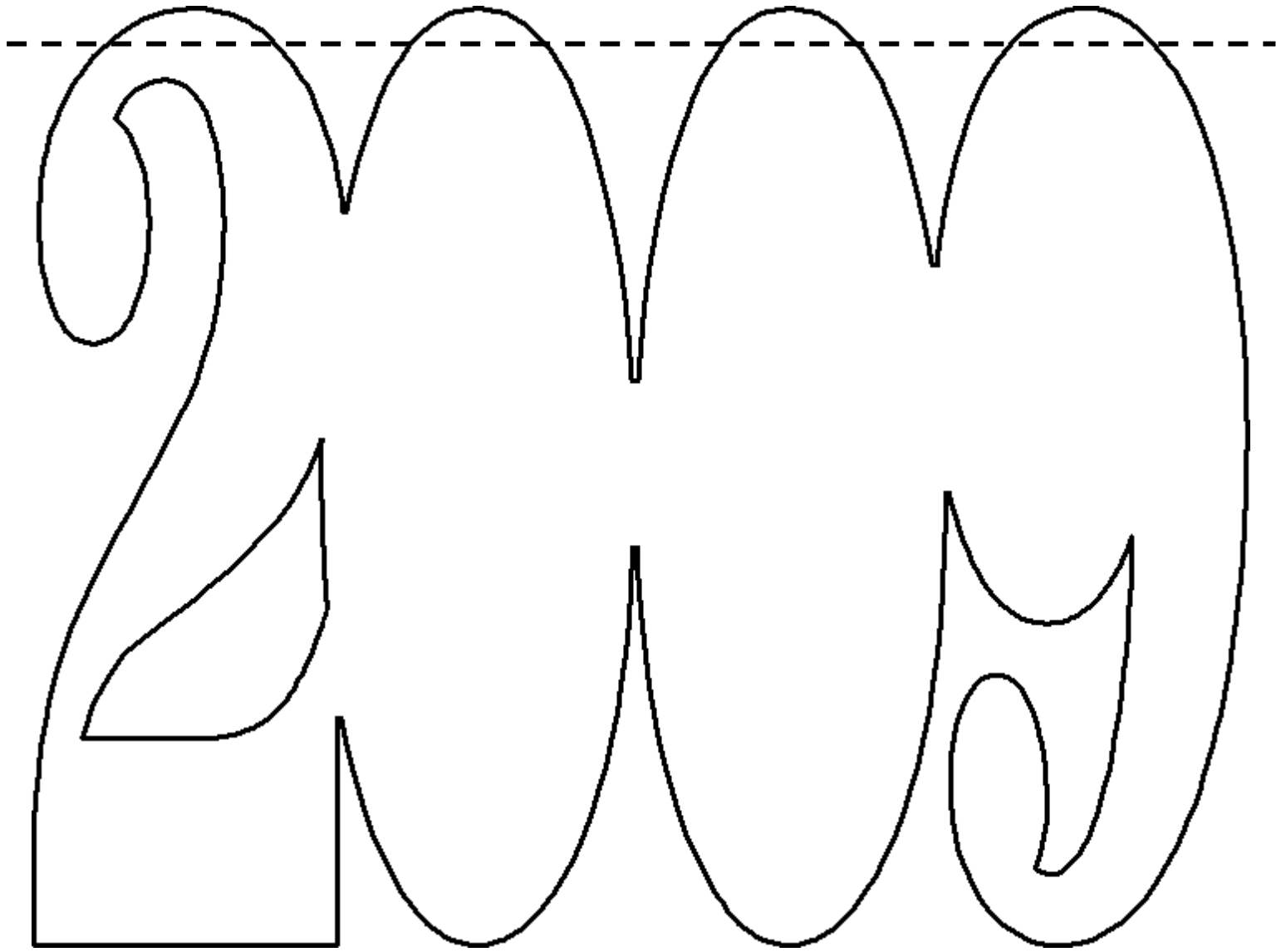
Print off the template and cut out the handbag shape. Place it on a sheet of plain card and draw around the shape. Mark from the template the positions of the dashed lines and score along them on to your card shape. Fold the middle score line first and then fold the other two line in the opposite direction so you have W shape to the base of your card. Fold over the small flap and hook it over the opposite edge. Attach a large brad or a button to use like a handle. Cover the front and back of your bag with patterned paper or decorate with stamps etc.

You can stick down the small flap if you wish or leave it simply hanging over. To place your card in an envelope simply push up the bottom a little and then press down in the center then slide into your envelope. It will fit inside a standard A6 size envelope.

2009 Card

Print off the first of the template sheets and cut out the shape. Fold an A4 card in half and place the template shape on to your card matching the top edge up to the fold. Draw around the shape then keeping the card folded, cut it out to create your shaped base card.

Next print off the second of the template sheets directly on to coloured/patterned card or paper. You can print them on to paper and use the numbers like a template but it'll save you cutting time to print them directly.

To assemble your card cover the front of your base card with patterned paper. Attach each of the cut out numbers on to your base card. You can highlight the edges of each number if you would like to and then decorate it a little more with some bling/glitter sparkles.

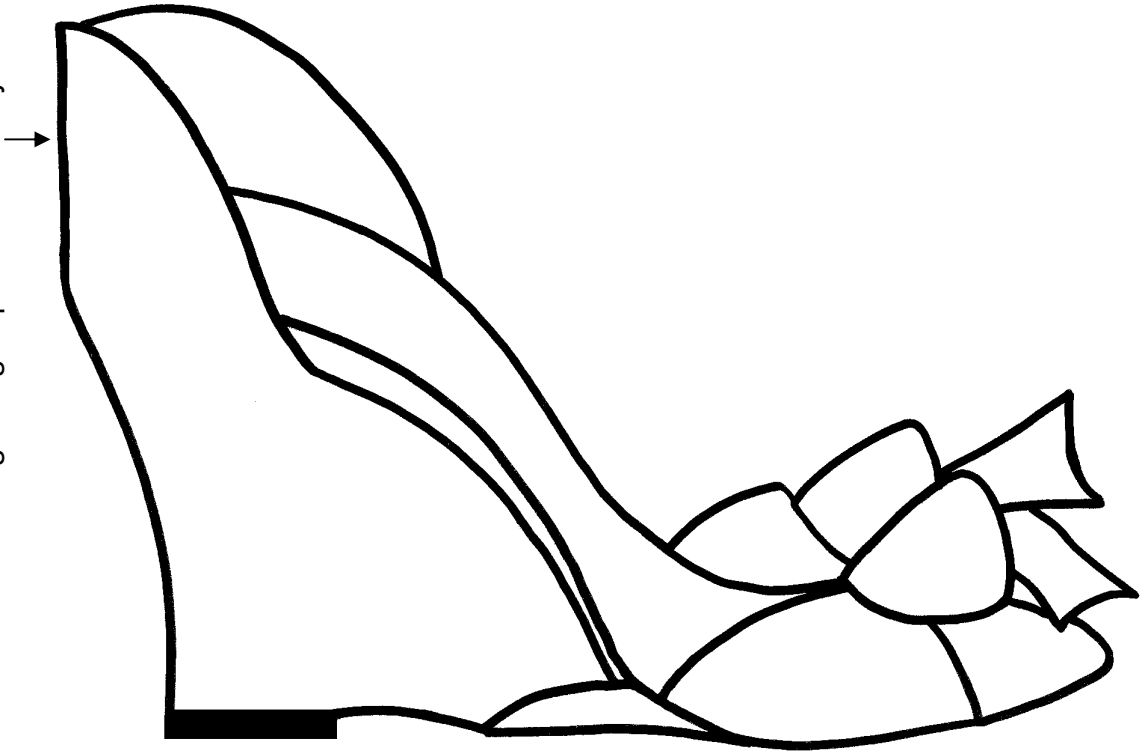

Fashion Wedge Shoe Card

Match this straight edge up to the fold on your card



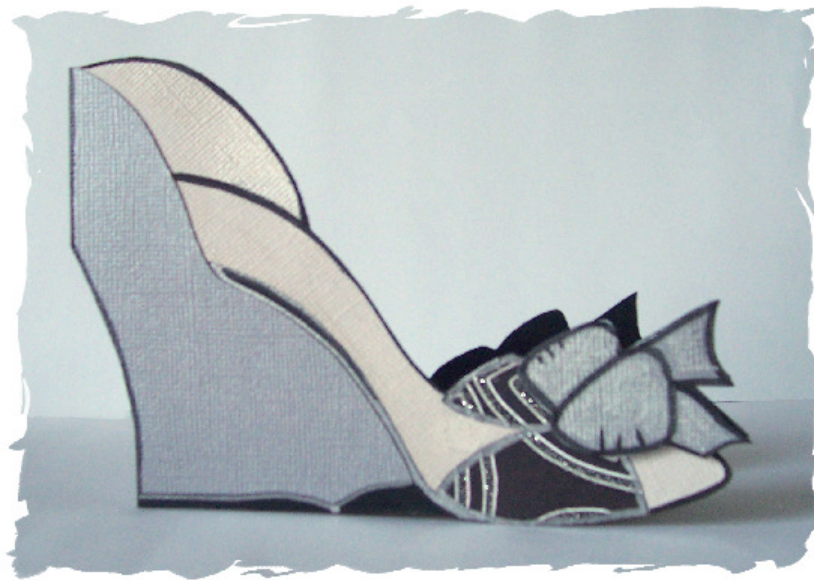
Fashion Wedge Shoe Card

You can use this template to make a large shoe embellishment to stick on to a card blank or you can make it into a shaped card.

To make a shaped card fold an A4 sheet of card in half and place the cut out template shape on to it matching up the left small straight edge up to the fold on your card. Draw around the shape and as you keep the card folded cut out the shape. You now have your base card shape. Cover the whole of your card front with black card or paper. Next take the shoe template and this time cut out the large wedge heel shape. Draw around it on to silver card and cut it out. Place the shape on to your base card matching up the side edge, there should be a small bit of black showing at the bottom. Next cut out the other parts on the template. The bow and the front of the shoe need to be cut from two different patterns or colours and the inside of the shoe areas need to be another colour again to give the shape definition. Once you're happy with how the pieces look stick them all down on to your base card.

To make an embellishment only follow the guideline above but leave out the making of the base card.

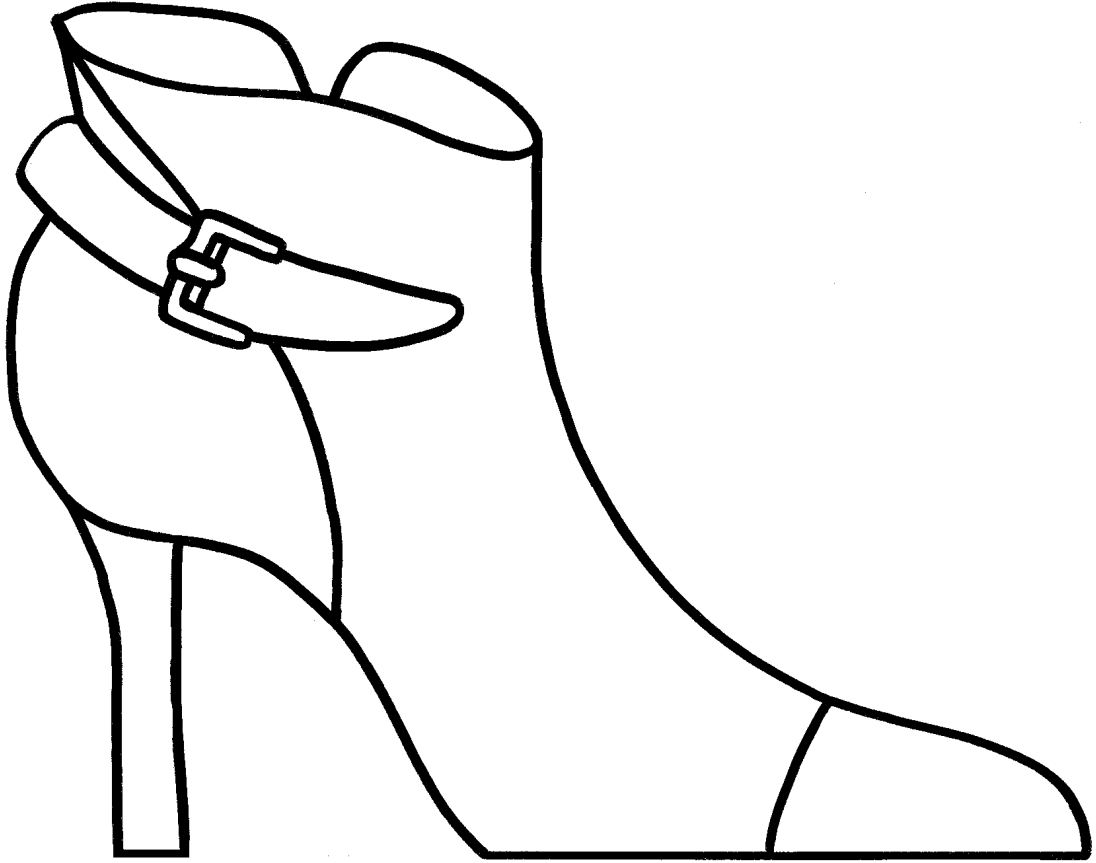

Fashion Shoeboots Card

Match this edge up to the fold on your card



Fashion Shoeboots Card

Shoe boots are very fashionable now so why not introduce something up to the minute in fashion into your cards? You can use this template to make a large boot embellishment to stick on to a card blank or you can make it into a shaped card. To make the card shown bellow cut out the boot template and draw around it on to a single sheet of plain card. Cut out the shape.

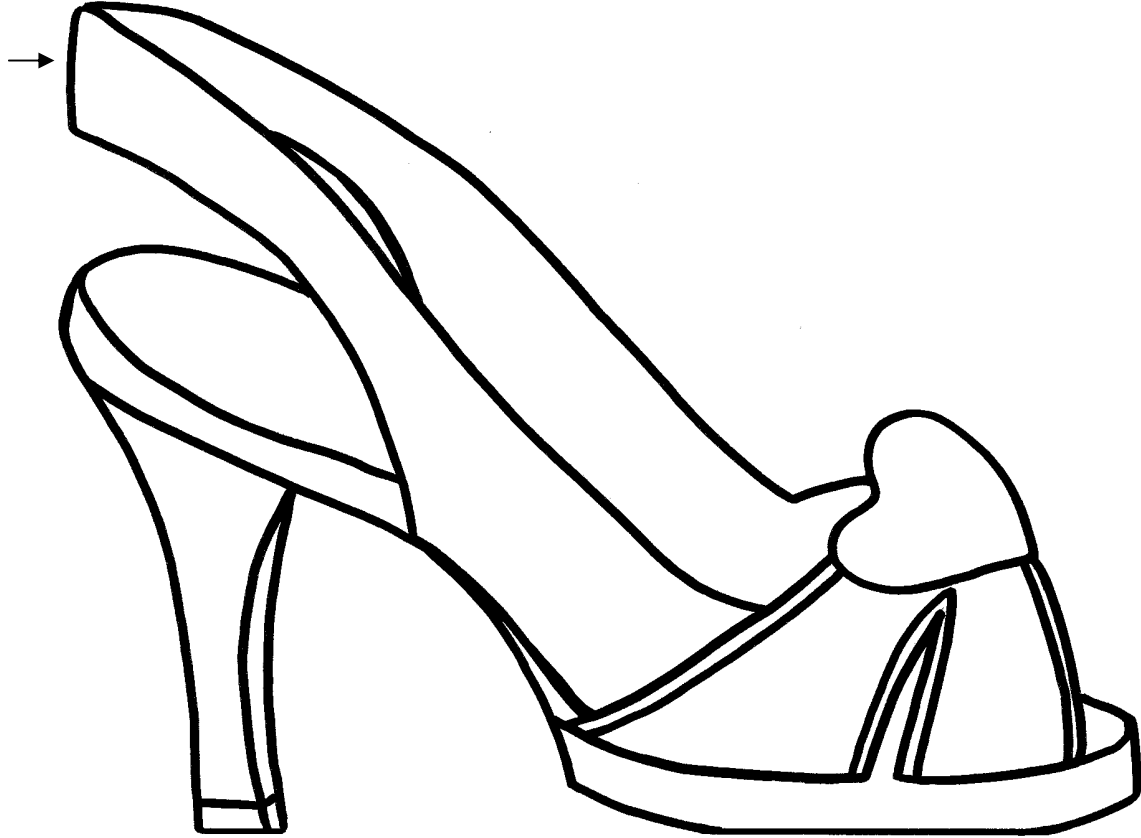
Next take the boot template and this time cut out the separate sections that make up the design. Draw around each piece on to separate colours of card to make up your choice of boot design. Place the shapes on to your whole boot shape matching up the edges so each piece fits together and recreates the design of the boot. Next take a large square card blank (6x6 size) and stick down your boot on it so it slightly overlaps the left edge and matches up to the bottom edge. Cut around the boot shape leaving the folded edge that's covered over uncut. Cover the inside of your card with patterned paper and add on top your choice of message. Trim the top edge of your card slightly to finish.

Fashion Slingback Shoe Card

Fashion Slingback Shoe Card

You can use this template to make a large shoe embellishment to stick on to a card blank or you can make it into a shaped card.

To make a shaped card fold an A4 sheet of card in half and place the cut out template shape on to it matching up the left small straight edge up to the fold on your card. Draw around the shape and as you keep the card folded cut out the shape. You now have your base card shape. Next take the shoe template and separate all the sections that make up the design. Draw around each one as you go on to coloured card and cut them out. You need to just make sure you cut out the inside of the shoe areas in a different colour to the other design elements to give the shape definition. Once you're happy with how the pieces look stick them all down on to your base card. You can add a little more embellishment if you wish to finish off your card.

To make an embellishment follow the guideline above but leave out the making of the base card.

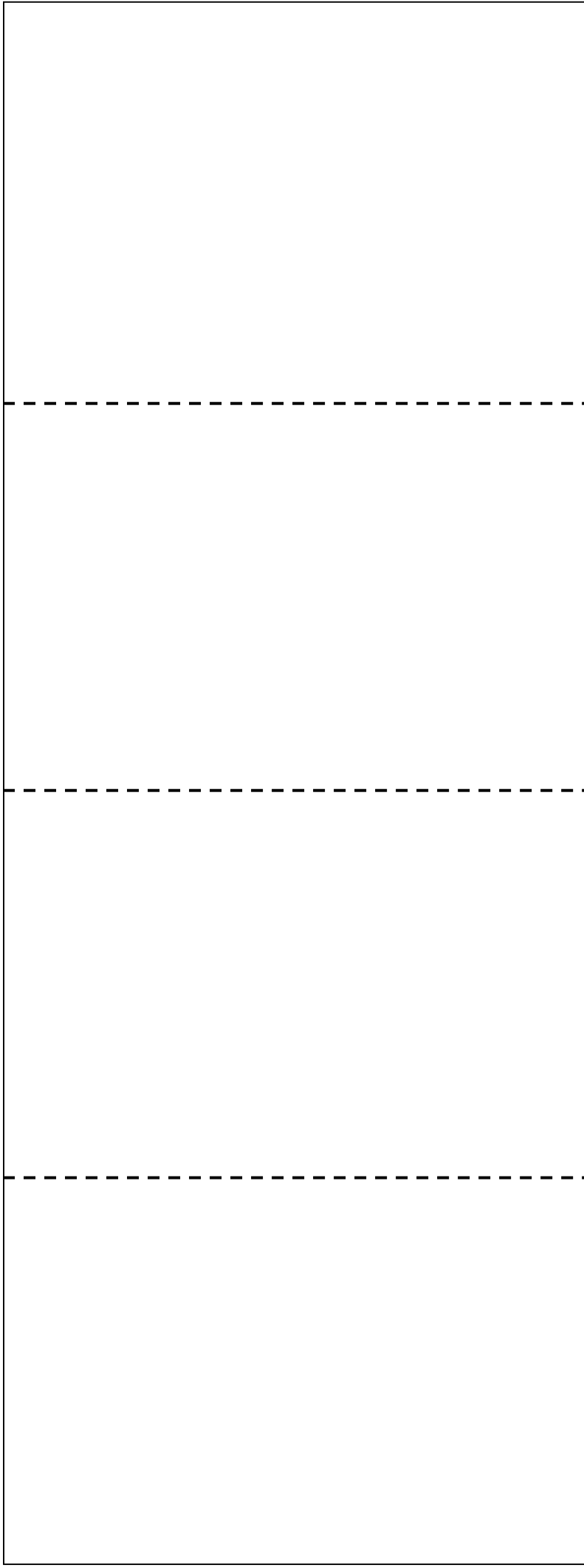

Gift Card Cracker - Base Card

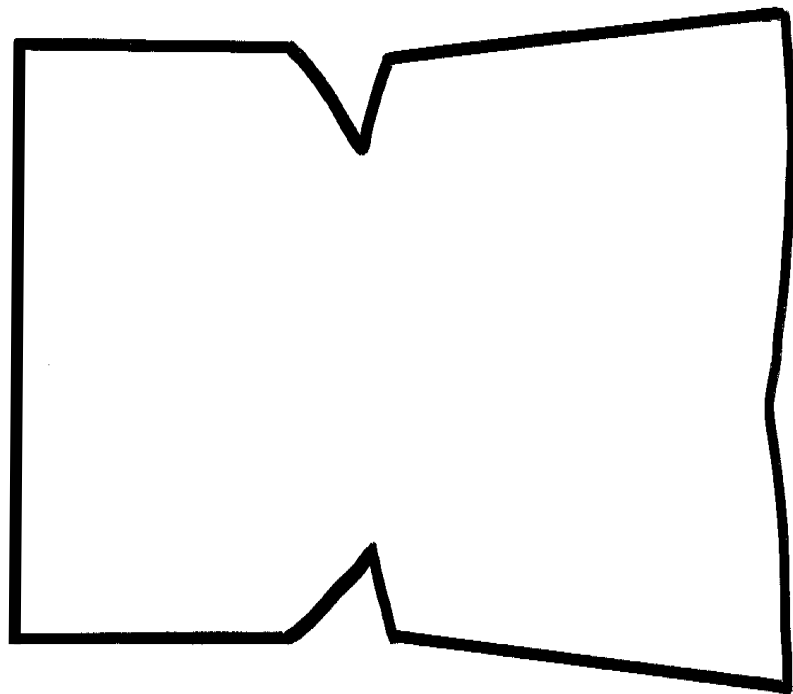
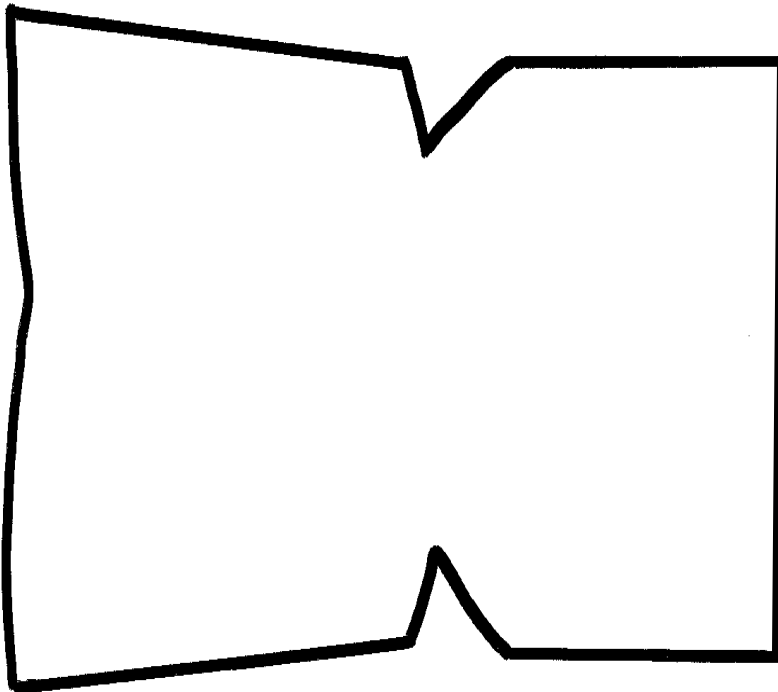

Size of gift card, this is the same size as the credit card type gift cards that most stores sell now. You can use a quarter folded pound note in place too. If you want to make a message card to put in the cracker instead you can use this template to make it the correct size.

Gift Card Cracker Card

This is a different way of giving out a gift card or cash and has been designed to work with the credit card like gift cards that have become more popular. A pound note can be used instead as long as it's folded into quarters.

To make your card print off both template sheets and cut out the cracker shapes and the base card shape. Place your base card template on to plain card or patterned card and draw around then cut out the shape. Score long the dashed lines indicated on the template. You can score through the template if you printed it on to paper. You need to fold the card in a certain way to make it work correctly. Fold the middle line first then keeping the card folded fold the other section back so the straight edge meets the center fold, turn over then fold the other line the same way. Basically you should end up with a concertina style fold to your card. You can add some more decoration to your card if you like but bare in mind that the only bits that will show are the two outermost panels the two center ones form the inside of your card. Next draw around the cracker shapes on to different patterned paper. You need to make sure the pattern meets up in the center so draw around the cracker shapes so the straight edges meet up. You can use plain coloured card instead if you prefer to. Cut out the cracker shapes. Tie ribbon around the ends of each cracker piece. Next take the cracker pieces and on the backs apply a small amount of glue or tape along the top and bottom edges just up to the ribbon. Make sure you keep the glue within 1cm of the edge because each side of the crackers need to form a pocket. Each cracker side needs to be stuck to the base card so that the straight edge matches up to the first fold on the left and right sides. Leave to dry if you've used wet glue. To put your gift card inside the cracker slip one half of it in to the left side pocket and then push the



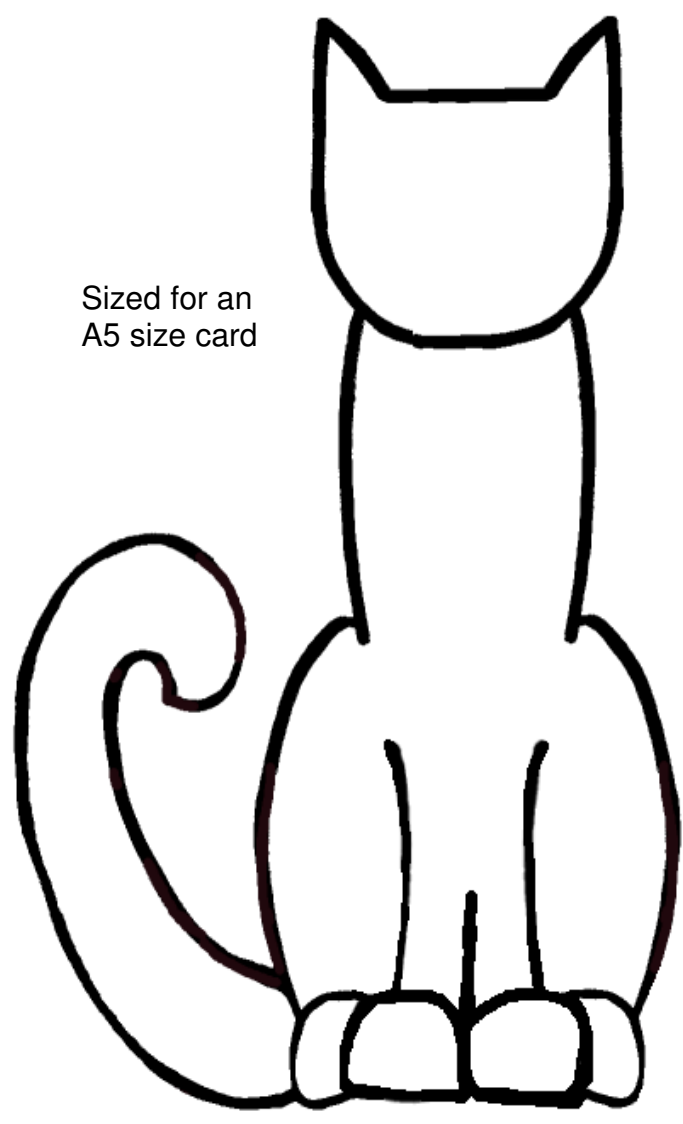
right side over the top of the other half. It should stay in place like that if your gift card is sturdy but if it doesn't just add a sticker over the joins to secure it. To add your card to an envelope push down the folded section at the back and then hold it down while you slip it inside. The finished card should fit in a DL size envelope. This also looks fab wrapped up in paper like a gift.

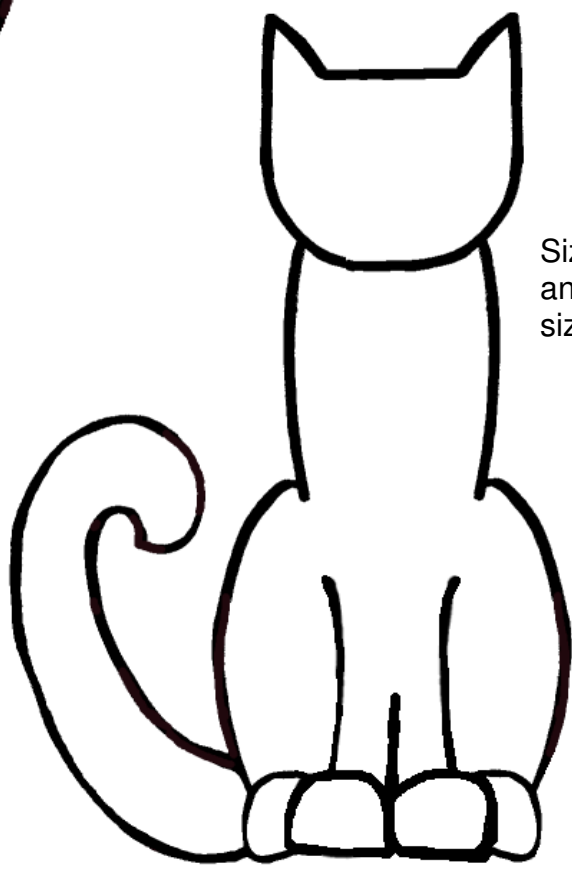

Cat Silhouette

Cat Silhouette Card

There are two different sizes you can use on this template sheet so first you need to decide which size card you would like to make. Pick out or make a corresponding card blank to use. Cut out the size of the cat template you would like to use. Draw around it on to black card. You can use a white pen or chalk for this or alternatively cut out the cat shape from scrap paper first and then stick over the black card and cut around the edges.

When you have your cat silhouette shape create a 'collar' with diamante gems to give the shape definition. You can add in some more details if you like these are included on the template for you to follow incase you would like make a decorated cat shape instead of a silhouette.

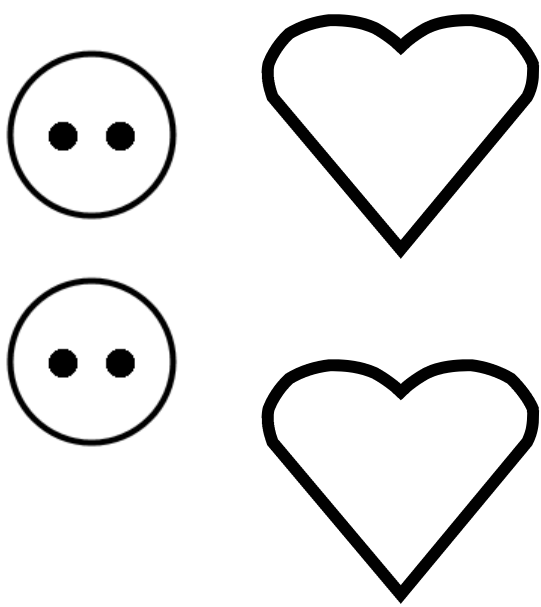
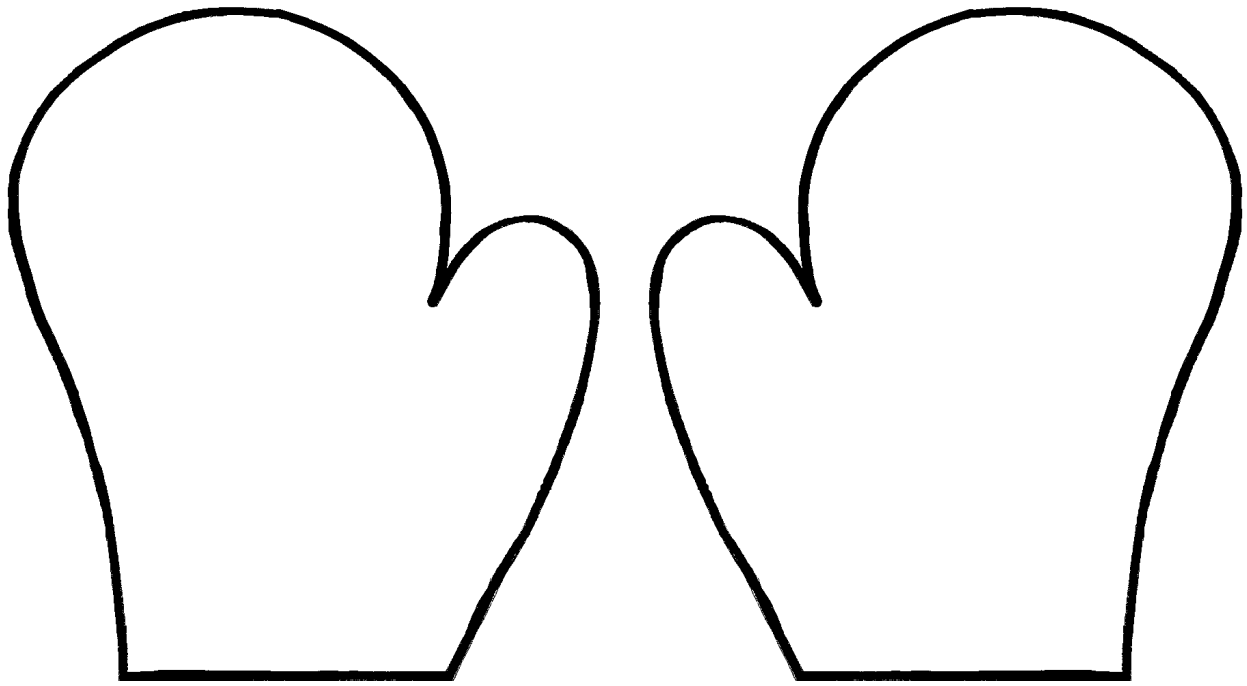
Attach your finished cat to your card blank and add a message and further embellishment to finish as you like.

To make the extra embellishments on my card I used stamps for the title and the heart shape then filled in some of the heart stamp with cross stitches

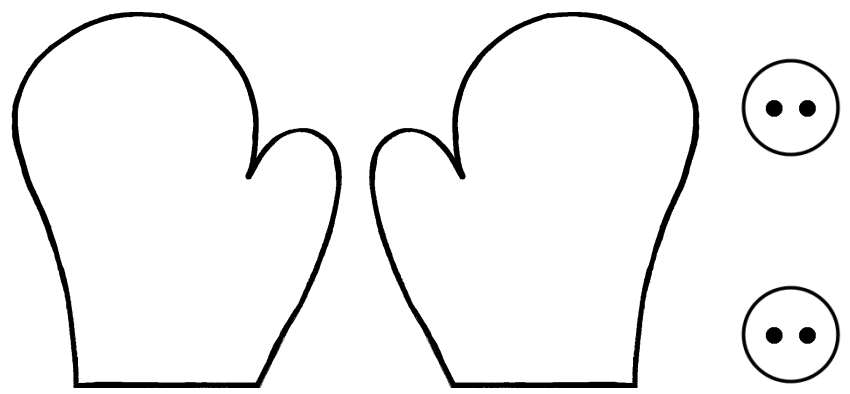

Mittens

Mittens Card

There are two different sizes you can use on this template sheet so first you need to decide which size card you would like to make. Pick out or make a corresponding card blank to use. Cut out the size of the cat template you would like to use. In the sample bellow I used a DL size card blank and the larger size templates.

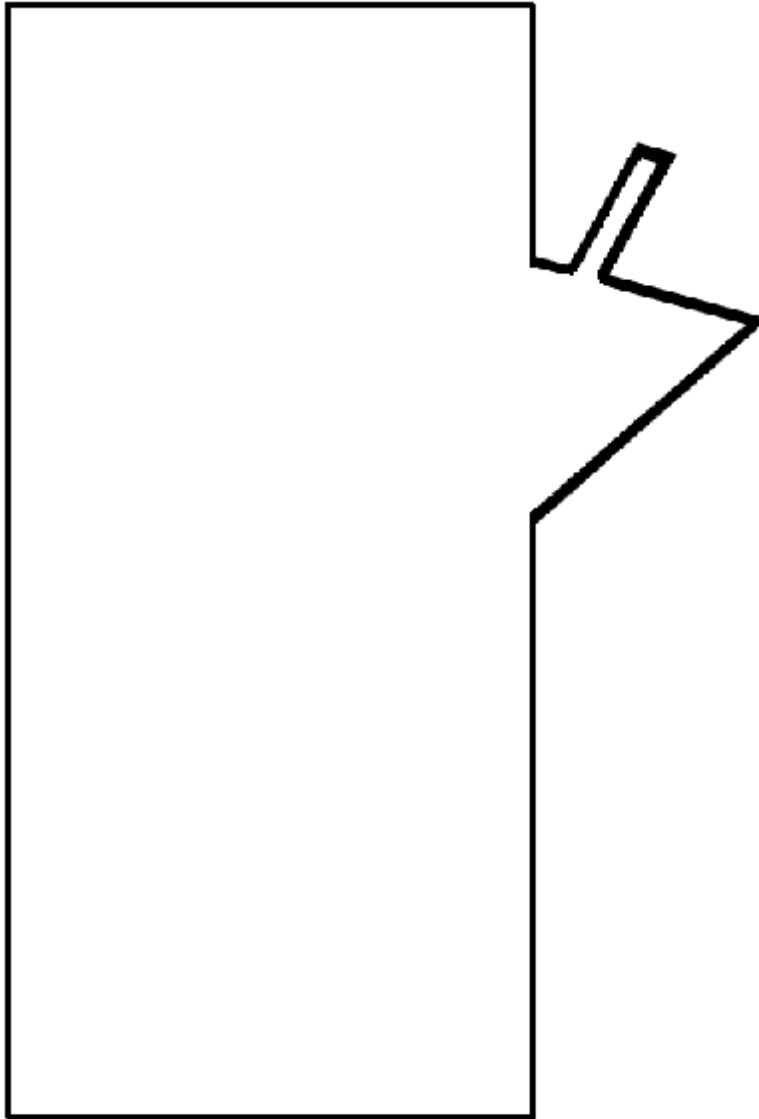
First cut out the mittens shapes and draw around them on to chipboard or other thick card. Cut out the shapes from the chipboard and cover them with patterned paper. Next stick the button and heart templates straight on to some more chipboard then cut out the shapes and again cover with different patterned papers. Make holes in the chipboard buttons where indicated on the template and tie some ribbon through them. Stick the button over the top of the heart, making one for each mitten and then stick them on to each mitten. Decorate your card blank with more patterned paper and attach the mittens on top. Add your choice of message to your card to finish.

As an alternative to chipboard you could also use felt, card or just patterned paper. Making them shapes from chipboard gives them a slightly raised 3D look.

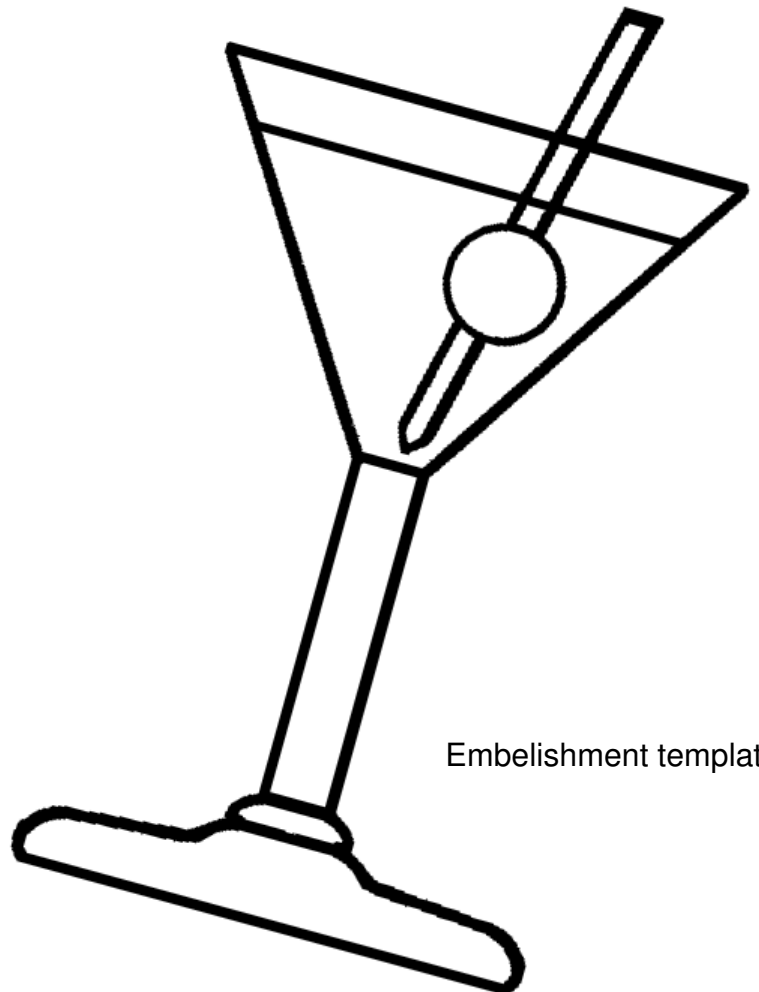

Embellishment template

Cocktail Card

Cocktail Card

Print off the template sheet and cut out the base card template shape. Fold a sheet of A5 card in half and place the template on it matching up the left side with the fold on your card and draw around the shape. Unfold your card then cut along the shaped edge. Refold your card so you have your base card done.

Next cut out the cocktail embellishment template around the outside edge. Place it on a piece of clear acetate and draw around it with a ball point pen. Cut out the shape. (if you have a Cuttlebug and embossing plates the acetate looks fab embossed) Next cut out the drink part from the template and draw around on to a coloured card of your choice (whatever you want your drink to be). Cut out the olive stick and draw around it on to cream coloured card. Cut out the shape and colour in the olive with a green pen. Stick this over the top of your drink piece then stick it to the underside of the glass shape with clear drying glue.

Cover the whole of your base card with patterned paper and stick a strip of patterned paper to the inside of your card that's showing. Stick your cocktail glass embellishment on to your base card so that the right side edge matches up with the design of the card. Add a message to the front to finish.
