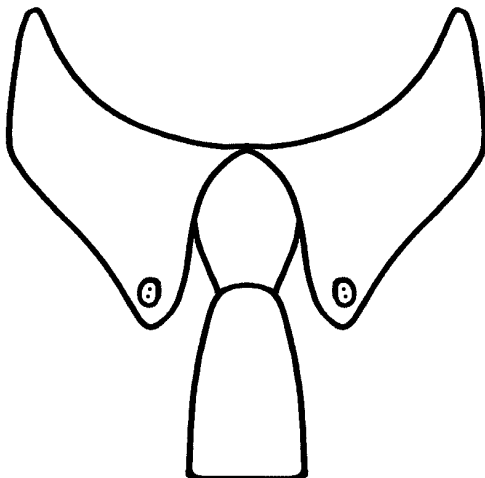
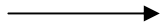


Fits on the front of a large square size card (6x6 inches or 144mm).

Put this edge to the bottom of the card.



Mini Version

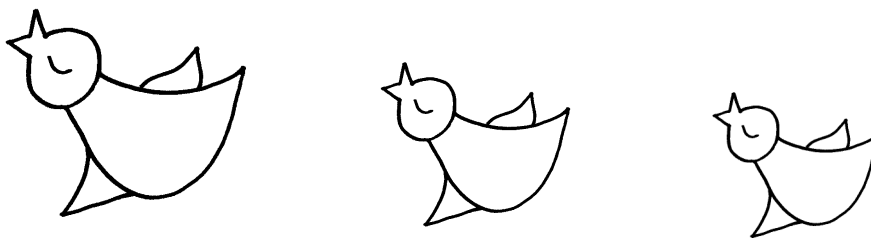
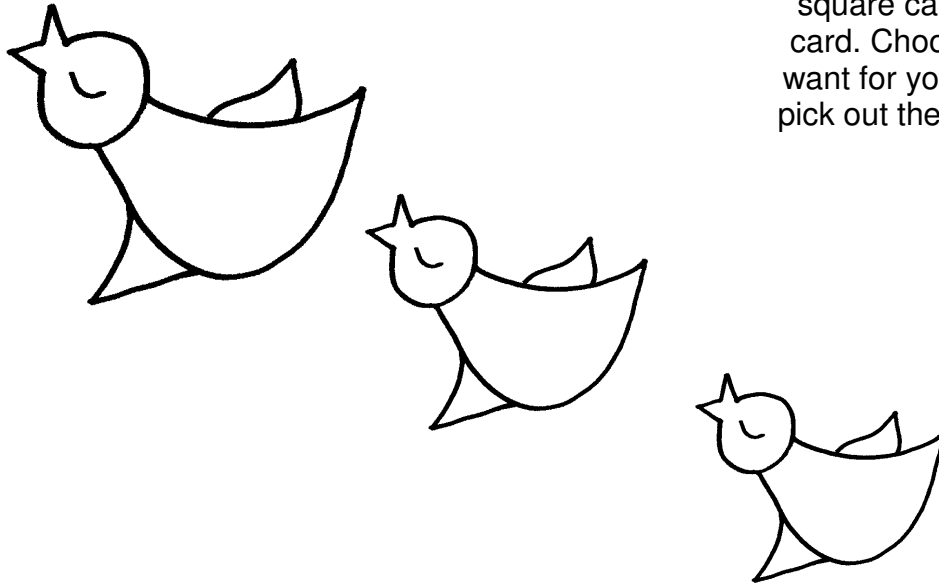
Print off the template sheet. There are two different sizes to use on the template sheet so first decide which you would like to use. The mini size you can use on a small square of card and then matt that on to a card blank. The larger size you can use as a large embellishment on front of a square card like the one in the sample below. Cut out which size of template you would like to work with from the sheet. Place the template on a piece of white card, draw around it and cut it out. Next take your template and cut off the tie shape from it. Place this shape on a piece of patterned paper, draw around it and cut it out. Glue the patterned tie shape over the top of the white shape. Next you can use two real buttons or use the template and cut two out from card. Add them to your shirt embellishment. To finish off your shirt highlight the edges with a marker pen. Add it to your choice of card blank and finish your card with your choice of message.

There are two different sizes on the sheet to use. Both sizes fit on a large square card or an A6 size card. Choose the look you want for you card and then pick out the size that works for you.

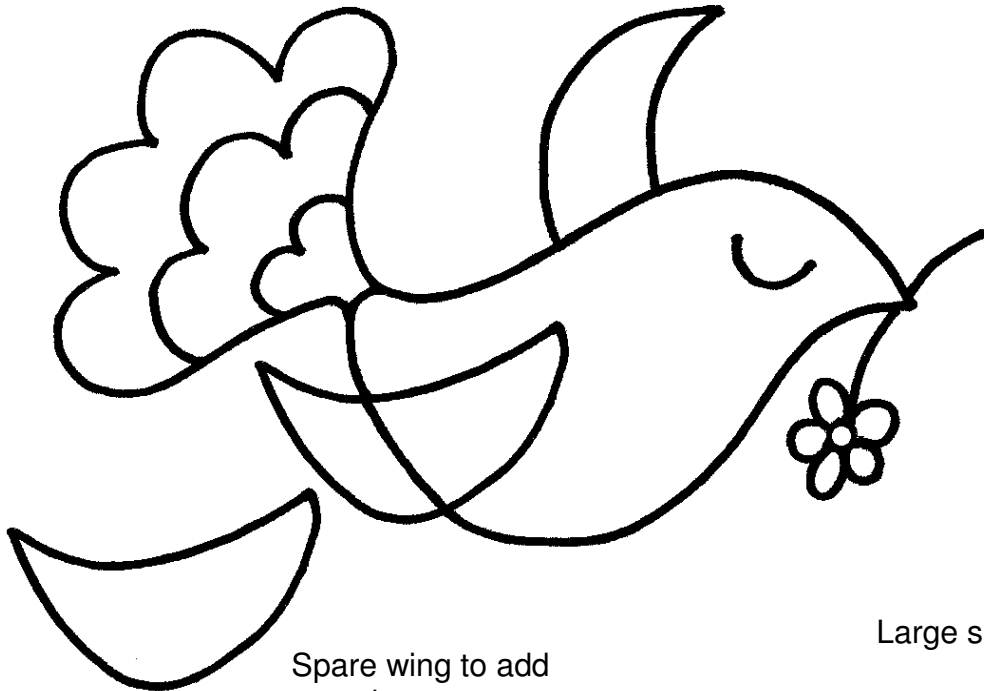


Print off the template sheet. Choose which size you would like to work with, the larger set works on a square card or an A6 card (4x6) landscape, (like in the sample card bellow). The smaller size works on a portrait A6 card. Cut out the size you want to work with, cutting each duck out separately. Draw around each duck on to card, (white card if you want to colour in your duck or green card) and cut them out. Colour in or cover over with yellow paper the beaks and draw around the edges to highlight them. Draw on the eyes to finish each duck. To make your card cover a blank card with patterned paper, the more kitsch looking the better. Apply the middle sized duck to your card first then apply the top and bottom ducks equally apart. Finish with a message of your choice.

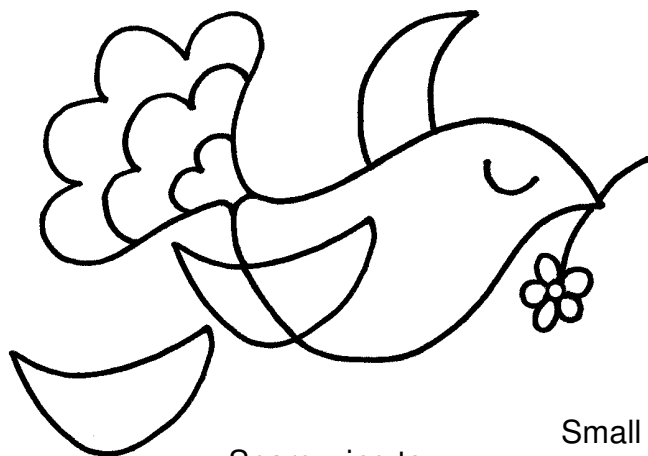

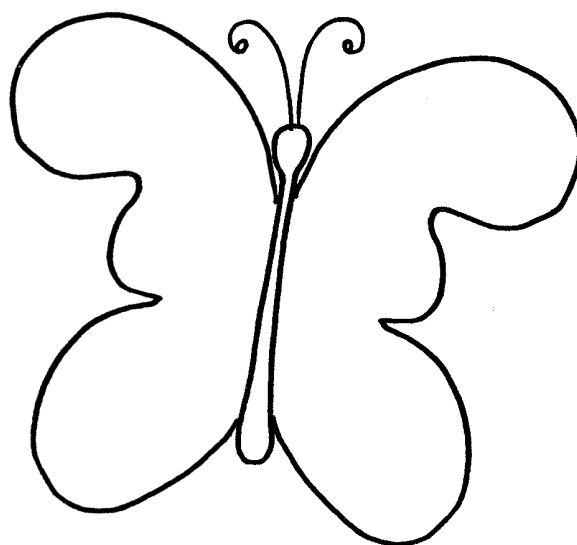
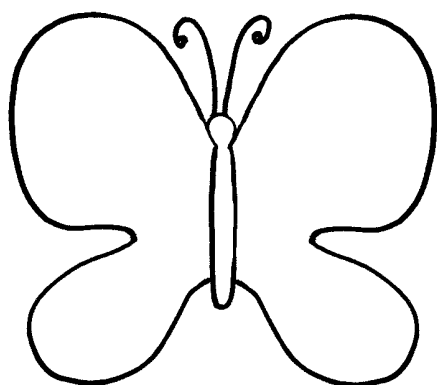
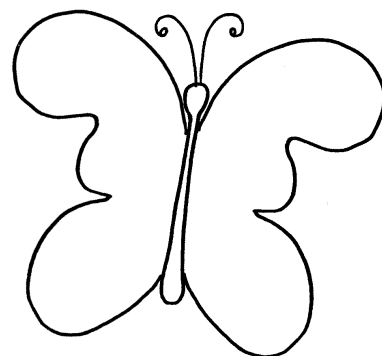
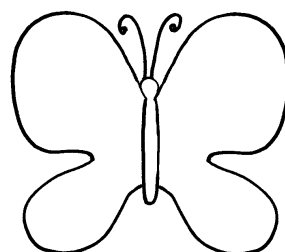
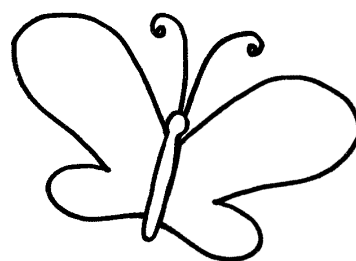
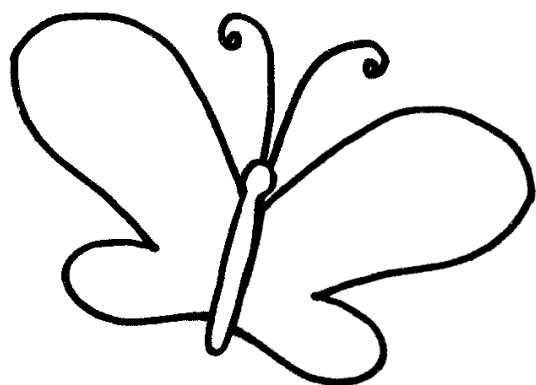
Print off the template sheet. There are two sizes to pick from to make your card so first decide which you would like to use. With the smaller one you can use more than one bird on your card or use just one of the larger size.

Cut out your choice of template. Place it on a piece of patterned paper, draw around it and cut it out. Take the template and cut out the tail and the wings. Separate the tail in to the three sections and draw around each section on to different patterned papers, make sure you pick out ones that co-ordinate. Do the same with the wings. Stick down each piece you've cut out over the top of the whole bird shape. Draw on the eye to finish your embellishment. Now you can build your card around your finished embellishment. Pick out some co-ordinating paper for the background and add a few more embellishments if you like.

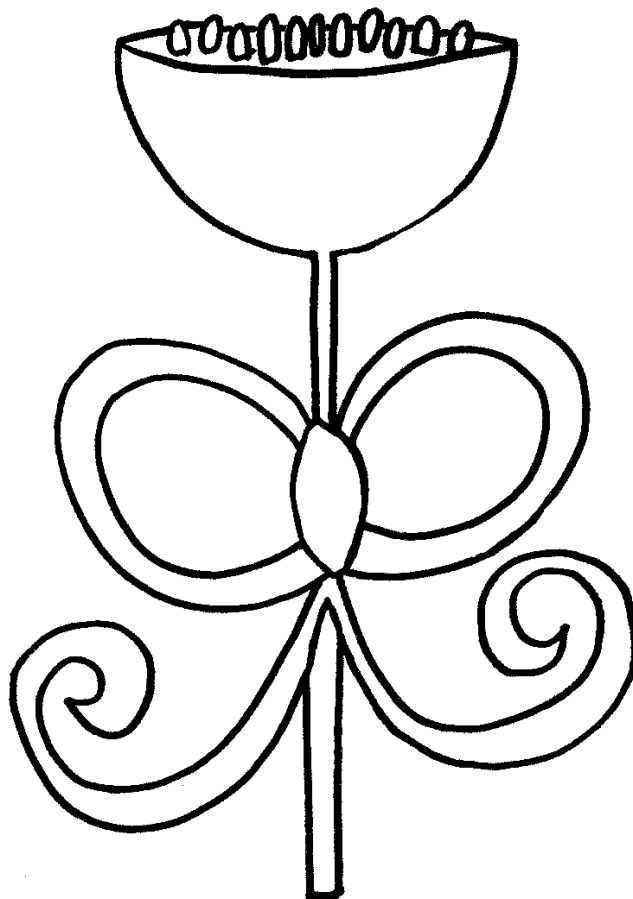
Print off the template sheet. Pick out which butterflies you would like to use on your card and cut them out. Draw around each of the butterfly shapes onto coloured card or patterned paper. Cut them out and doodle around the edges copying the detail from the templates. To give them a 3D effect pop a pencil or paintbrush handle down the middle and pull the wings up around it to bend them slightly. From here you can use your embellishments as you choose. In the card example bellow is a three fold card with butterflies layered on each of the sides.

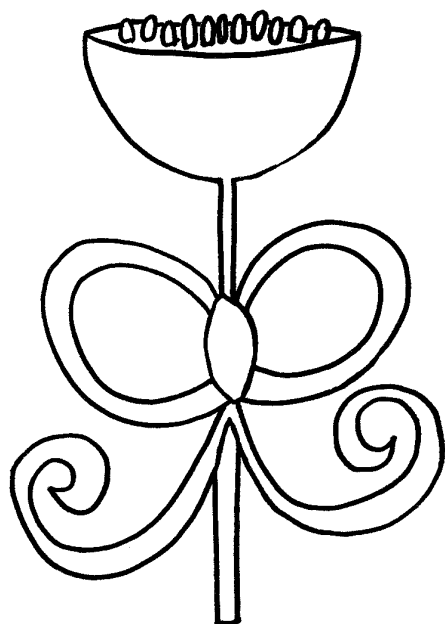

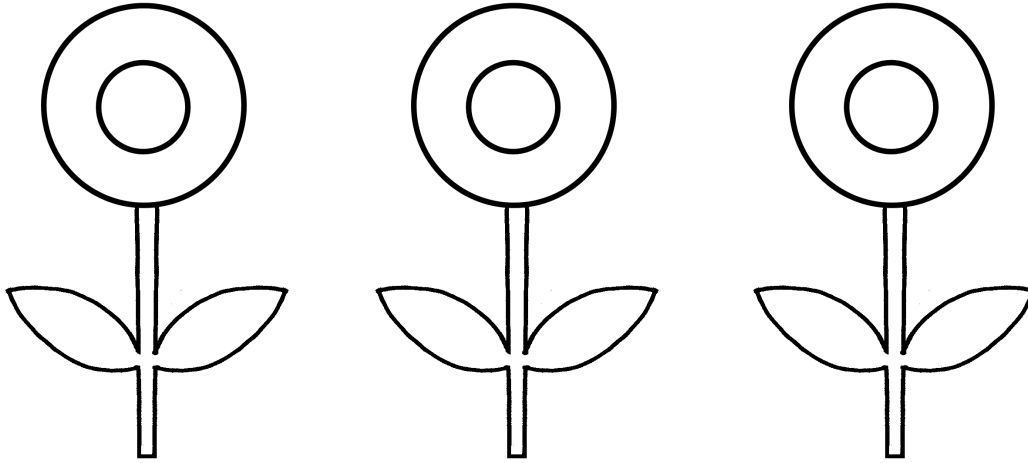


Print off the template sheet. There are two different sizes to use on the template sheet so first decide which you would like to use. The smaller size you can use more than one of on a card or use one on a small card. The larger size you can use as a large embellishment on front of a card like the one in the sample bellow. Cut out which size of template you would like to work with from the sheet. Draw around the template on to a piece of coloured card then cut it out. Next take the template and separate the flower pod from the ribbon bow shape. Draw around each of these shapes on to patterned paper and cut them out. Glue the shapes over the top of the whole shape you cut out earlier. To finish off your embellishment draw on the detail copying it from the template. Attach your finished embellishment to the front of your card. Add an extra little highlight like some ribbon to finish it off.

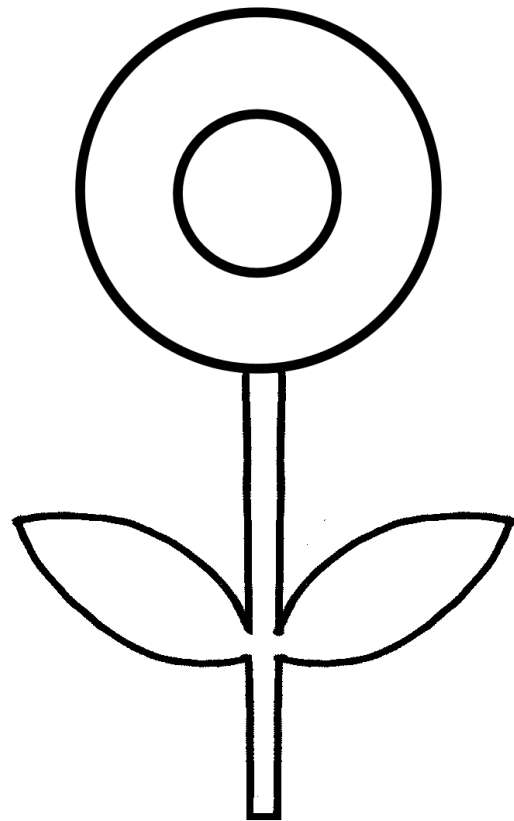
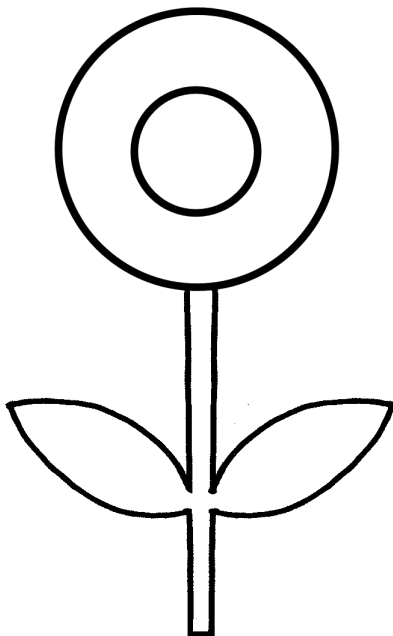

Different sizes included for different cards. You can have three small ones on one card or one large one.

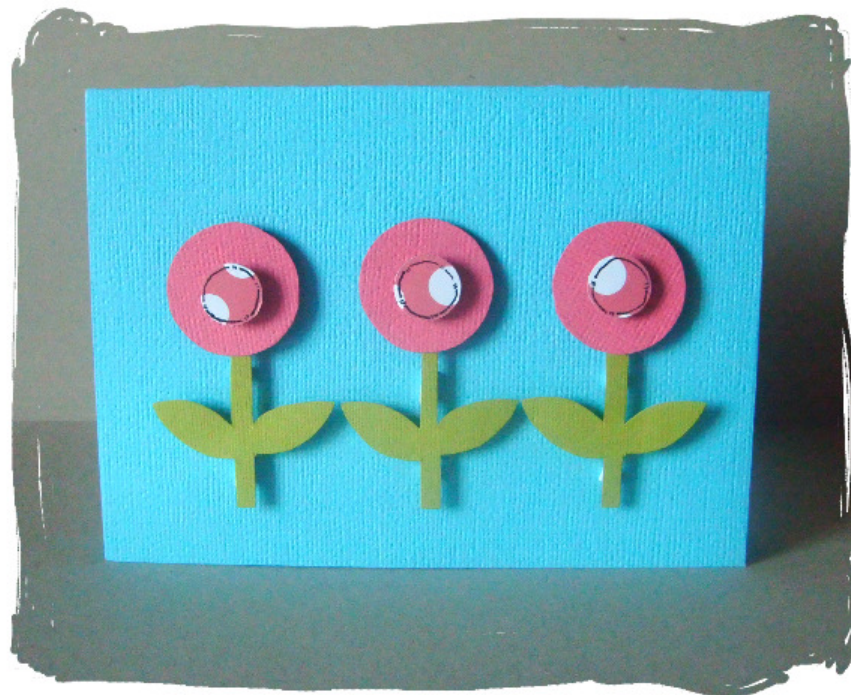


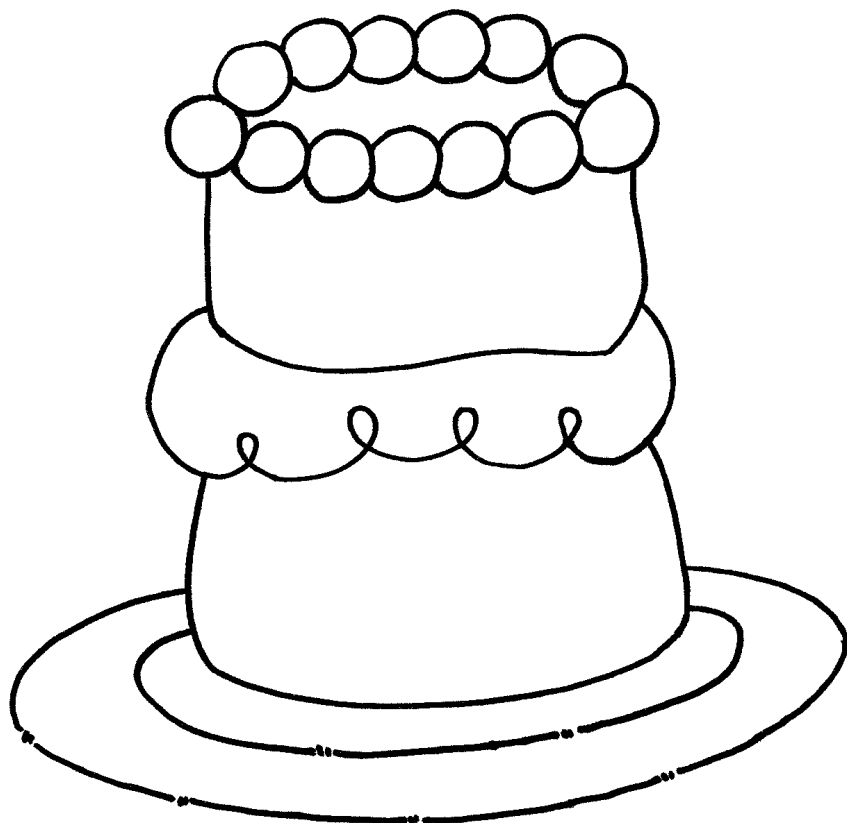
Print off the template sheet. Decide which size you would like to use. The larger size you can use individually on a card or on another papercraft project. The smaller size has been designed to be used as a trio across the centre of a card. To use any of the templates cut them out and draw around the whole shape on to green card.

Cut out the shape. Next cut off the large circle and draw around that on to a plain coloured card, the colour of your choice, (bright colours work well with the modern look of this card). Cut out the large circle and glue it on top of the whole green shape you cut out earlier. Finally cut out the smaller circle from the template. Draw around that on to patterned paper and cut it out then glue it to the centre of the large circle. If you have three flowers on your one card you could make the centres different patterns or colours. When you have your finished embellishments attach them to your choice of card blank. To attach the trio of flowers begin by gluing down a flower in the middle of your card and then attach the other two at each side spaced equally apart.

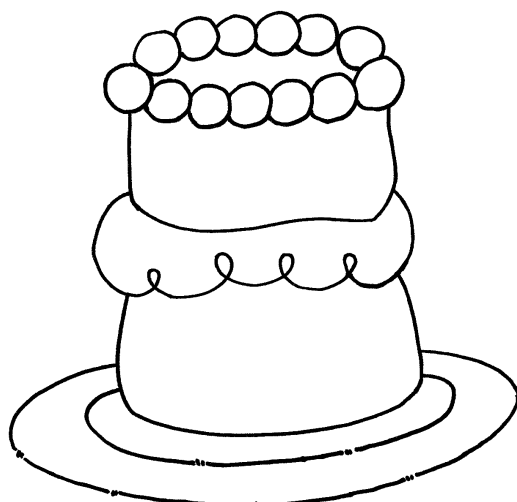

Large Size



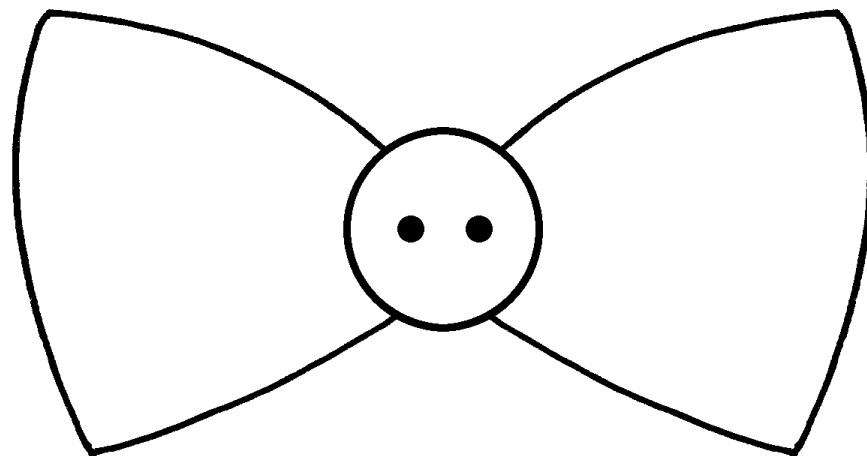
Mini Size

Print off the template sheet. There are two sizes to choose from so decide which size you would like to use for your card and then cut that template out. Place it on a piece of patterned paper, the pattern you would like for your plate the cake is on, draw around the whole shape and cut it out. Next take the template and separate the cake shape from the plate. Draw around the cake on to coloured card, (one that's brown or orange for cake). Cut out the cake shape and stick it over the top of the patterned paper piece you cut out earlier so the cake looks to be sitting on the patterned plate. Next take the template again and this time cut out the filling part and the top part of the cake. Draw around the middle part on to red or cream coloured card and draw around the top part on to white card. Cut out the shapes and glue them on to your cake. Add some doodling around the edges of the cake and filling, (copying them from the template) and colour in the top. To make the candles cut the right sized ones for your size cake and draw around them on to card. Add colour to them and glue them to the top of the cake. Finish your card by adding it to your choice of card blank.

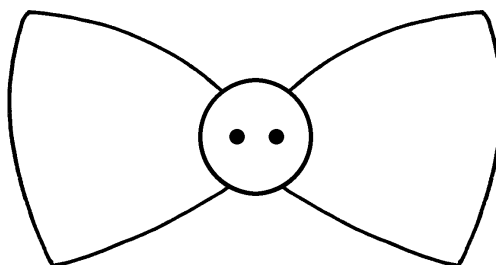
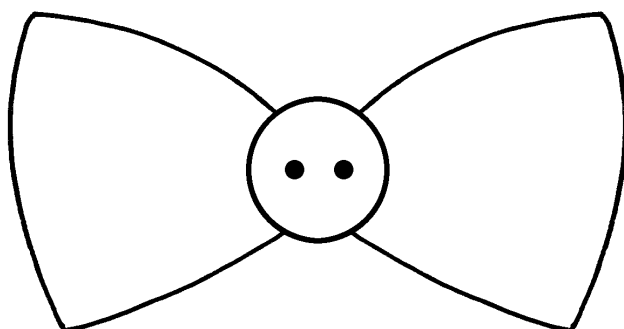

Different sizes to pick from to suit your card.

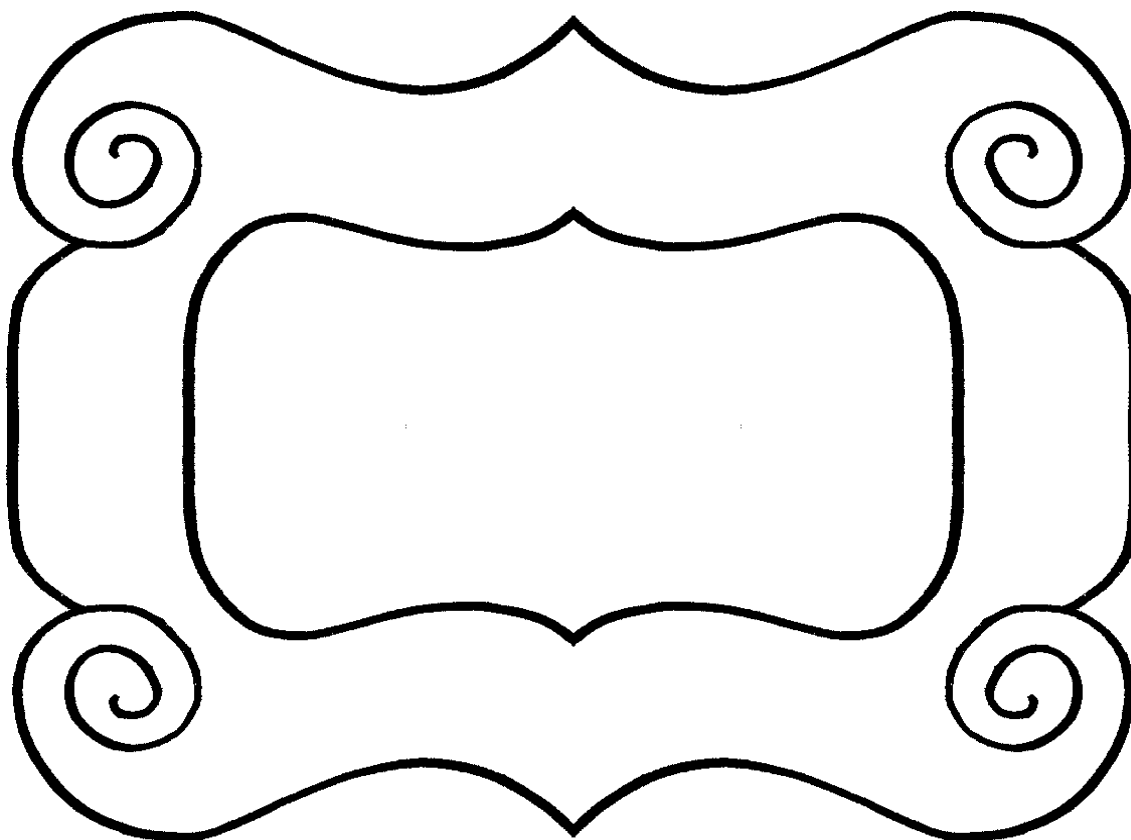


Print off the template sheet. Decide on which size of card you'd like to make and pick out the size of bow that fits your card. Cut out the template size you've chosen from the sheet. Draw around the template on to coloured card and cut it out. Take the template again and cut out the button shape from the centre. Place it on a piece of thick card and cut it out. Cover over the top of the button shape with a co-ordinating coloured card and punch through the holes. Stitch the button on to the middle of the bow shape to complete your embellishment. Attach it to your choice of card to finish. To make your bow tie a little more fun you could use patterned paper or fabric or for a classic look for a wedding card use black and white.

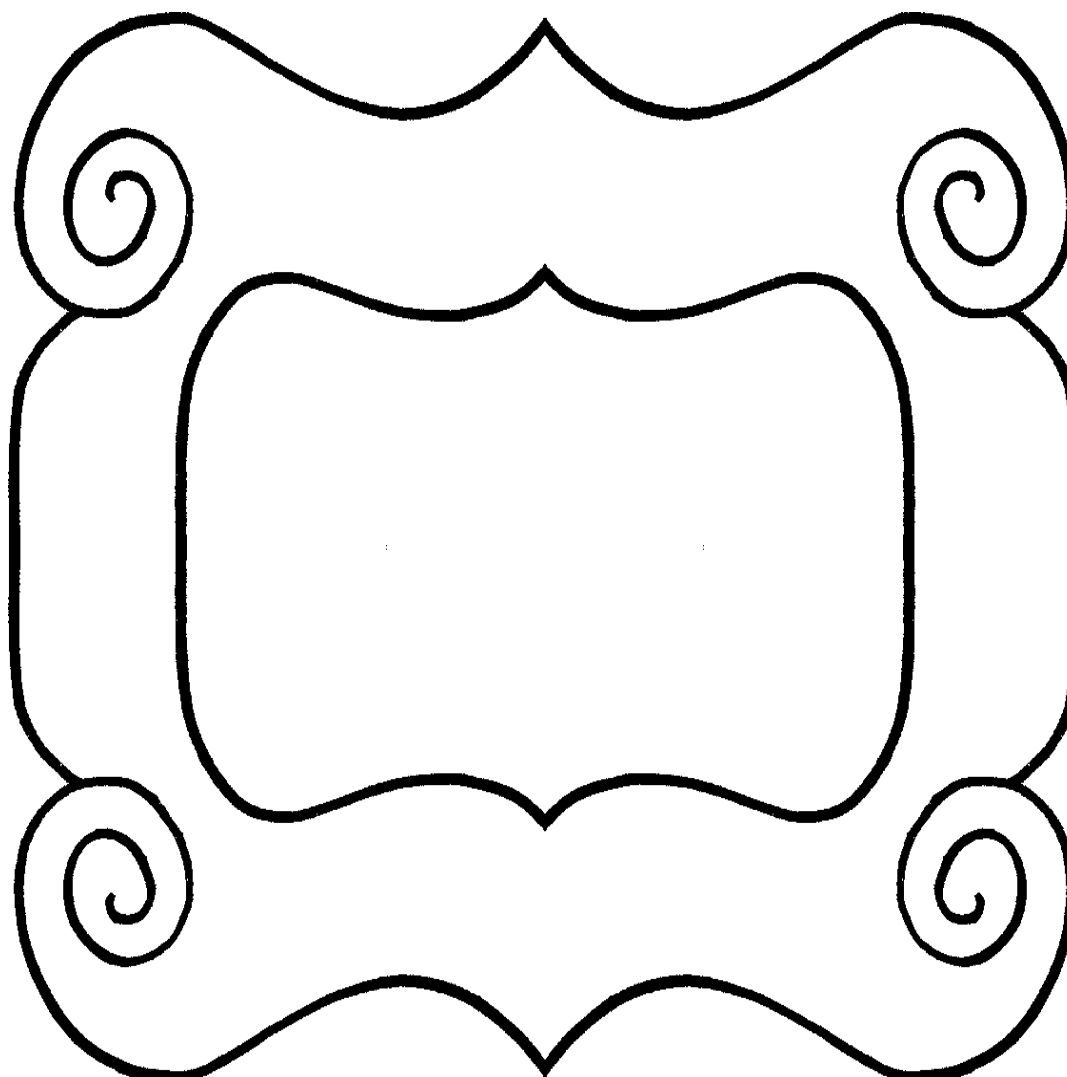

A6 size



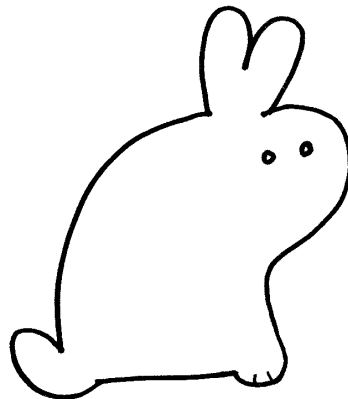
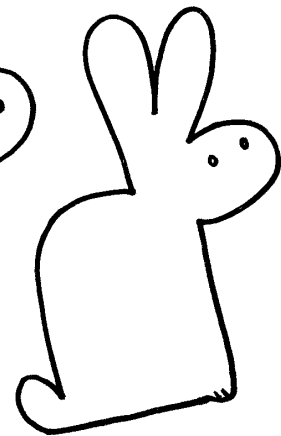
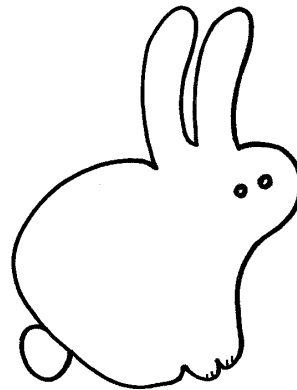
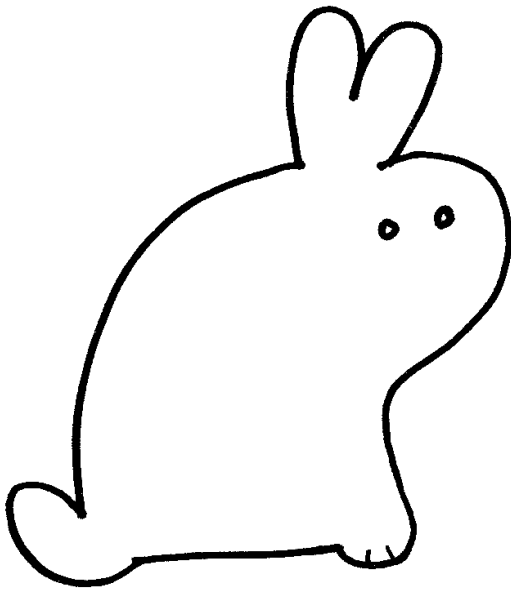
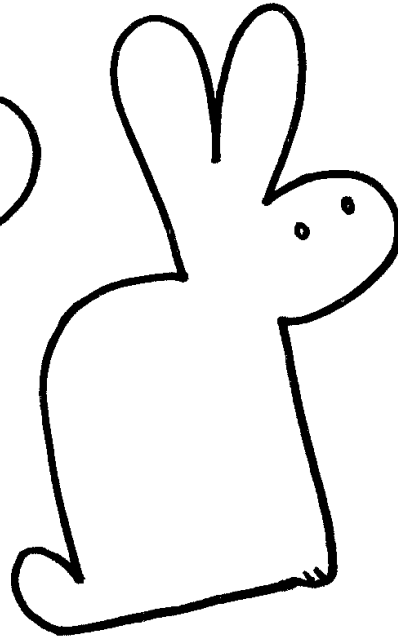
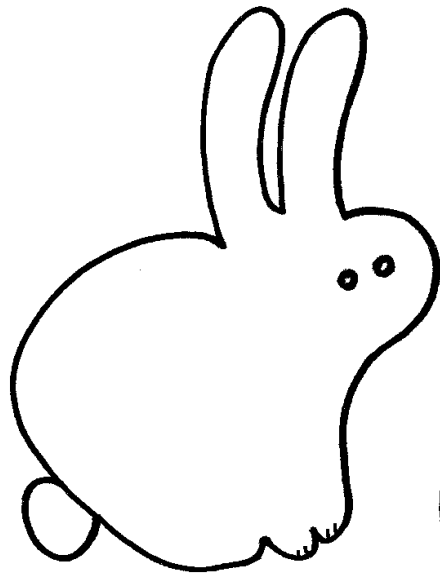
Large Square (6x6) size

Print off the template sheet. There are two different sizes of card you can make with this sheet so first pick out which size you would like to use. Cut out the template you're using from the sheet. Fold a piece of card in half, make sure it's large enough to fit your template on. Place the template on your folded piece of card so that the left side of it matches right up to the fold. Draw around the template and keeping the card folded cut it out. You should now have a fancy shape card blank. From here it's up to you how you decorate your card. You can copy the detail from the template and use the centre panel cutting it out from patterned paper and then sticking it in the centre of your shaped card. Add a stamped image to the centre or add a cluster of embellishments like the sample card below.

Different sizes to pick from to suit your card.

These funny little bunnies will be great not just for cards but as decorations to make for Easter. How about some cut little cupcake picks in some chocolate cupcakes. To make an embellishment first print off the template sheet. Decide which bunny you would like to use and cut it out from the sheet. Draw around the template on to white card and cut it out. Draw around the edge with pink and draw on the eye and paw detail copying it from the template. That's one embellishment finished. If you would like to make more follow the same procedure. Attach your embellishment to your card blank and add a message to finish it off.
