

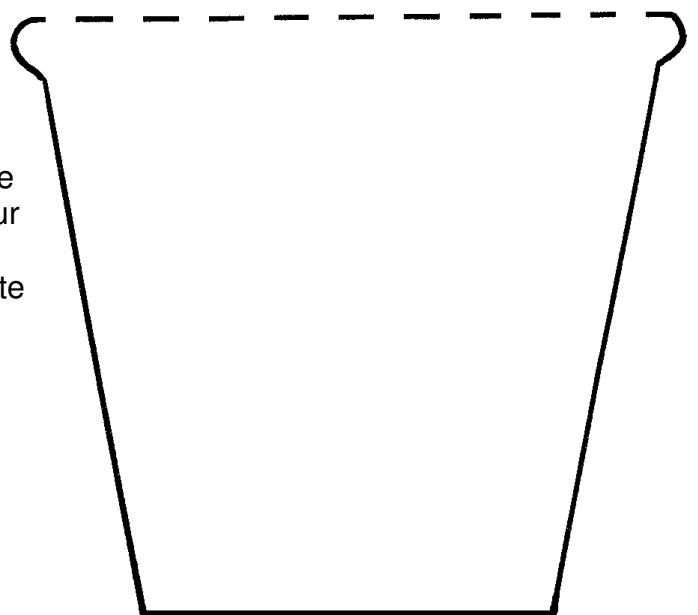
Makes an A6 size card

Strawberry Cupcake Card

Strawberry Cupcake Card

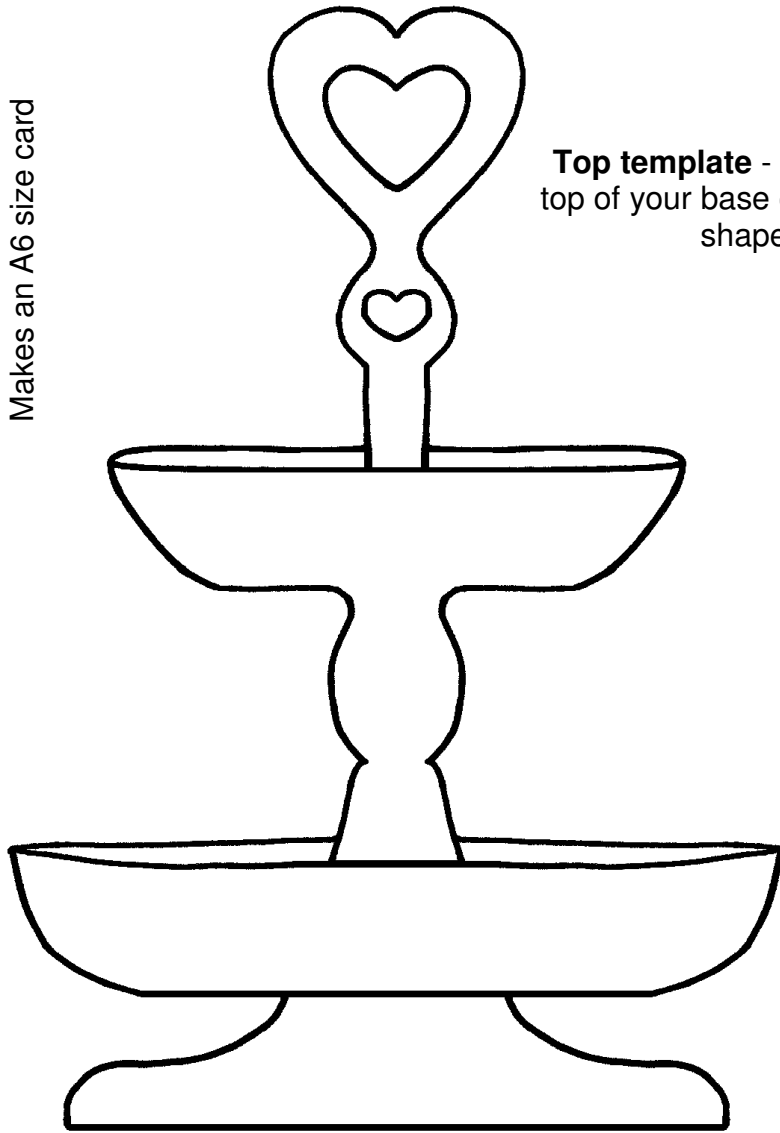
Print out the template sheet. Cut out the base card template from the sheet. Fold a piece of A5 card in half (or a piece of card large enough to fit the template on) and place the template on the card so the dashed line on the template matches up to the fold. Draw around the shape and cut it out keeping the card folded. That's your base card done. Next you need to take the template sheet again and this time cut out the top template. Cut it out as one shape, don't worry about the detail yet. Draw around it on to a flat sheet of card and cut out the shape. Place this shape over the top of the base card to make your shaped card. Next we need to decorate it. Use the top template and separate the case from the top of the cupcake. Draw around the case shape on to patterned paper, cut out then stick to your card. To build up the top of the cake draw around the whole shape of the top of the cup cake on to a colour you would like the cake flavor to be. Cut out that shape. Next cut off from the template piece the icing bit, again keep it as one shape don't cut out the strawberry bits yet. Draw around this shape on to some card you would like the icing to be and stick this shape on to your card. You should be able to see the layers starting to build up. Finally cut out the strawberries from the template piece. Cut them out as whole shapes including the top bits and draw around them on to red card and cut out then cut the stalks from the template and draw around those on to green card. Layer the pieces up to make the strawberries. And stick them on to your card. If you like you can draw or paint on the edges of the icing to give it more definition. Add your choice of extra embellishments and a message to personalize your card.

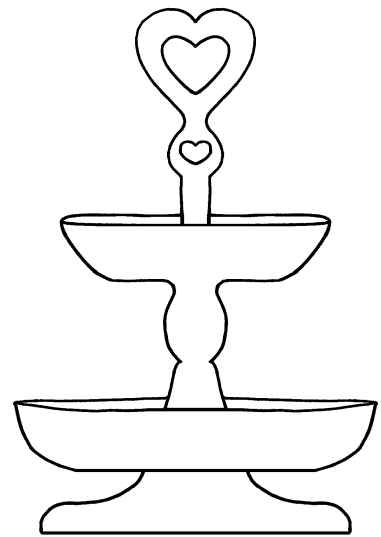

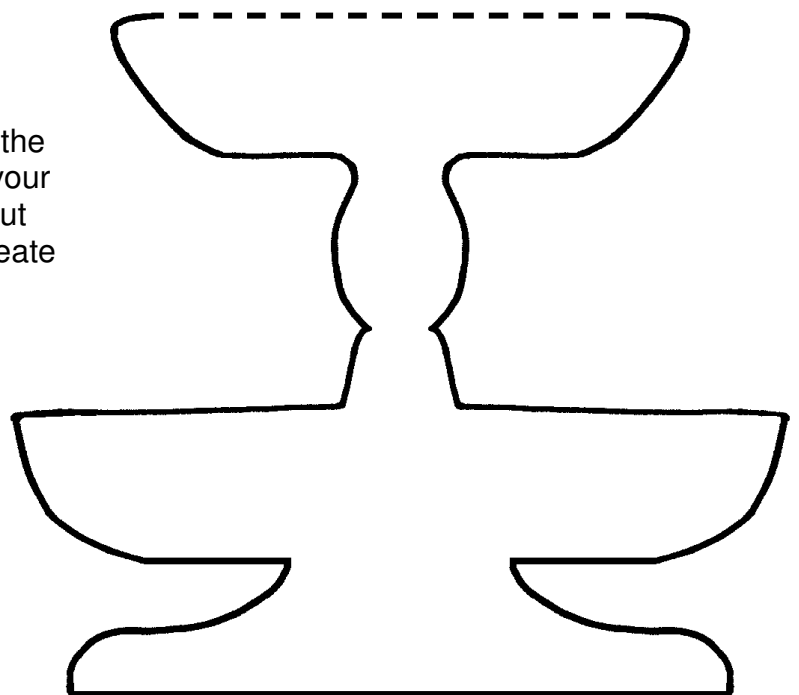


Top template - this goes over the top of your base card to create your shaped card.

Cake Stand Card

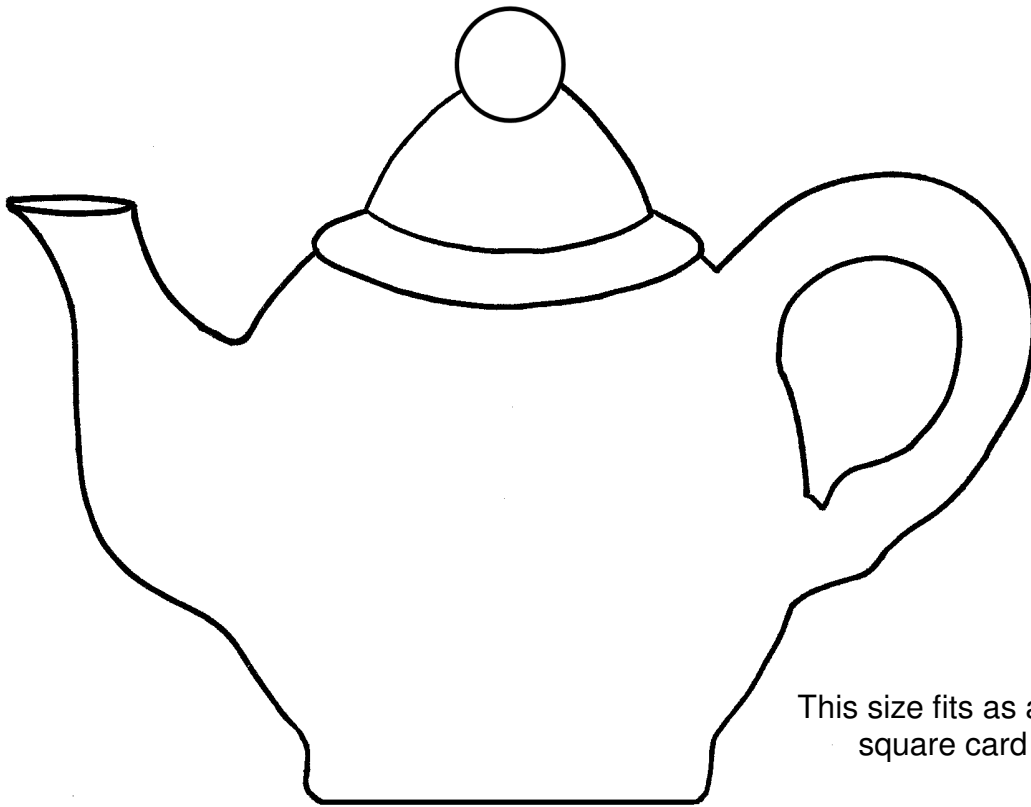
Cake Stand Card

Print out the template sheet. Cut out the base card template from the sheet. Fold a piece of A5 card in half (or a piece of card large enough to fit the template on) and place the template on the card so the dashed line on the template matches up to the fold. Draw around the shape and cut it out keeping the card folded. That's your base card done. Next you need to take the template sheet again and this time cut out the top template. Cut it out as one shape, don't worry about the detail yet. Draw around it on to a flat sheet of card and cut out the shape. To decorate it cover the whole of the shape in patterned paper. Use the template to cut out the heart details from different patterned paper or coloured card and stick these on. If you want to make little cakes you can cut some haphazard rectangle and round shapes from scraps of patterned paper and card and layer them up to look like cakes with icing. If you want a more realistic look you could use a stamped cake image if you have one or even a photo image of some cakes cut out. Layer the cakes you want to use on to the stand shape. When you're happy with how it looks place this shape over the top of the base card to make your shaped card

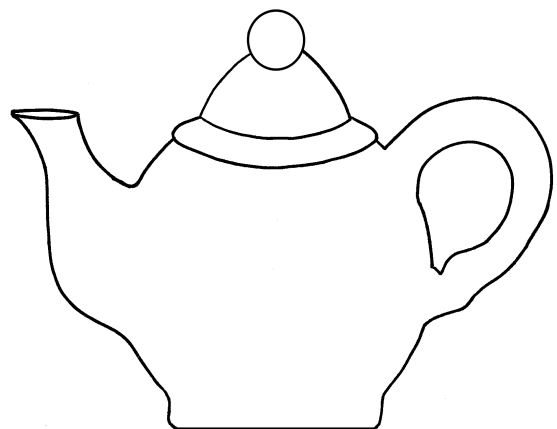
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This size fits as a topper on a large square card (14cm or 6x6)

Teapot Card

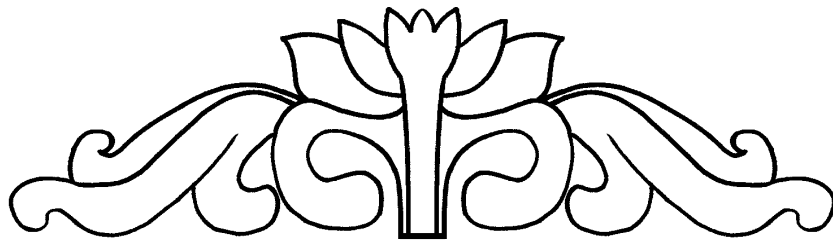
Teapot Card

This template works as a main embellishment on the front of a card there are two sizes to choose from so you can pick one to fit the size of card you want to make. When you've decided which size to use cut out that template from the printed out sheet. Place it on a sheet of flat card and draw around the shape. Cut it out and then cover it with patterned paper to decorate. Cut out the lid from the template, place it on a scrap of card and draw around it then cut out the shape. Next split up the lid template piece in to three parts the top circle, the middle bit and the bottom lip part. Draw around each of these on to card and reassemble on to the whole card piece you cut out earlier. Stick all the pieces down and then stick the lid on top of your teapot piece. Create a background on your choice of card blank how you would like and stick the teapot embellishment on the top.

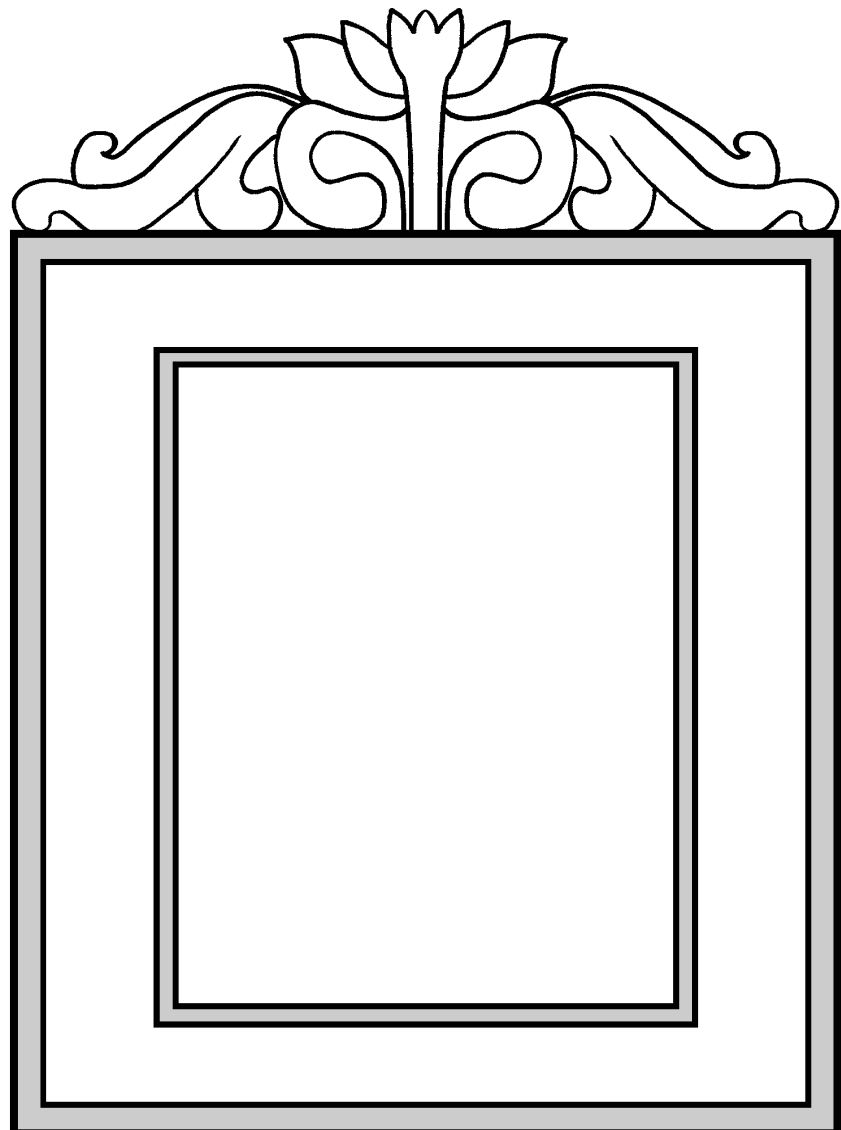

Shabby Chic Frame Card

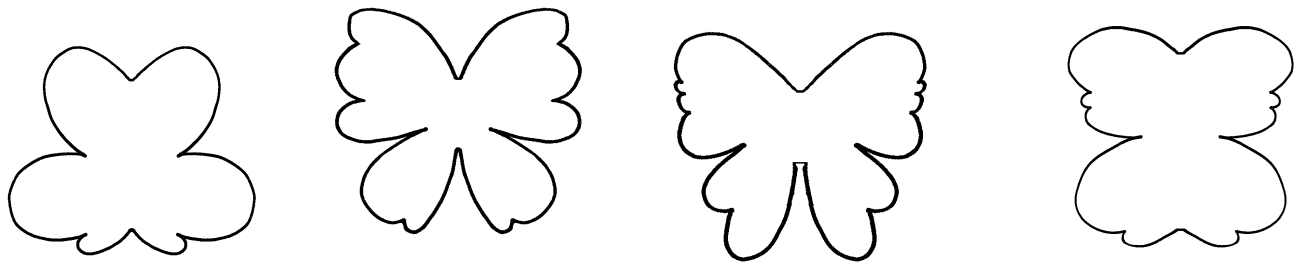
Shabby Chic Frame Card

To make the base card fold a piece of A5 card in half and trim 3cm from the top. You can also use a ready made A6 size card blank and cut 3cm from the top of it. To make the frame print out the template sheet and cut out the frame shape sticking to the outermost line. Place this on a sheet of card, draw around it and cut it out. Next take the template sheet again and cut out the decorative bit. Glue it to the back of a piece of card and then cut it out. You can draw around it instead if you like but it's easier to cut out more delicate shapes this way. Do the same thing with the outer part of the frame and the inner part of the frame (the areas shaded grey). You should end up with a whole frame shape, two skinny frame shapes and the decorative top bit all cut out from card. Assemble all the pieces together on top of the whole frame shape. Next you need to decorate your frame. You can make it any style you like but I chose to give the sample card a shabby chic look. To do this all you need is some acrylic paint and a paint brush. Dip a dry paint brush in to some paint and drag it over the whole of the frame. You can layer up more than one colour if you like - I used cream and gold. You can also add some stamping over the top, layer it up and then you can add more dry brushing over the top. Once you're happy with your frame choose what you would like to frame on your card. You could choose a sheet of patterned paper or some embellishments or even a photo if you like. Add the frame over the top of your base card, (if you are framing patterned paper you need to add it to your base card first).

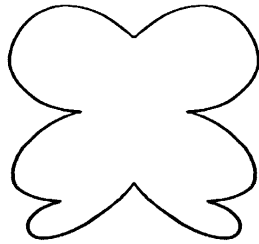

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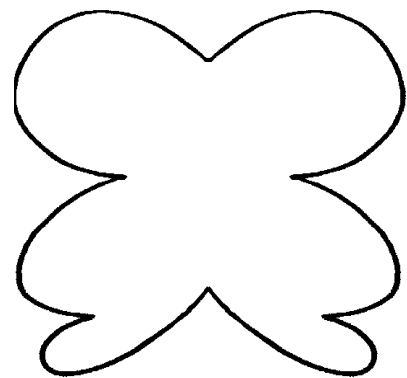
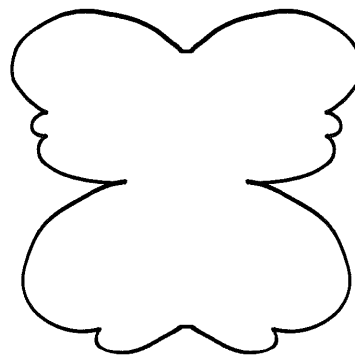
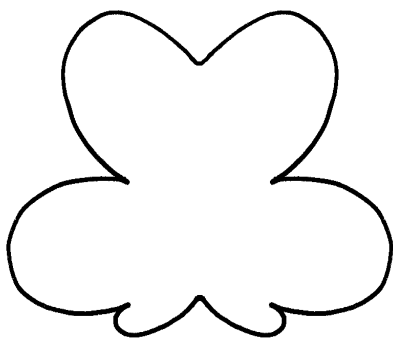
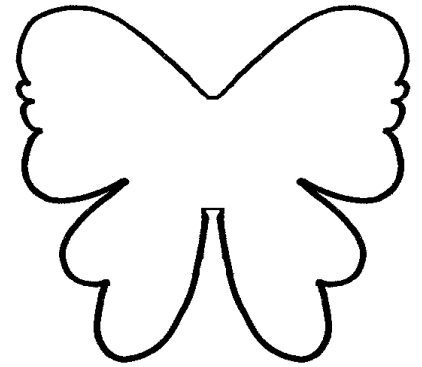
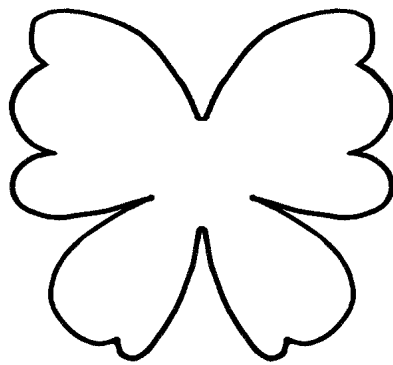


Cut out the shapes and fold them in half to create the butterfly. Create clusters on a card or use in a more ordered way.

Larger size (5x5 cm)



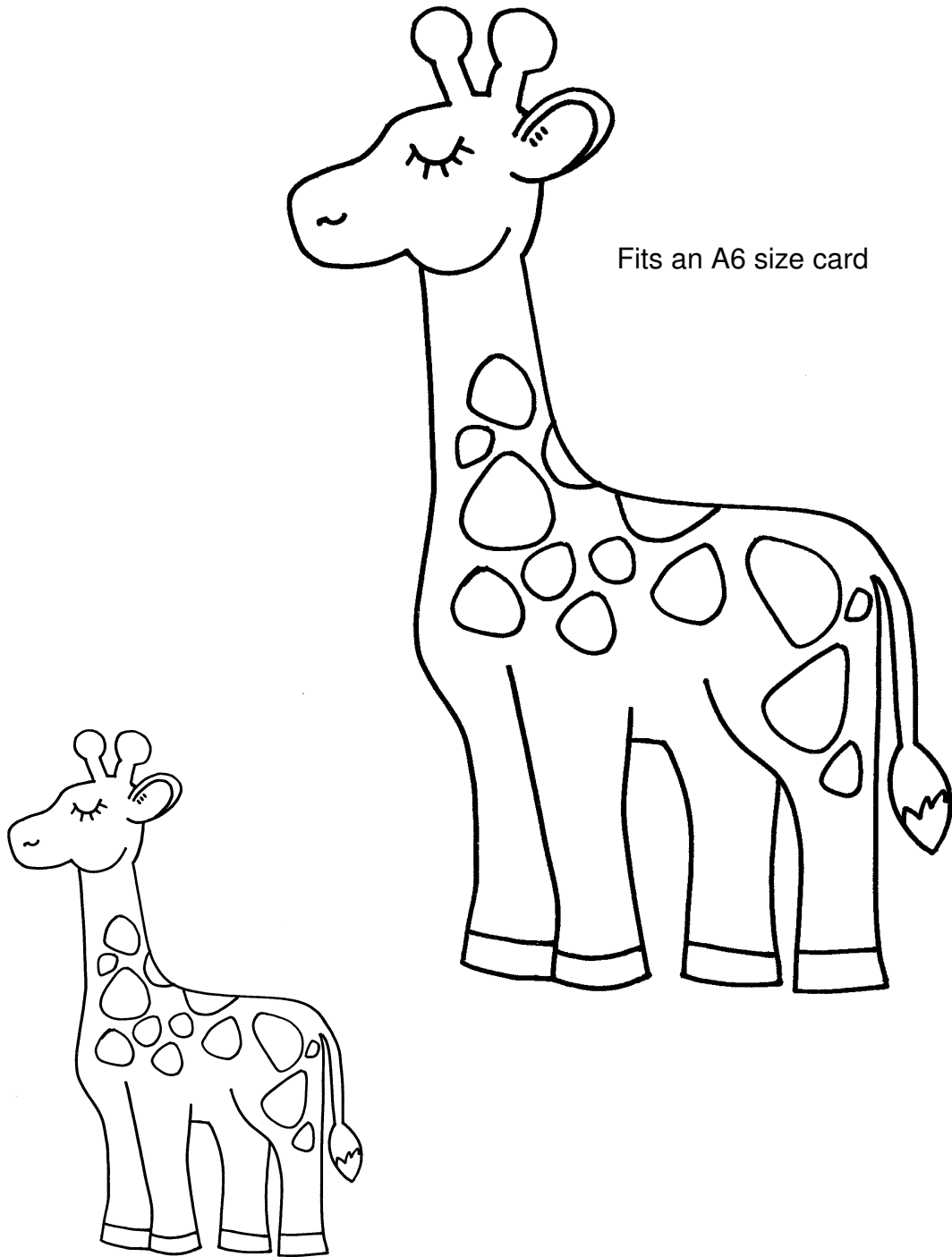
Paper Butterfly Card

There are two different sizes of butterflies to use on the template sheet, you can use just one size on your card or you can mix them up and use large and small ones on the same card. The templates are really simple to use you can either print the whole template sheet on to card and cut them out directly then decorate them or you can use them as a template drawing around them on to scraps of card or paper. It's a great way to use up small pieces of paper and card you might have saved. To make them 3D all you need to do is fold them in half. The shapes have been designed to look more three dimensional when they're folded. It's up to you how you use the butterflies on your card you can have them decorating a stamped image or create a cluster of lots of butterflies in one corner of you card. Or you can do as I've done in the sample and create a more ordered look by creating a grid of butterflies.

Giraffe Card

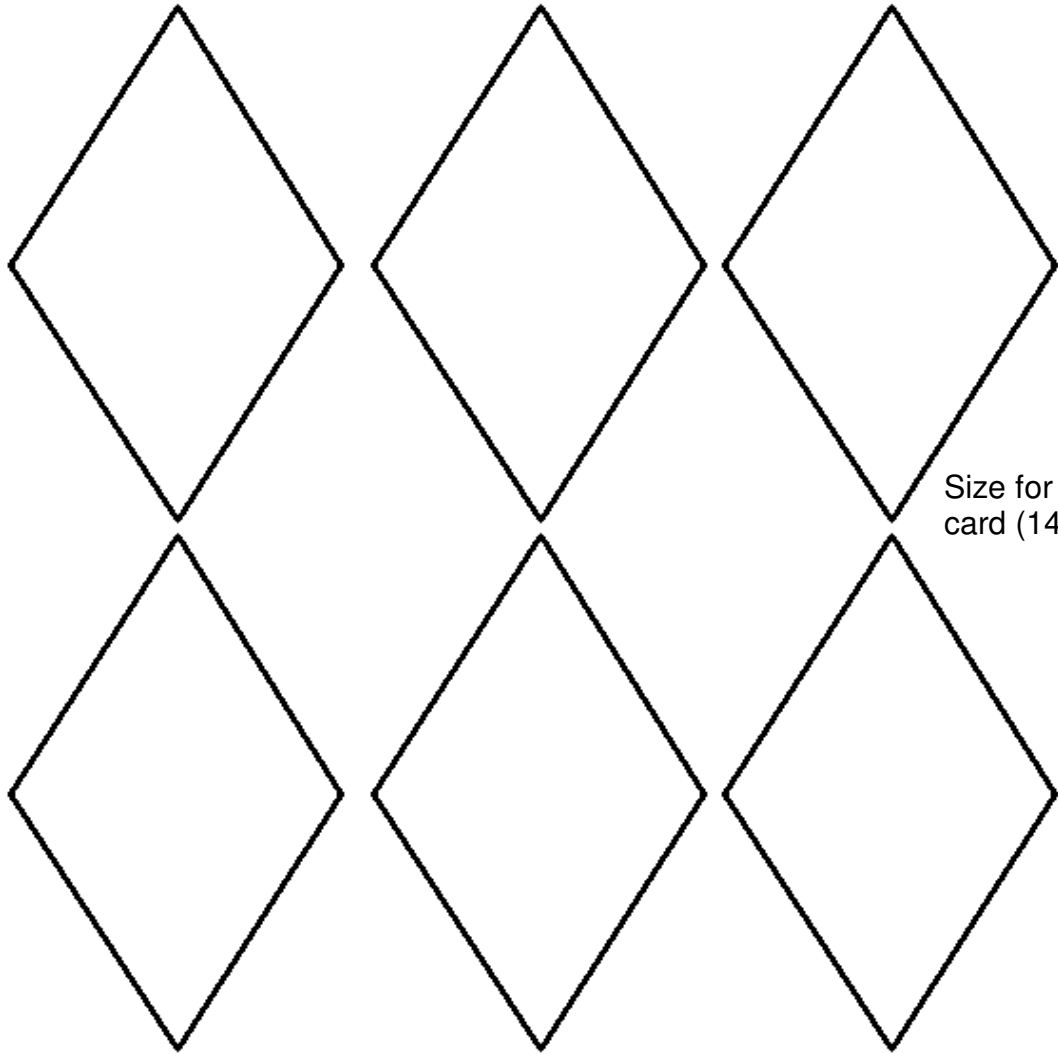
This template works as an embellishment for your card. There are two sizes to choose from, you pick one to suit the size of card you want to make. When you've chosen cut out the giraffe shape you want to use from the printed template sheet. Place it on a piece of yellow card and draw around then cut it out. To make the giraffe's spots add small dabs of glue (I use print stick for this) to the giraffe template and stick it (temporarily) to some brown card. Cut out the spots one at a time and use the template to help you to place each one on your giraffe shape, peeling off the template paper as you go. When you've done draw on the edges and the detail of the giraffe with black pen. Stick to your choice of card and add your choice of extra embellishments to finish.

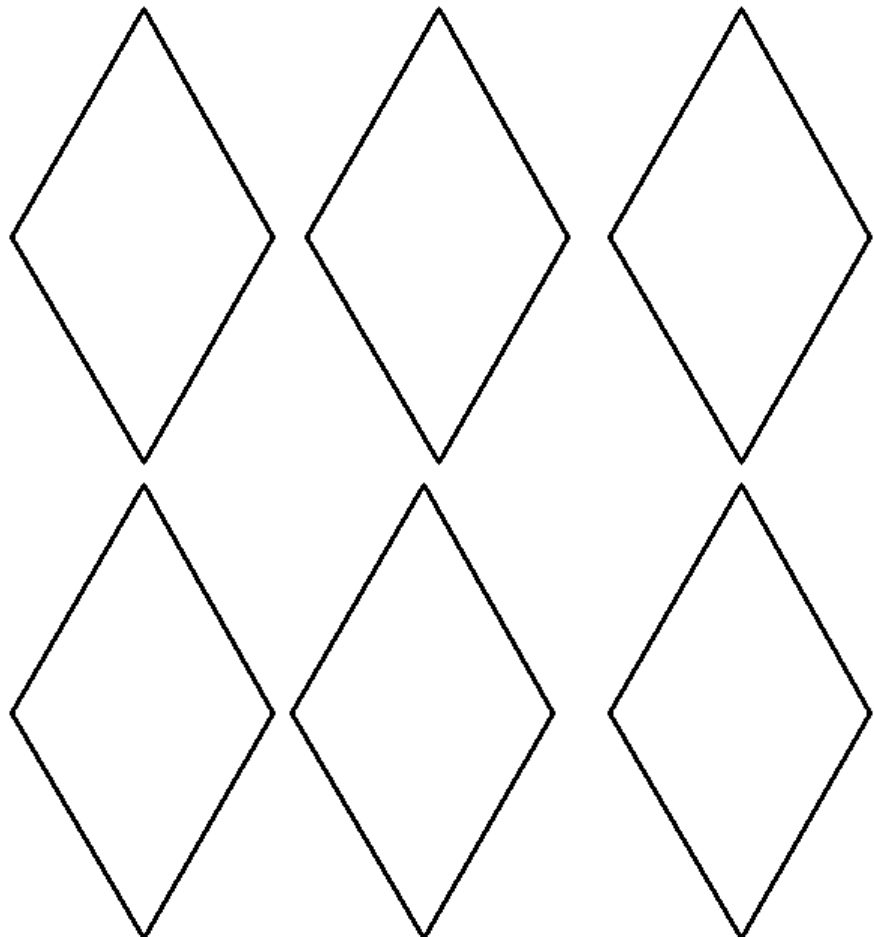


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Size for large square card (14x14cm)

Harlequin Card

Harlequin Card

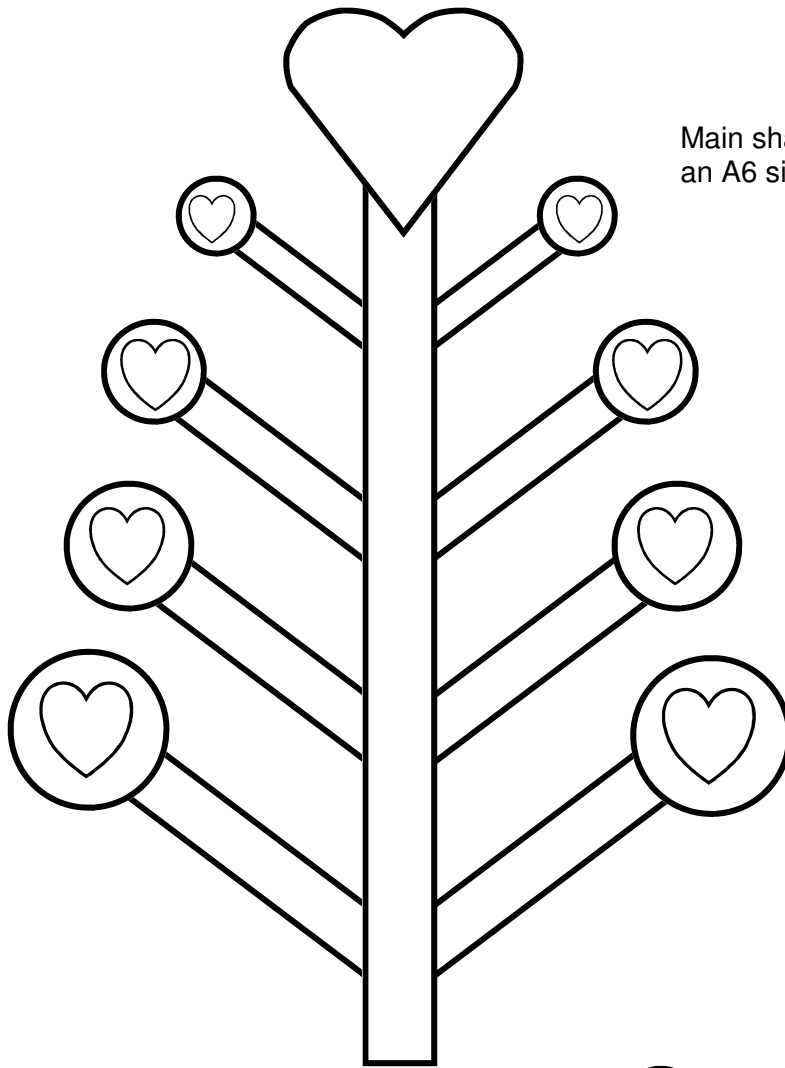
This is a really quick and simple card to make (so great for a last minute card) and you can change up how it looks just by changing the colours/patterns you use. First decide which size of card you want to make there are two different sizes on the sheet large square and A6. The larger size will also work on a A5 size card. Next choose three different pieces of patterned papers and/or coloured card. One is to cover the front of your card and the other two to mix up to make the diamond shapes. To make the harlequin pattern work you need to just pick two different patterns or a colour and a pattern. If you use more than that it won't be a harlequin pattern but you could make it look like a patchwork pattern instead if you wish. OK so when you have your papers, cut out from the printed template sheet the size of diamonds you would like to use. Draw around the shape on to the two different patterns you are using - how you build up your pattern will determine how many you need to cut out. You can have the pattern running across the middle of your card or from corner to corner or covering the whole of the front even if you wish. Assemble your card by sticking the diamond shapes alternately edge to edge. Trim the edges to your card edge and add your choice of message to finish.

You can also use these shapes to make mini bunting to add to cards. Cut out the diamond shapes and fold them in half. Place glue on the backs on the diamond shapes and fold each one over a length of thread sticking the two folded sides down to trap the thread inside. You can add the bunting to the front of a card or to the inside.

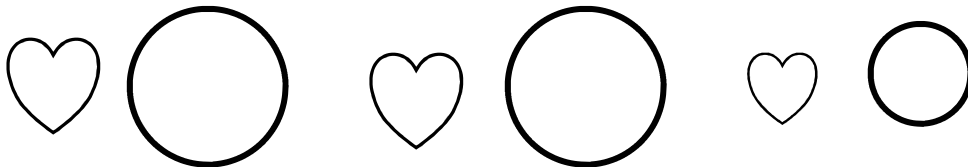
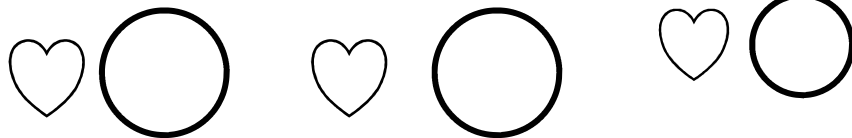
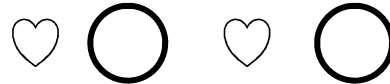

Heart Tree Card

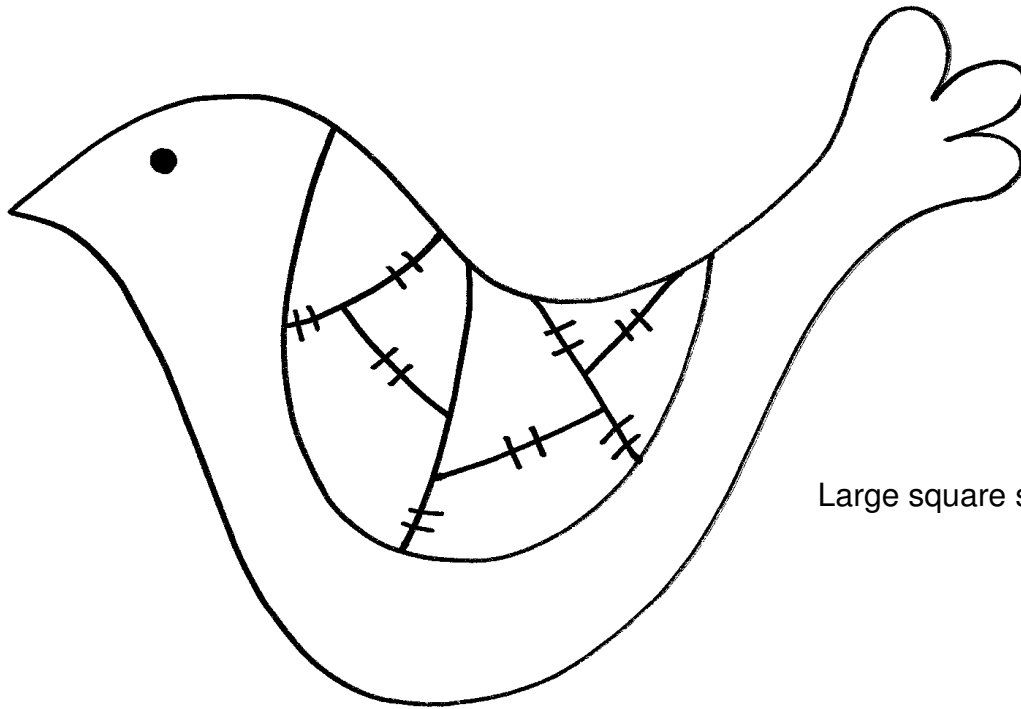
Heart Tree Card

Print out the template sheet. Cut out the main template shape, stick to the outside edge to start with. Place this shape on a sheet of card, draw around it then cut it out. Take the printed template sheet again, chop the half where the circles are off and stick it to the back of some patterned paper. Cut out each of the circles then turn them to the patterned side and stick them on to the circle ends on the main template shape. You can cut the hearts out too if you like or you can leave them. Cut the large heart out from the main template and draw around that on to the same patterned paper. Cut this out and then stick it to your main piece. That's your embellishment done, from here you can embellish it more if you like and then when you're done stick it to the front of your choice of card blank.

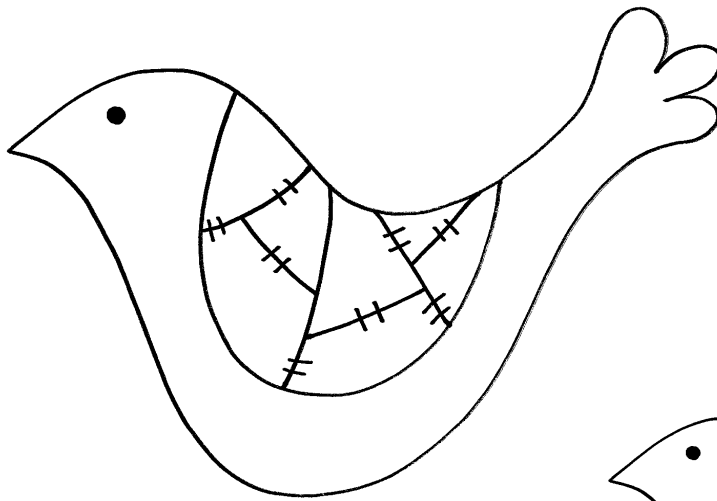

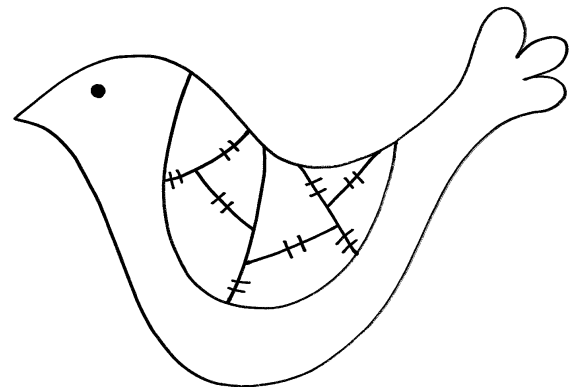
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Large square size (14x14 cm)

Patchwork Birdie Card

Patchwork Birdie Card

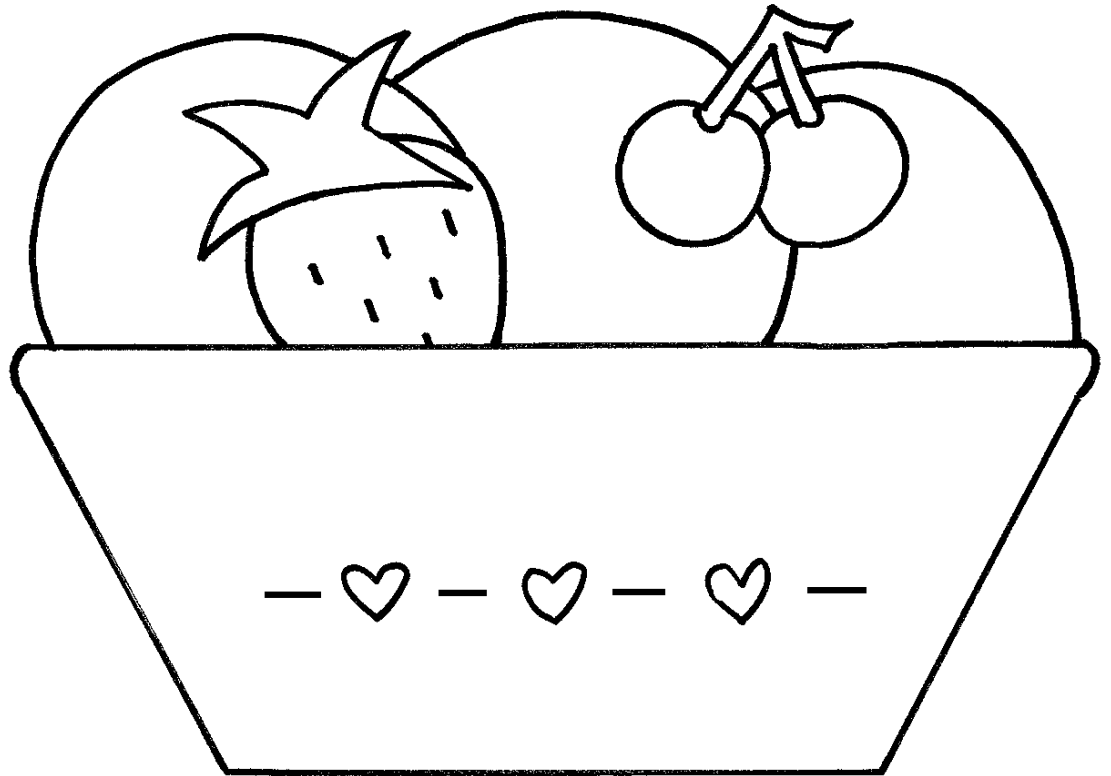
This template sheet works to make embellishments for your choice of card. There are three different sizes of birdie to pick - you pick the one that suits the size/type of card you want to make. When you've decided print off the template sheet and cut out the birdie shape you're using. Place the shape on a sheet of card, draw around it and cut it out. If you want to make more than one birdie repeat this. Next cover the birdie shape with patterned paper. Cut out the wing from the template and draw around the whole wing shape on to a scrap of card and cut it out. To make the patchwork effect on the wing cut out each of the patchwork pieces on the wing template **one at a time**, it's important to do this so you don't get lost with where which patchwork piece goes. Draw around each piece on to patterned paper and reassemble the pieces to the wing shape you cut out earlier. You can add real stitching if you want or you can draw it on with a pen. Stick the finished wing to the birdie shape and then stick your finished birdie embellishment to your card.

Fruity Ice Cream Card

Fruity Ice Cream Card

Print out the template sheet. Cut out the base card template from the sheet. Fold a piece of A5 card in half (or a piece of card large enough to fit the template on) and place the template on the card so the dashed line on the template matches up to the fold. Draw around the shape and cut it out keeping the card folded. That's your base card done. Next you need to take the template sheet again and this time cut out the top template. Cut it out as one shape, don't worry about the detail yet. Draw around it on to a flat sheet of card and cut out the shape. Place this shape over the top of the base card to make your shaped card.

To decorate the card cut out the ice cream pieces from the top template - ignore cutting around the cherry and the strawberry - there are separate shapes to cut out of these on the template sheet. Use three different colours for each of the ice cream pieces, drawing around them and cutting them out. Do the same with the bowl piece using a patterned paper then stick the ice creams and the bowl on to your shaped card. Cut out the cherry and the strawberry from the template sheet and use them as templates to make two embellishments from coloured card. Stick these to your shaped card. Add some extra embellishments and a message to your card to finish.
