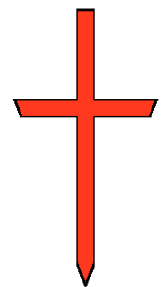
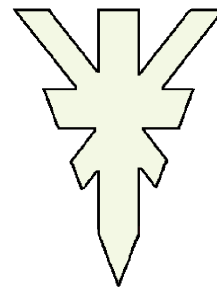
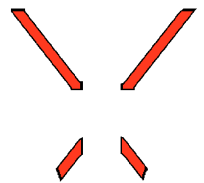
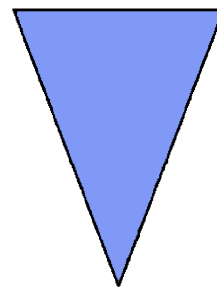
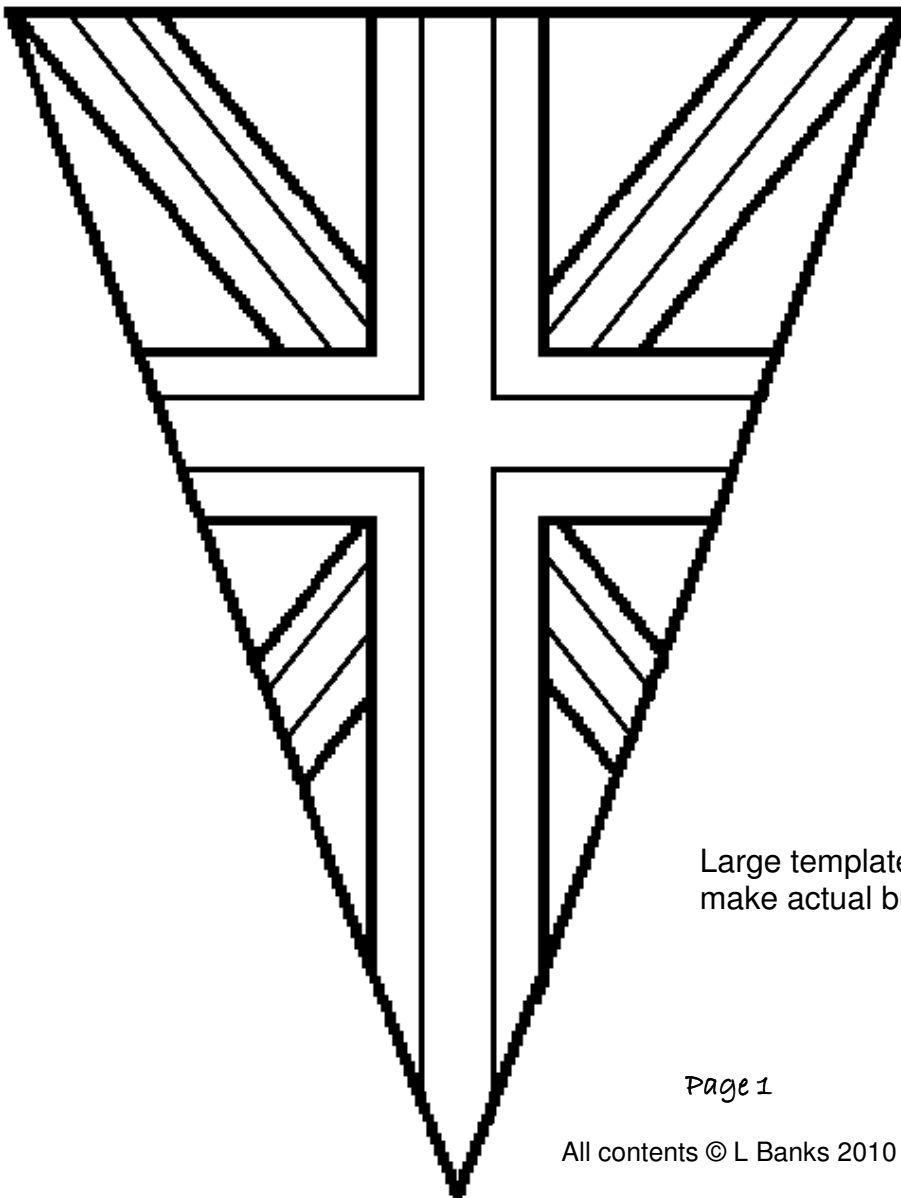


Two sizes for cards, one for large square cards, (above) and one for portrait A6 and other smaller cards, (below).



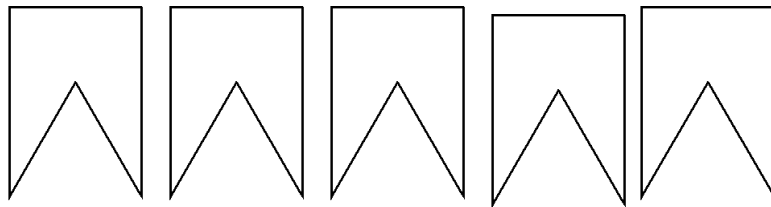
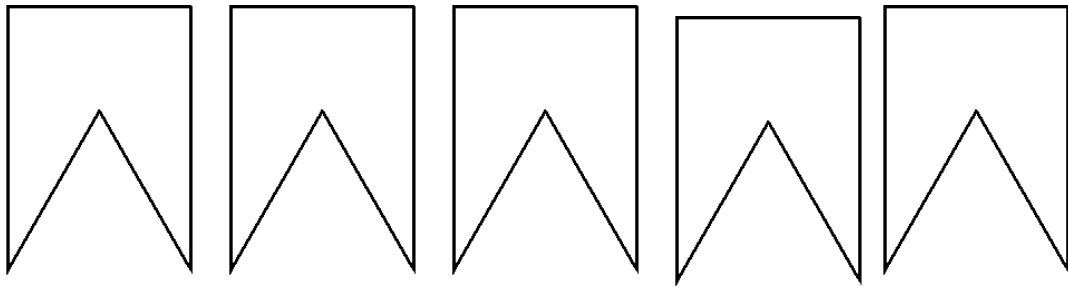
Large template you can use to make actual bunting if you like.

Print off the template sheet. There are two different sizes of flag on the sheet so first decide which size you want to use. This really depends on the size of card you're making and how long you want your bunting. When you have decided which size will fit cut out the corresponding size pieces. To make it easier for you the template pieces have been coloured coded so you know what colour to cut out. You can use patterned paper as in the sample below or use plain coloured card. Start with the largest piece in blue and cut out a piece from card, (in blue or blue based pattern). You need to cut out as many as you want flags on your card. Next cut out the white pieces from white or cream card or patterned paper. Cut out one for each flag and the layer them over the blue pieces. Finally cut out the red parts, these can be a little bit fiddly, if you wanted to draw on the narrower red parts you can do. Layer on the red parts to finish. To make your bunting first glue your piece of string or ribbon your bunting will hang from on your card from one side to the other. Glue the flags so they 'hang' from underneath this string, start with the ones on the end and fill in the centre ones to give you even spacing. Add any extra embellishments to your card you like to finish.

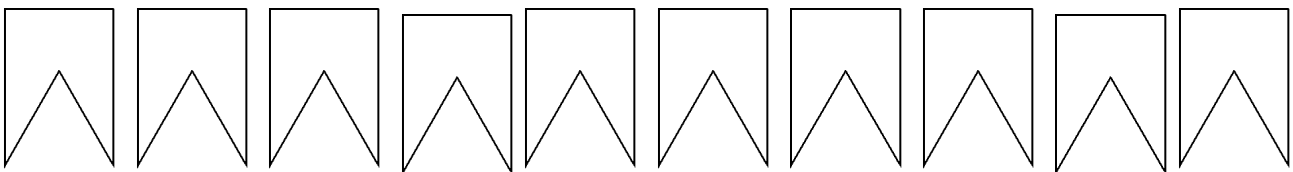
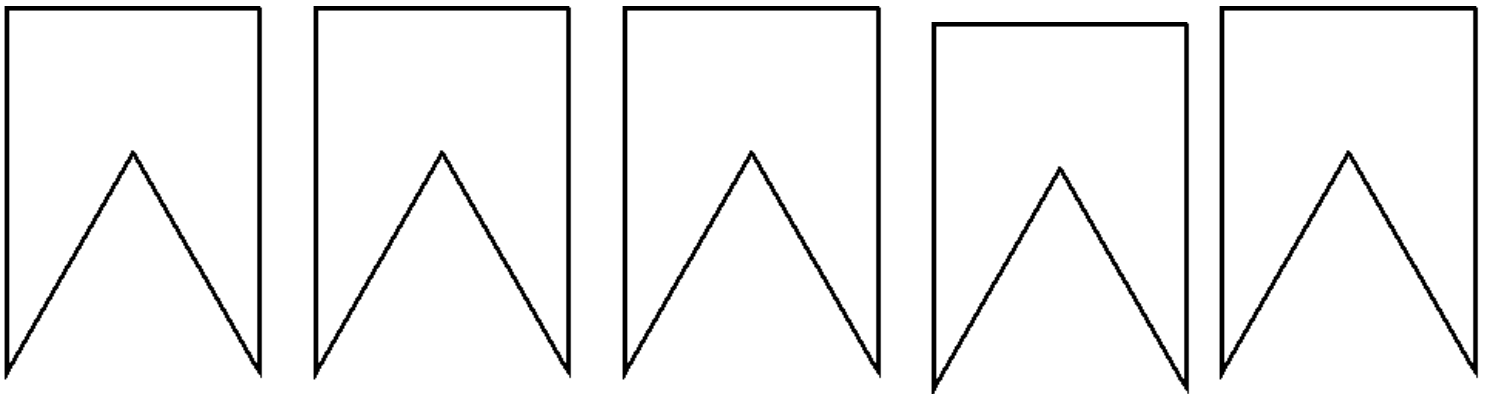

Can be used as templates or printed straight onto patterned paper and cut out.

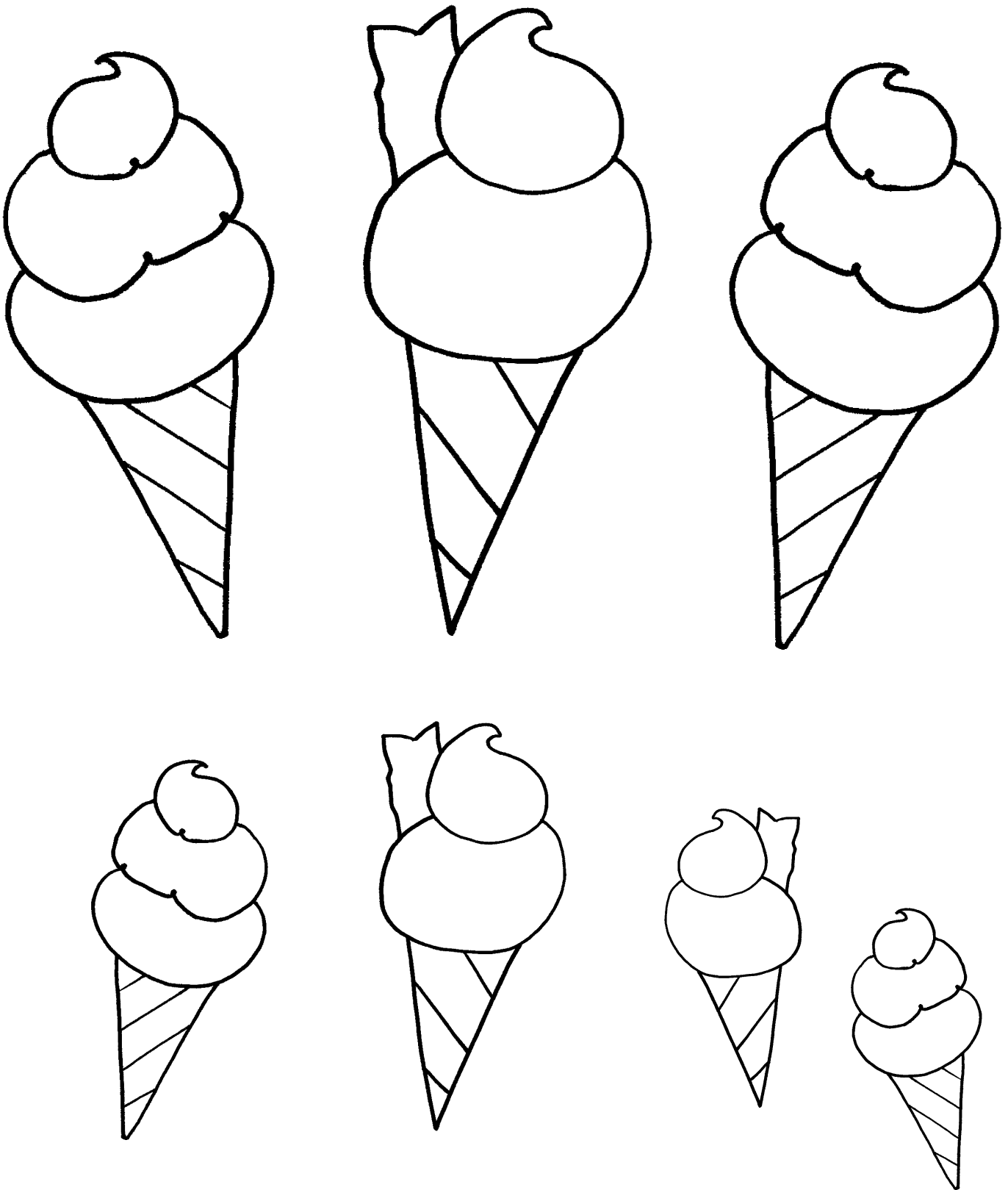


There is the option for you to print this template sheet directly onto patterned paper if you wanted to and then cut out the shapes to use. If you wanted to use them as a template you only need to cut out one of flags and draw around it many times. There are different sizes of flags on the sheet so first decide which size you want to use. This really depends on the size of card you're making and how long you want your bunting. Use your choice of method, (as explained above) to cut out your bunting from patterned paper. Decorate your card first then add your bunting over the top gluing it underneath a piece of string on your card to make it look like real bunting.

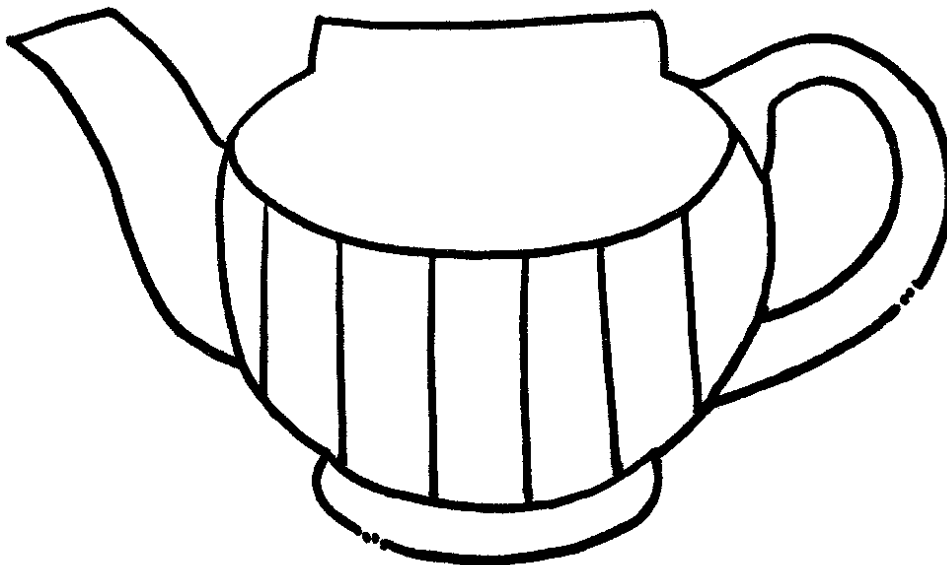
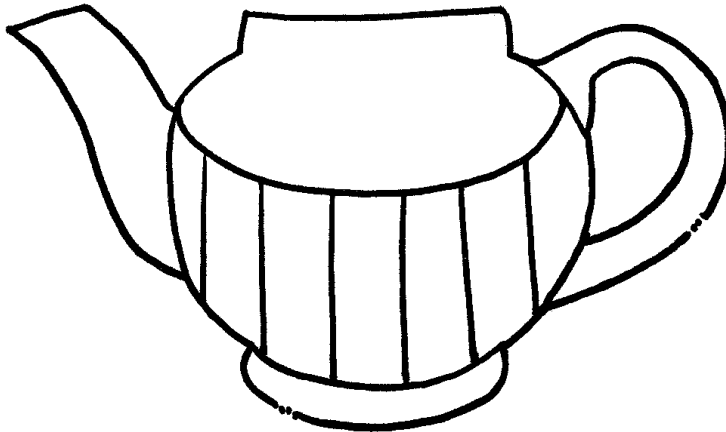
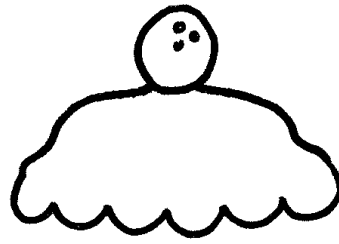
Print off the template sheet. There are two different sizes on the sheet so first decide which size you want to use. This really depends on the size of card you're making. When you have decided which size will fit cut out the corresponding size templates. Draw around template on to brown or cream coloured card. Cut out the shapes. Next cut the ice cream parts of the templates out and draw around each one on to different colours of card, what colours you use depends on what 'flavour' of ice cream you want to depict. Add the layers of ice cream to the whole shapes you cut out earlier. When you're done only the cone part should remain brown. You can add doodling on top of your ice creams to pick out the detail. Add your ice cream embellishments to your card.

size cards, (4x6).



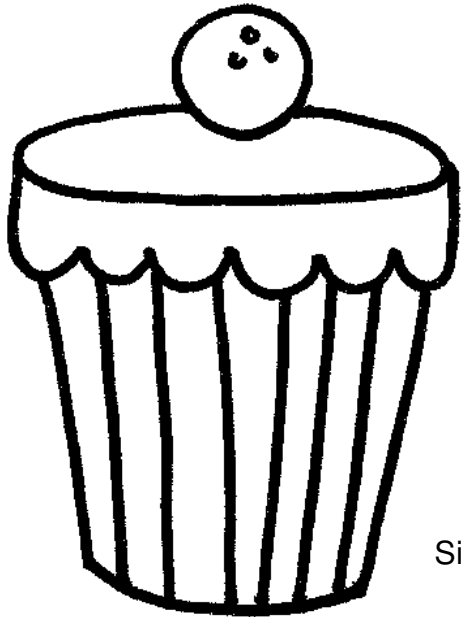
Size for large

Print off the template sheet. There are two sizes to choose from so pick out which size first on the size of card you want to make. Cut out the corresponding template from the sheet. Draw around the whole template shape on to patterned paper and cut it out. Next take the template and cut off the teapot spout, handle and lid so you're left with just the middle bit. Put the lid template piece to one side for now. Draw around the middle part template of the teapot on to patterned paper, you can use the stripes to make a striped teapot or just use a solid piece of patterned paper it's up to you. Cut out this piece and glue it over the top of the whole piece you cut out earlier. Next draw around the lid on to a light coloured card stock. Colour in the cherry on top red or cut out a red cherry from coloured card. Glue the lid shape to your embellishment. Finally doodle around the edges of your teacup embellishment to highlight them. Glue your finished embellishment to your card blank. In the sample bellow I've added a message made with the banner template on page 3 of this months templates. Lots of this months templates will mix and match together well.

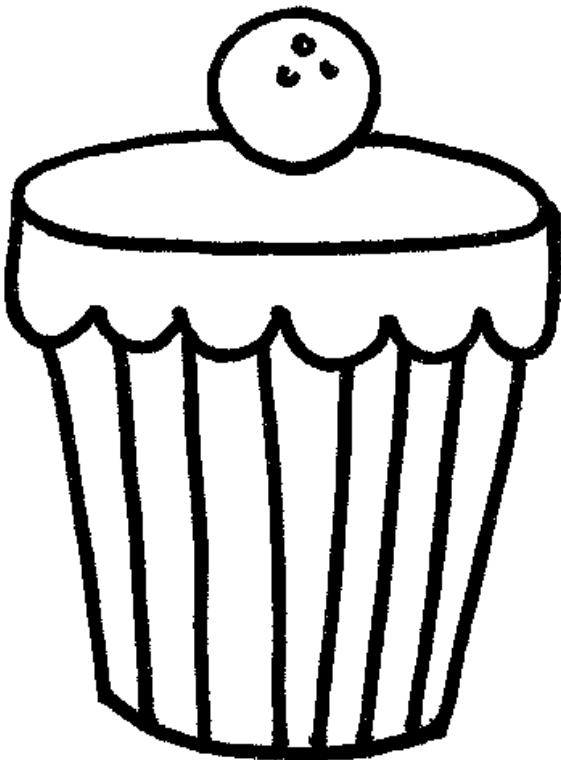
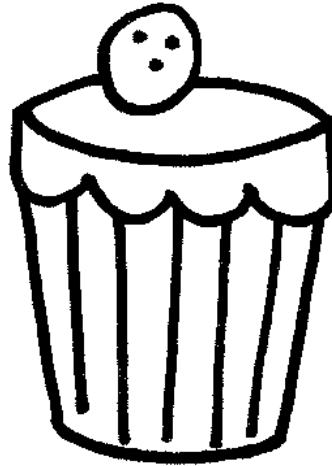

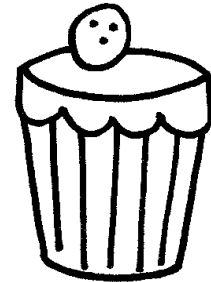
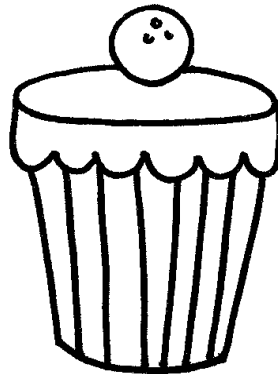




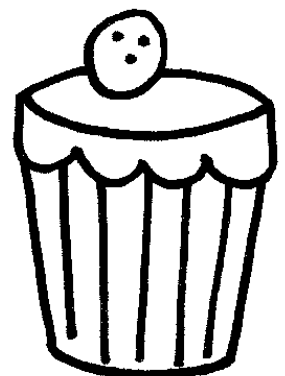
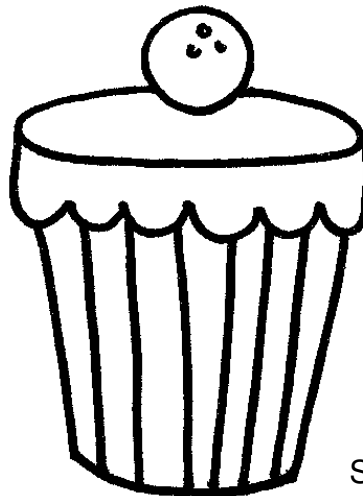
Size for large square card, (6x6) .

Print off the template sheet. There are lots of different choices of sizes to use on this sheet so first you need to decide which you would like to use. This really depends on what size of card you're making. When you have decided which size will fit cut it/them out from the template sheet. Next pick out some patterned papers and draw around the templates on to them. Cut off the iced top of the fairy cake templates and draw around the tops on to plain coloured cardstock, white or light pink colours work well to depict the icing. Finally colour in the cherry on top or cut one out from red card. As an alternative to cherries you can glue a flower or something else on top of your fairy cake. Finally to finish you embellishment doodle around the edges and on the patterned cake cases using the templates as a guide.

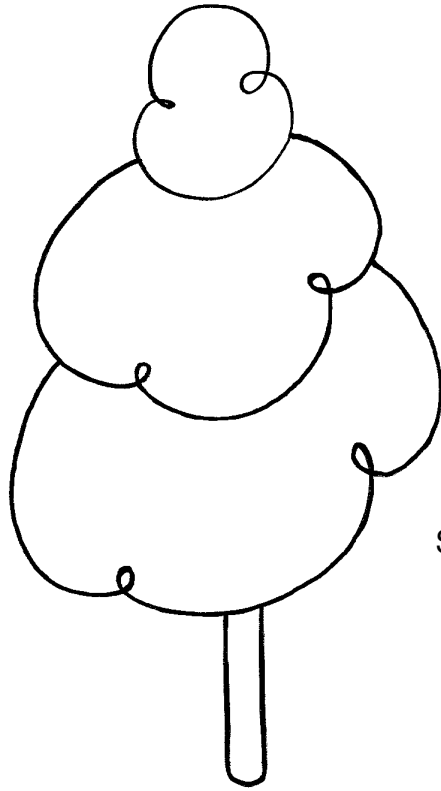
Add your finished embellishments to your card blank.

The card below has been decorated with a piece of patterned paper and a paper doily. The embellishment was then added on top and a message added to finish.

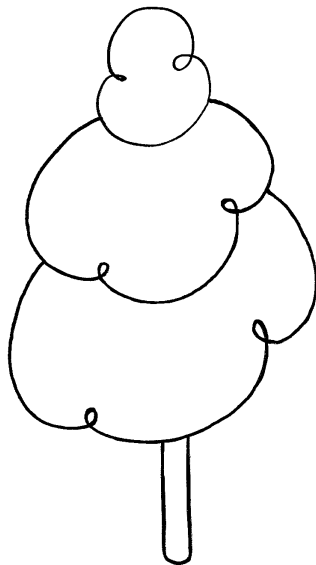

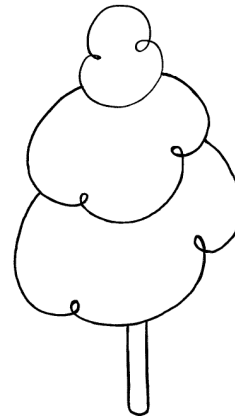




Size for large square cards and portrait A6, (4x6)



Sizes for landscape A6 cards, (4x6) and gift tags.

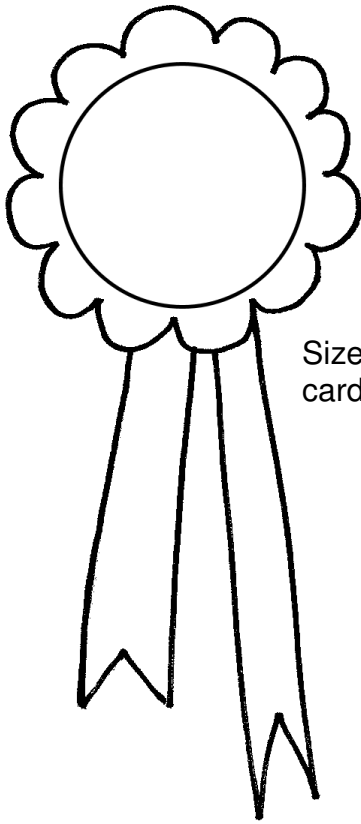


Print off the template sheet. On the sheet there's different sizes so you can pick out one that suits your card or other project. When you have chosen which size fits your card best, cut it out. Draw around the whole shape on to cream or brown coloured card and cut it out. Next separate the 'fluffy' sections of the candyfloss template top and draw around each one onto pink coloured card. Layer up the pieces on the top of the whole shape you cut out earlier and glue them down. Doodle around the edges in pink marker pen to highlight them. Attach your finished embellishment to your project. In the card sample bellow I've used a kraft card blank and added a piece of decorative boarder tape over the top then layered a strip of patterned paper over the top of that. The candy floss embellishment was then added along with a message. If you wanted to you could add pink glitter or fluff to your embellishment or cut it out of felt to give it a different texture.

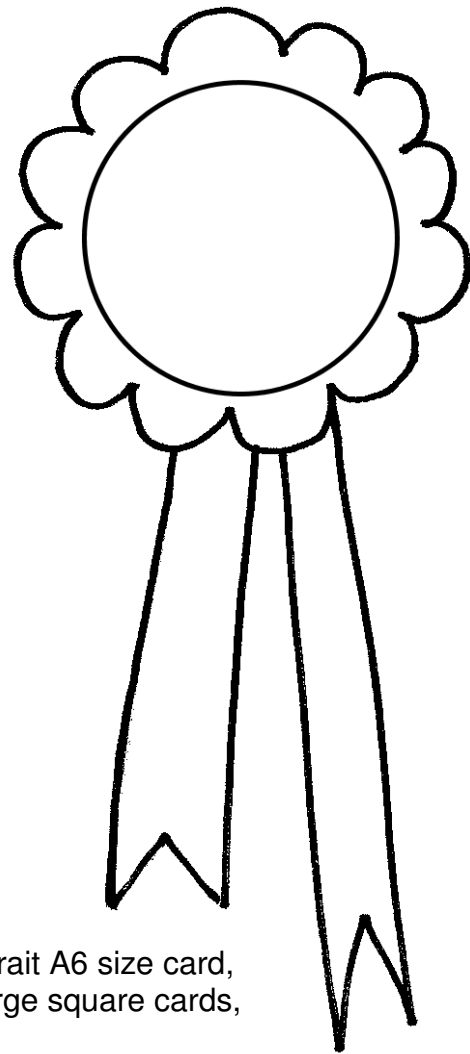

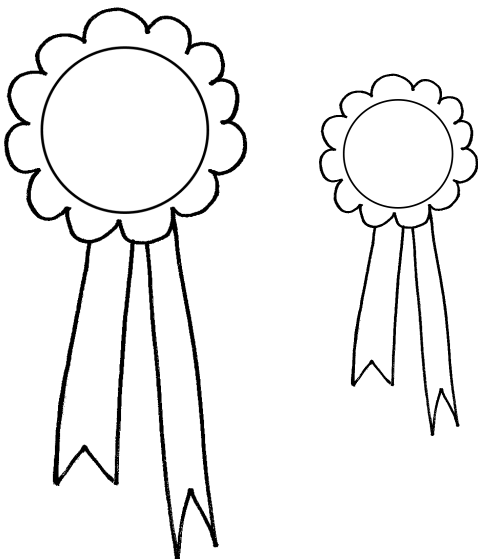




Size for landscape A6 size card, (4x6)



Size for portrait A6 size card, (4x6) and large square cards, (6x6)



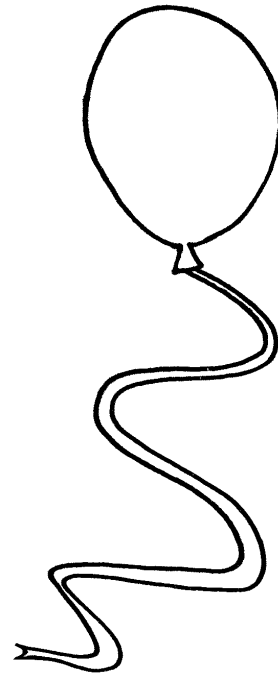
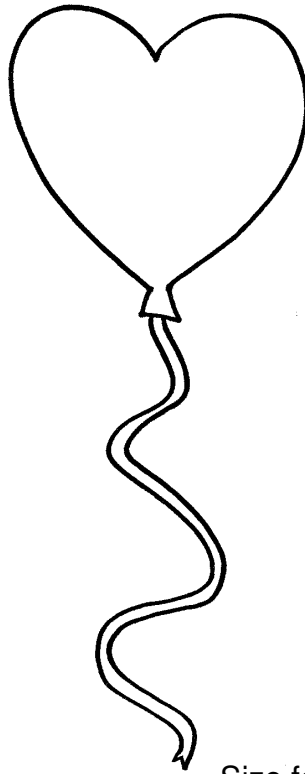
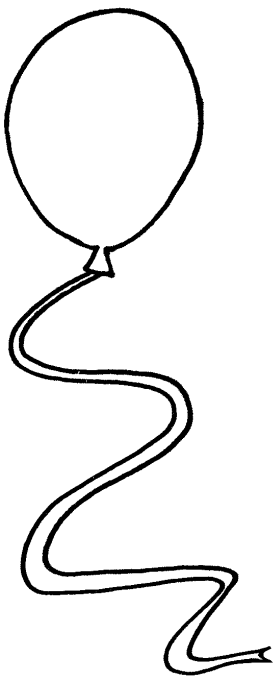
Miniature size for backgrounds and gift tags.

Print off the template sheet. On the sheet there's different sized rosettes so you can pick out one that suits your card or other project you want to make such as the little tiny one used on a gift tag, (see image below). When you have decided which size works for you cut it out of the sheet. Next pick out three different but co-ordinating patterned papers. Take one of them and draw around the whole template shape on to it and cut it out. Next take the template and cut off the long ribbon parts so you're left with the scalloped circle shape. Draw around the scalloped circle shape on to the second of your patterned paper pieces and cut it out. Glue it over the top of your whole piece you cut out first matching up the edges so it fits over perfectly. Finally cut out the inner circle from the template piece and draw around that on to your last remaining piece of patterned paper. Cut it out and then glue it to the center of your rosette shape. Your rosette embellishment is now finished. You can add a message to the center if you like. Add it to your card blank as an embellishment. On the sample bellow I've added two different patterned papers to the background and tied a piece of ribbon around where to two pieces join.

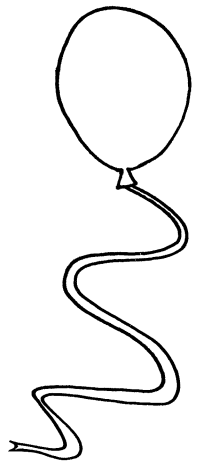
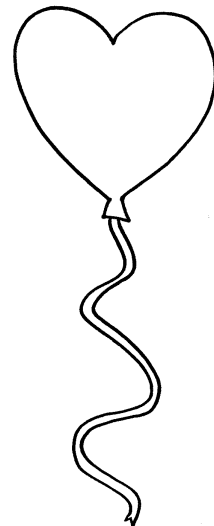
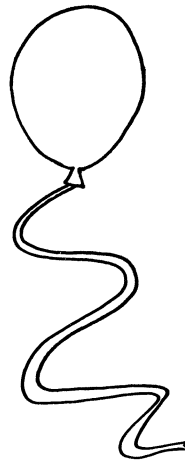
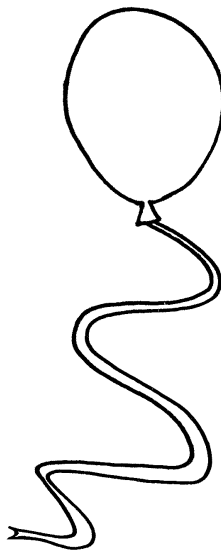
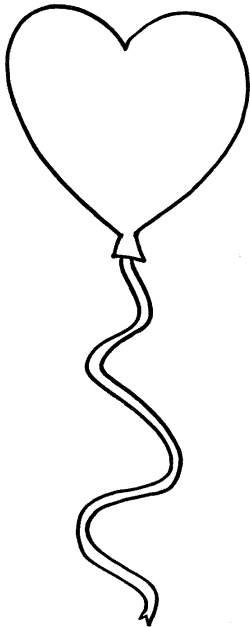
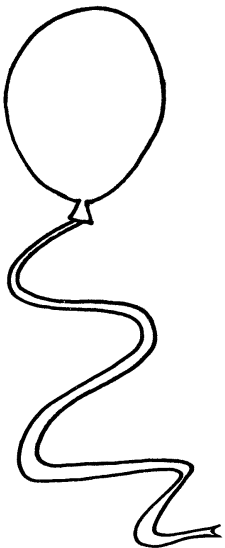

Size for landscape A6 size card, (4x6)

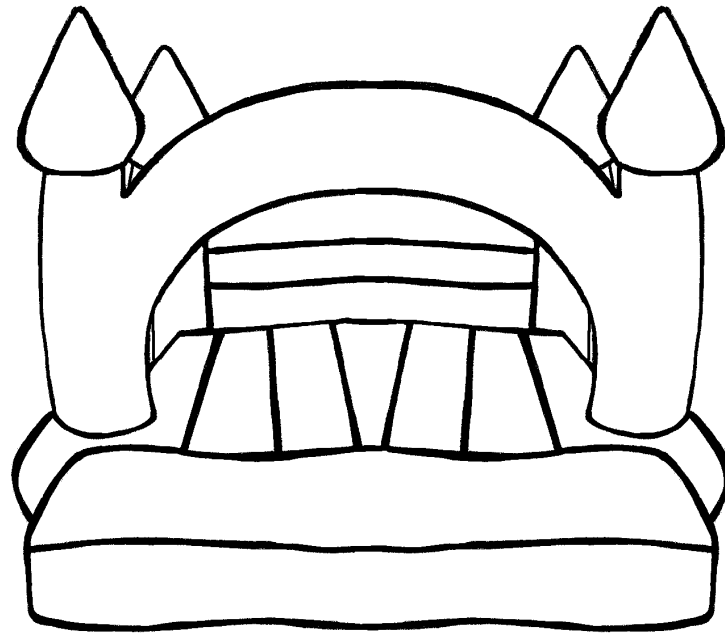
Size for portrait A6 size card, (4x6).

Print off the template sheet. Decide which size of balloons you would like to use on your card blank and cut out the corresponding size template. Draw around the top of the balloon templates on to patterned paper and cut them out. Decorate your card blank with patterned paper. Use the balloon template 'string' as a guide to place real string or ribbon on your card. Glue down the string then glue the balloon shapes at the top. Add a fun message to finish.

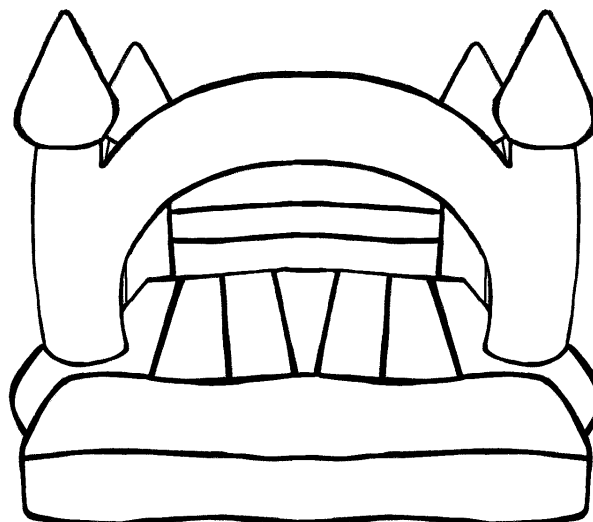

Two sizes for cards, one for large square cards, (above) and one for portrait A6 and other smaller cards, (below).

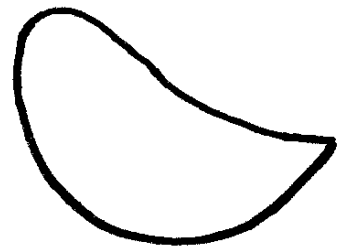
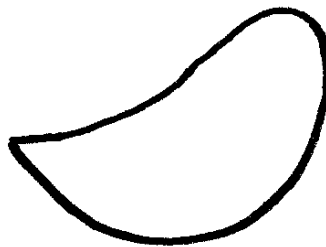
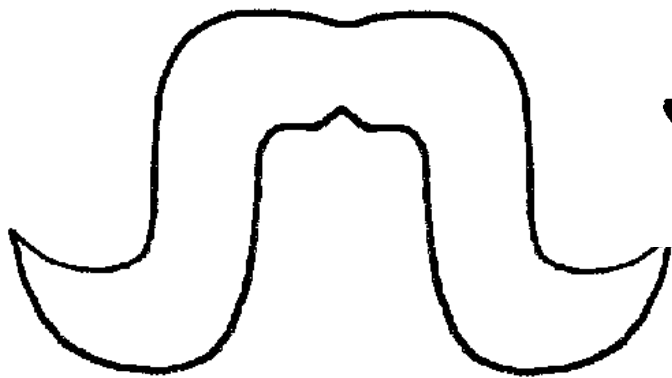
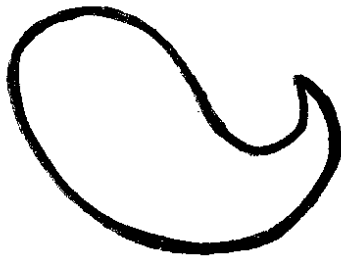
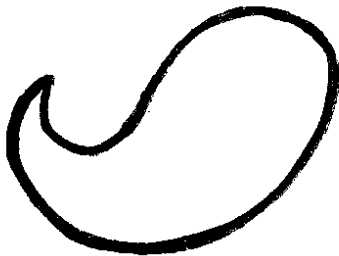
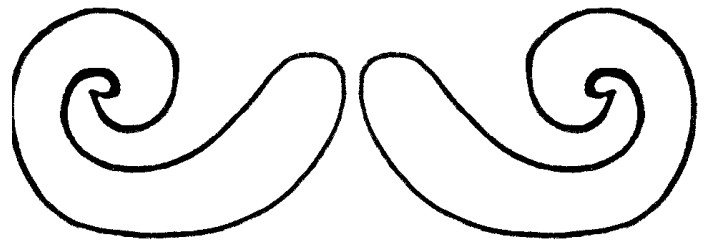
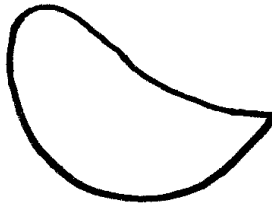
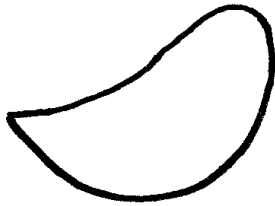
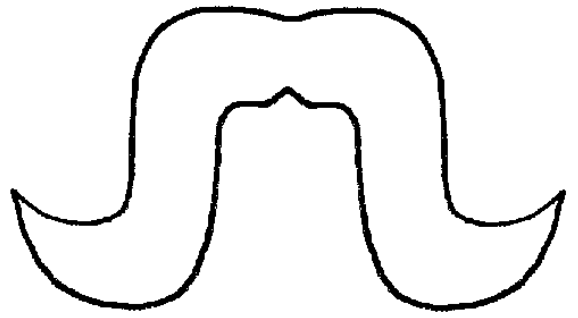
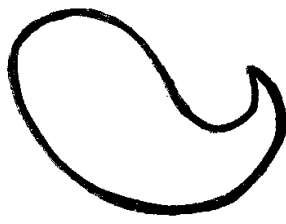
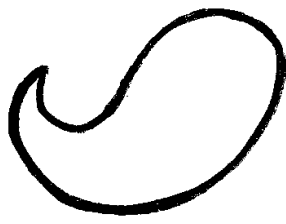


Print off the template sheet. Cut out the size of bouncy castle that suits the size of card you want to make. Draw around the whole shape on to plain coloured or patterned paper and cut it out. Next take the template again and separate all the detail by cutting them apart. Place the cut out pieces on to your whole cut out shape and draw around them to fill in the detail. Doodle over the top of your bouncy castle shape to make design stand out. Decorate your card blank and add your bouncy castle embellishment on top to finish.

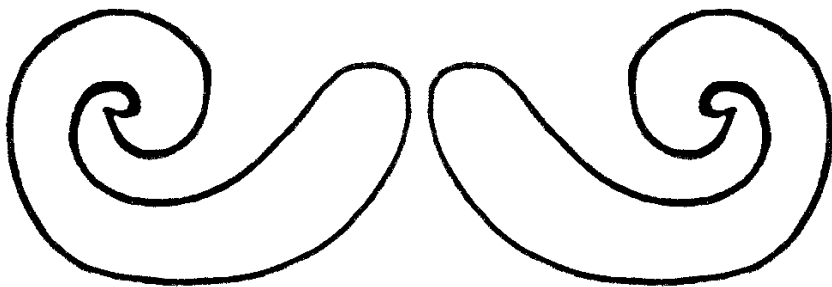

Print off the template sheet. Decide which moustache you want to use, there are two sets of four different moustaches. You can use more than one on one card if you wanted to too. When you have decided which you would like to use cut it/them out. Draw around your moustache on a piece of patterned or plain coloured card.

Cut out the shapes. Decorate your card blank then add on your moustache embellishments. Add a greeting to finish off your card. This will make a fun fathers day card but will also make a general fun card for men.
