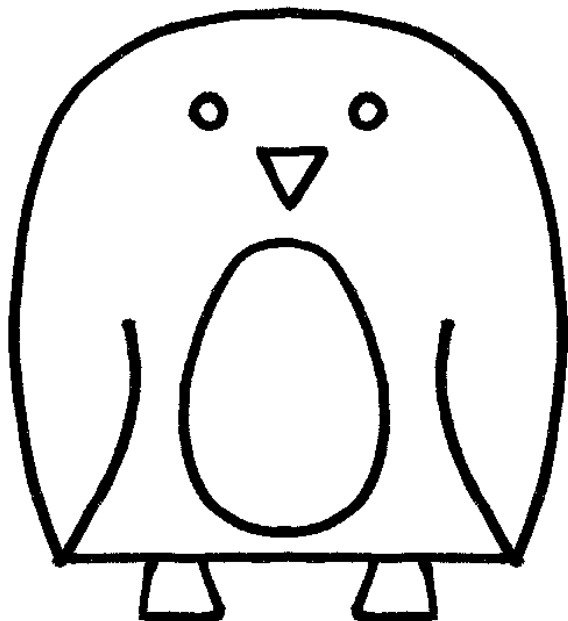
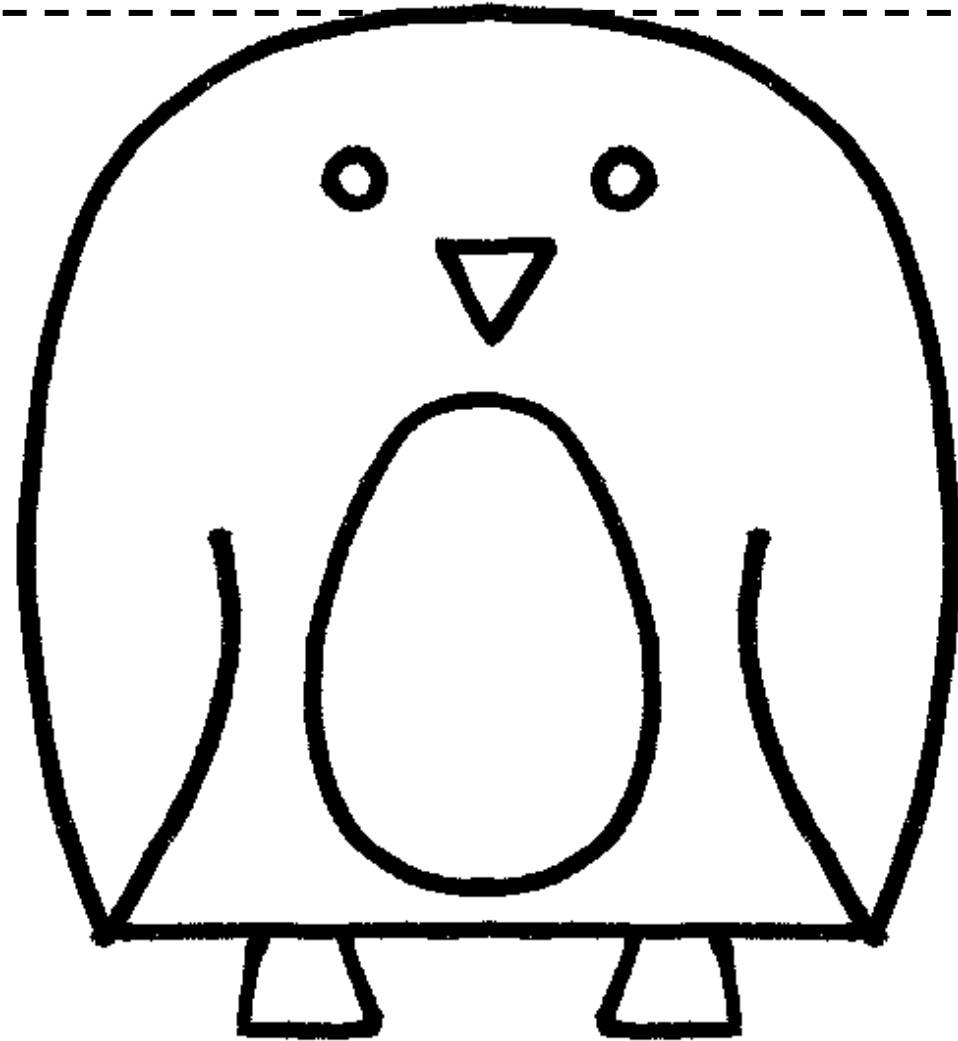
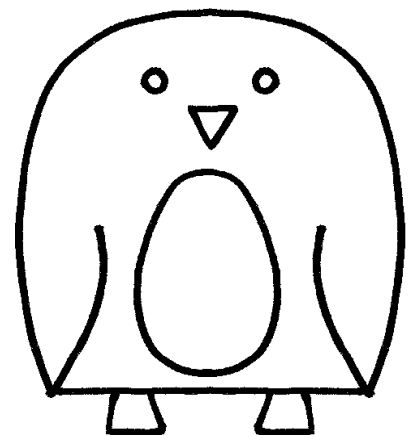


You can use me to make a shaped card matching the dashed line to the fold on your card and drawing around.



Mini versions to make embellishments



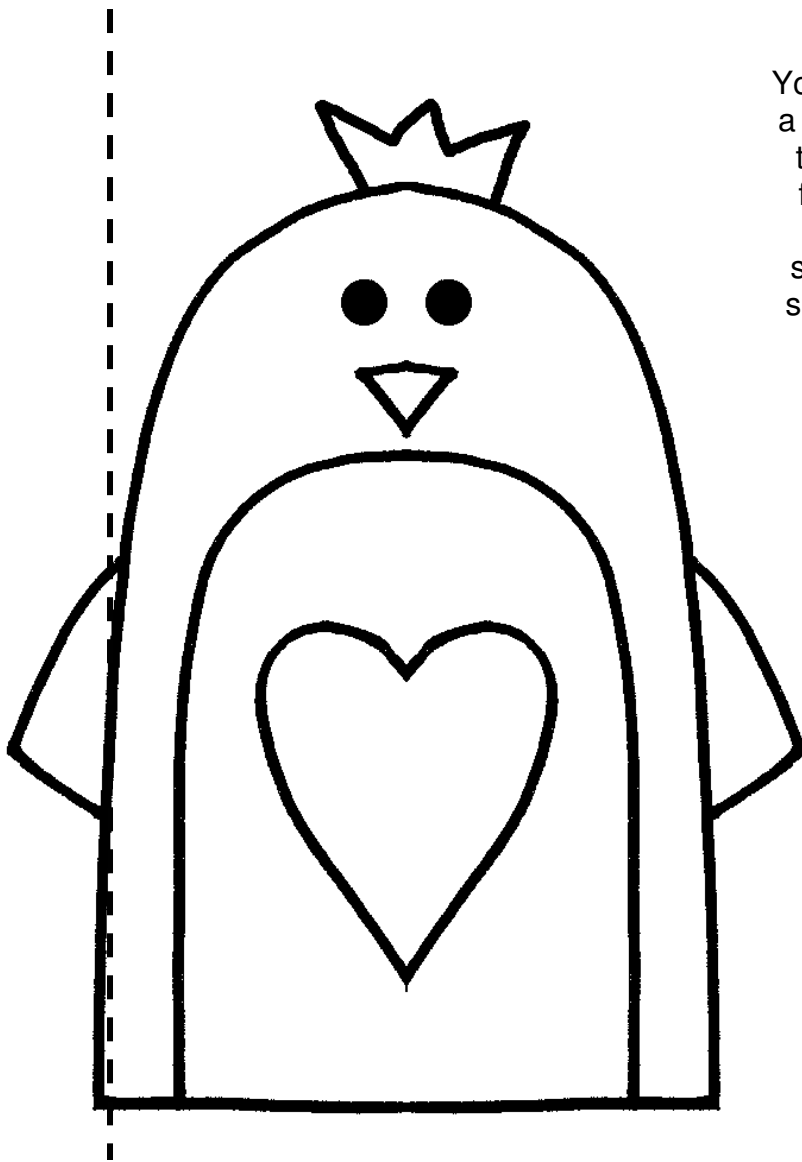
Print off the template sheet. On the sheet there are different sizes to choose from. If you would like to make the shaped card cut out the largest of the templates. Take a piece of card and fold it in half, it needs to be large enough to fit your template on. Place the template on the folded card so the dashed line matches up to the fold on the card. Draw around the template and then keeping the card folded cut out the shape to create your shaped base card.

Next take the template and draw around it on to a piece of patterned paper. Cut out the shape and glue it to the front of your shaped card. Cut the tummy part of the birdie template out, this is a fun Easter egg shape. Place it on a piece of patterned paper that co-ordinates with the first one you used and draw around the egg shape. Cut it out and place it on the front of your card using the template as a guide so you get it in the right place. Do the same with the beak, cutting it from the template drawing around it and gluing it to your card. Finally draw on the rest of the details copying them from the template. Add a message to his tummy and any other embellishments you'd like to add.

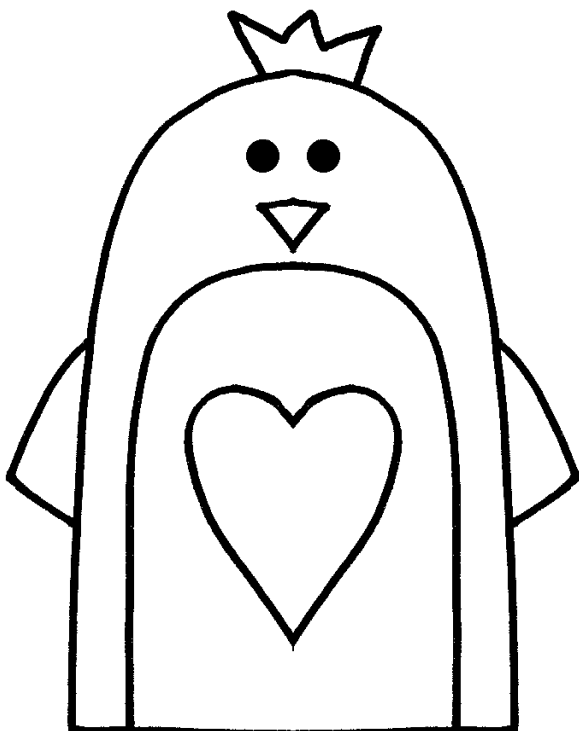

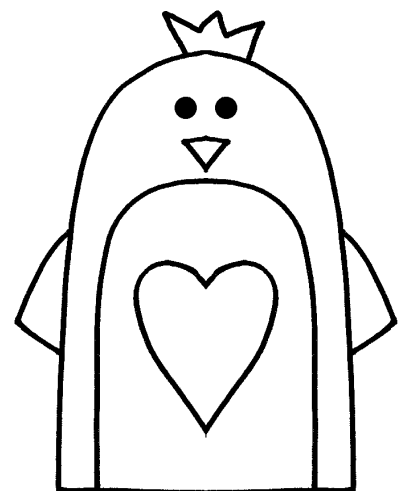




You can use me to make a shaped card matching the dashed line to the fold on your card and drawing around then sticking another whole shape over the top and decorating.



Mini versions to make embellishments



Print off the template sheet. Decide which template you would like to use. The smaller ones you can use on a card or décor like bellow the smallest size has been used to make a place setting for Easter breakfast or lunch.

To use any of the templates first cut a template out and draw around it on to a piece of plain card. Cut out the shape. Take your template again and this time cut out the tummy of the birdie. Draw around that on to patterned paper and cut it out. Next cut the heart shape out of the template and draw around that on another piece of patterned paper and cut it out. Glue the heart shape to the tummy shape and then glue the tummy to your card shape so your birdie looks the same as the template picture. Colour in the beak and the spiky bit at the top and draw on the eyes and around the edges in black to highlight them. Glue your finished embellishment to your choice of card or other item.

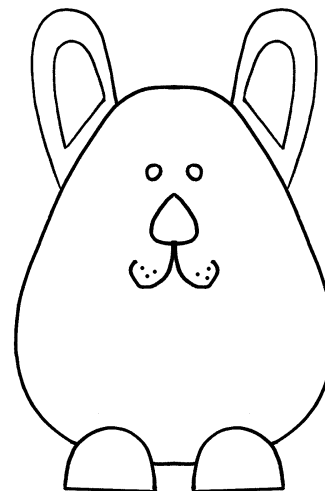
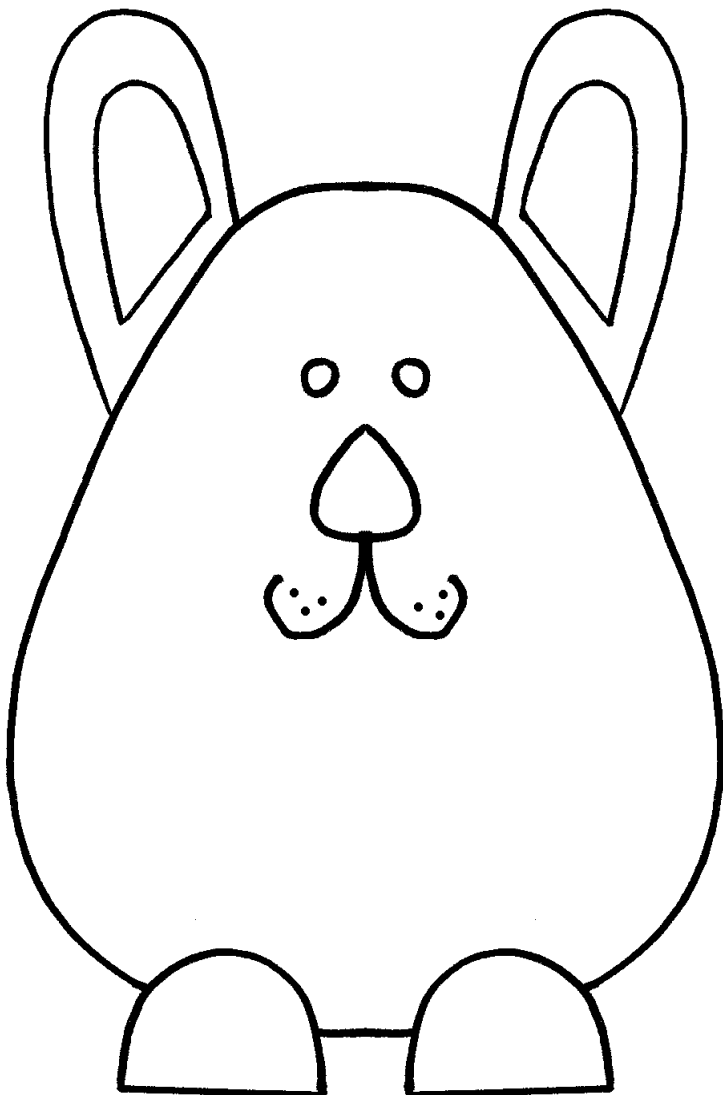
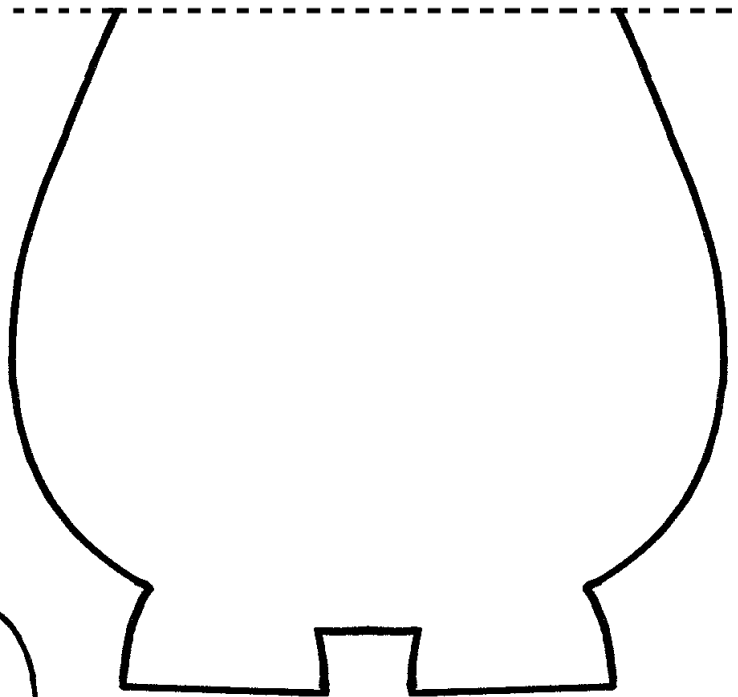
You can use the largest template on the sheet to make a shaped card. Make a base card first using the template placed on a folded piece of card with the dashed line matching up to the fold. Draw around the shape and keeping the card folded cut it out. Decorate the front of the card in the same way as described above.

This is the shaped base card template, place the template on your card matching up the dashed line to the fold, draw around and cut out keeping the card folded to make the shaped base card



Mini version to make embellishments

Draw around this whole template shape onto another sheet of card, decorate it and then stick it over the top of your base card matching up the bottom edges to complete your shaped card.

Print off the template sheet. There are two different versions you can make a shaped card or a mini embellishment. To use the embellishment template cut it from the template sheet and draw around it on to plain card. Cut out the egg shaped body from the template and draw around it on to patterned paper cut it out then glue it to your embellishment. Draw on the other features to finish.

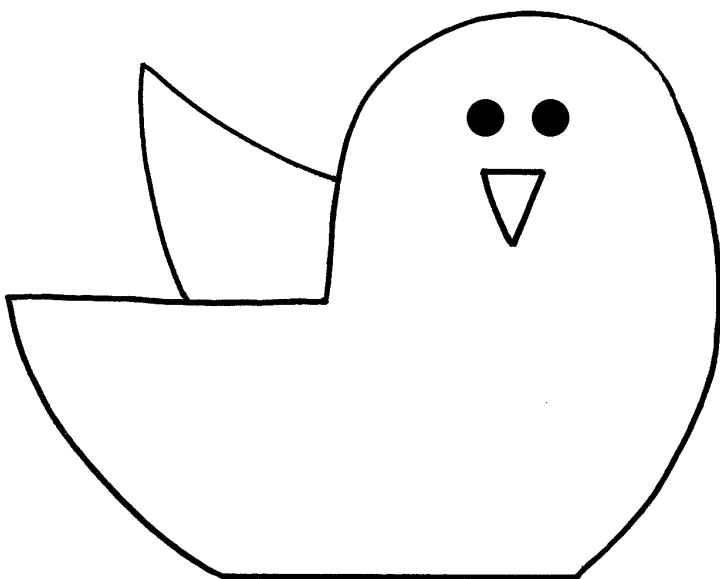
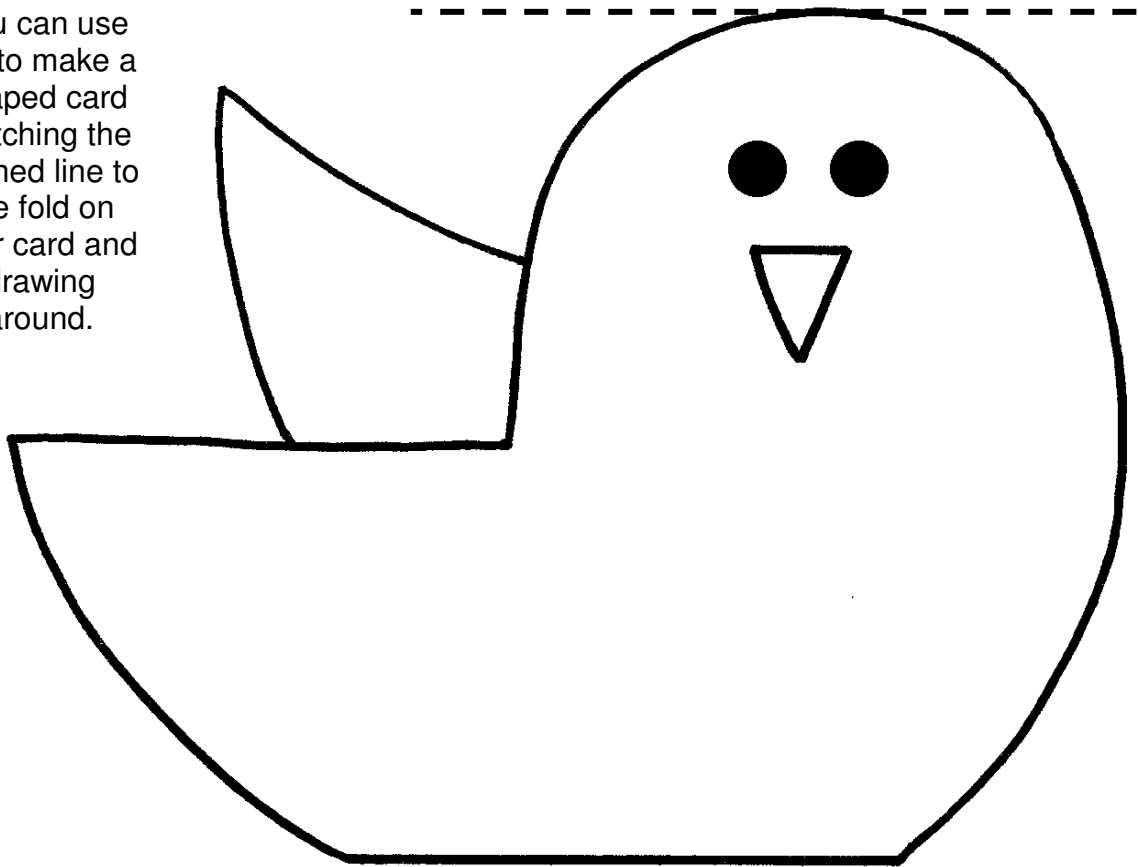
To make the shaped card cut out the shaped base card template from the sheet and the whole large bunny template. Fold a piece of A4 (letter size) card in half. Place the shaped base card template on your folded card so the dashed line matches up to the fold on the card and draw around it. Keeping the card folded cut out the shape. You now have your shaped base card. To decorate take the whole bunny template and draw around it on to the same card you've used for your base card, there should be enough left over. Cut out the shape and glue it to your base card so the bottom edges match up. Next take the template and cut out the egg body shape from the template. Draw around it on to patterned paper and cut it out then glue it to your card. Do the same with the nose, ears and feet. Draw on the features and add a message to finish.

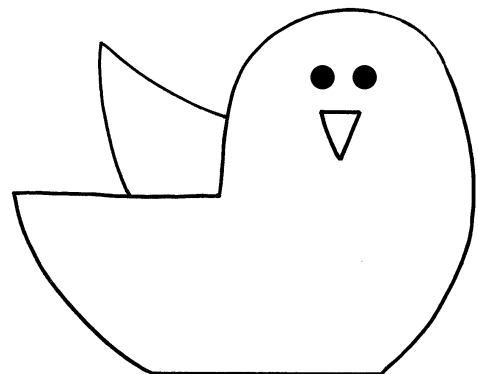

Mini versions to make embellishments



Print off the template sheet. On the sheet there are different sizes to choose from. If you would like to make the shaped card cut out the largest of the templates. Take a piece of card and fold it in half, it needs to be large enough to fit your template on. Place the template on the folded card so the dashed line matches up to the fold on the card. Draw around the template and then keeping the card folded cut out the shape to create your shaped base card.

Next take the template and draw around it on to a piece of patterned paper. Cut out the shape and glue it to the front of your shaped card. Take the template again and this time cut away the top wing so you just have the body shape then draw around this again on to some patterned paper. Cut it out and then attach it to your card. Cut out the beak from some yellow card and attach it to your card. To finish draw on the eyes and around the edges. If you want to add further embellishments you can.

These would make great clue cards for an Easter egg hunt!

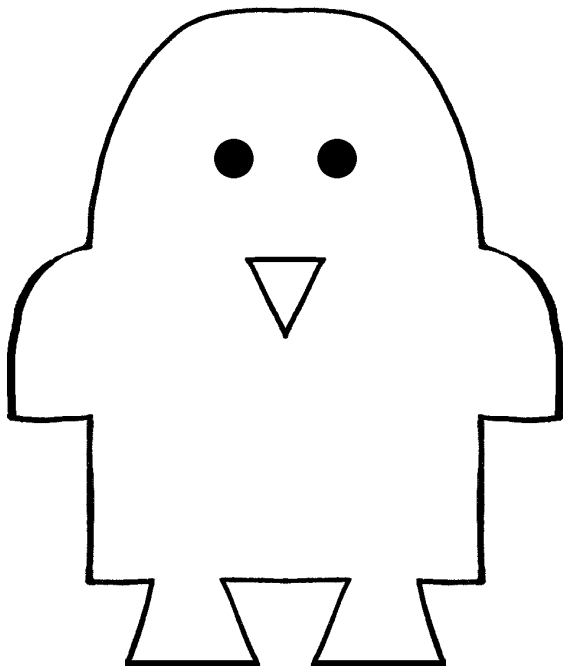
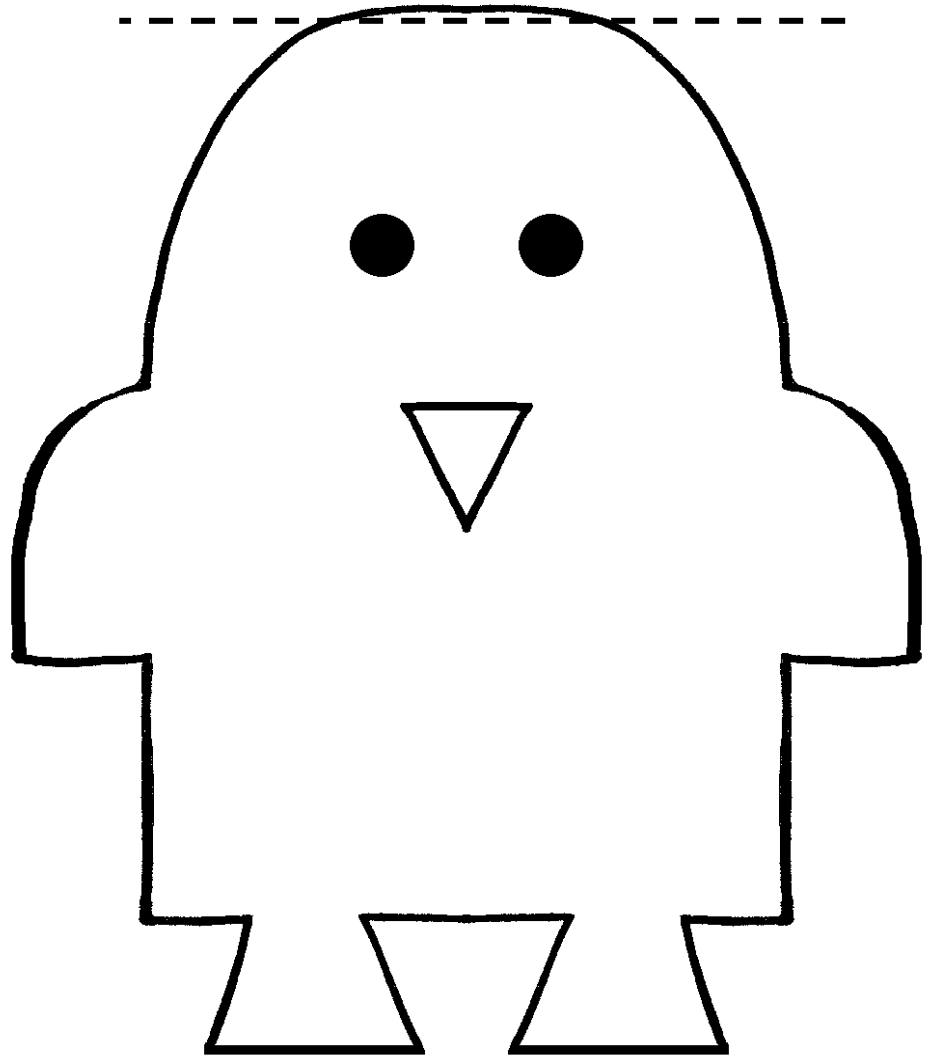

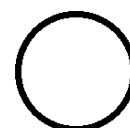
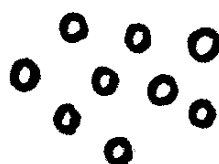
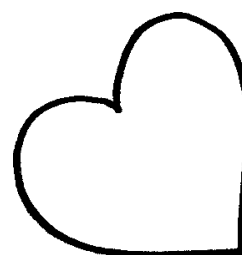




Large Flower-

Smaller version

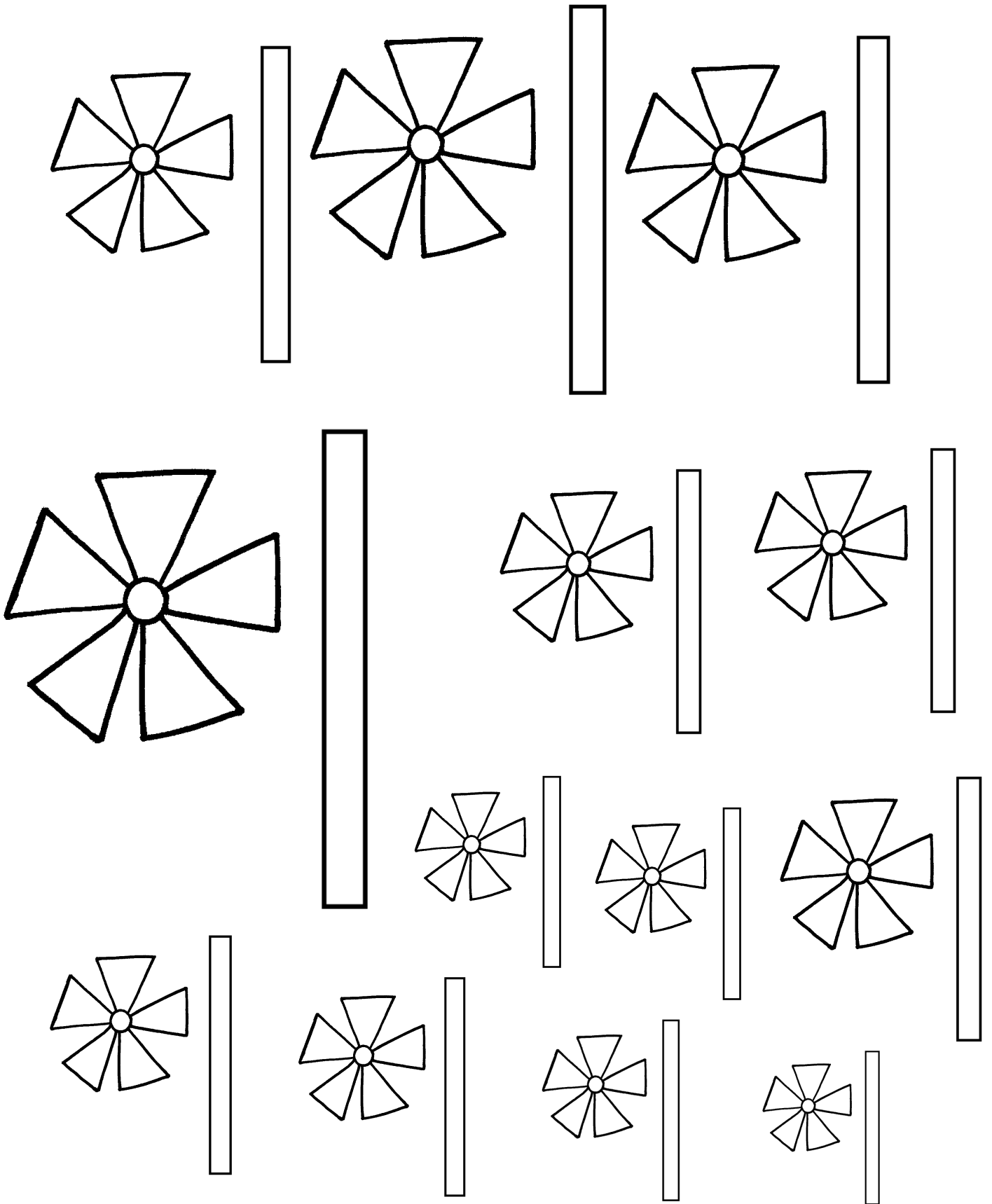


Print off the template sheet. On the sheet there's a large flower and a smaller one so first choose which you would like to use, (or you can make both sizes). Cut out the largest layer first and draw around it on to patterned paper then cut it out. Next cut out the heart shaped petal from the sheet. Draw around that four times on to patterned paper. Add glue to the end of each petal and glue them to the first piece you cut out. Curl up the edges to give them shape and definition. You can make them just like that or you can keep adding layer if you want to make a fuller flower. When you have finished layering cut out the circle from the template sheet and draw around that onto a piece of card. Cut it out and then glue it to the middle of your flower. Finish adding some dots to the centre, you can use the ones on the template sheet, or draw them on or use dots of glitter glue or even beads. When you have finished your flower embellishment attach it to your project. You can make a card as shown bellow or you can make a bouquet or add it to a gift box or wrapped present. Try using other materials to make your flower with such as crepe paper or fabric.

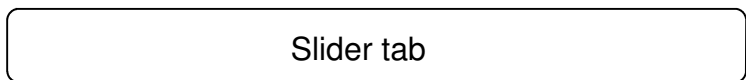
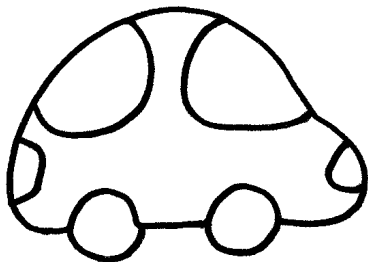
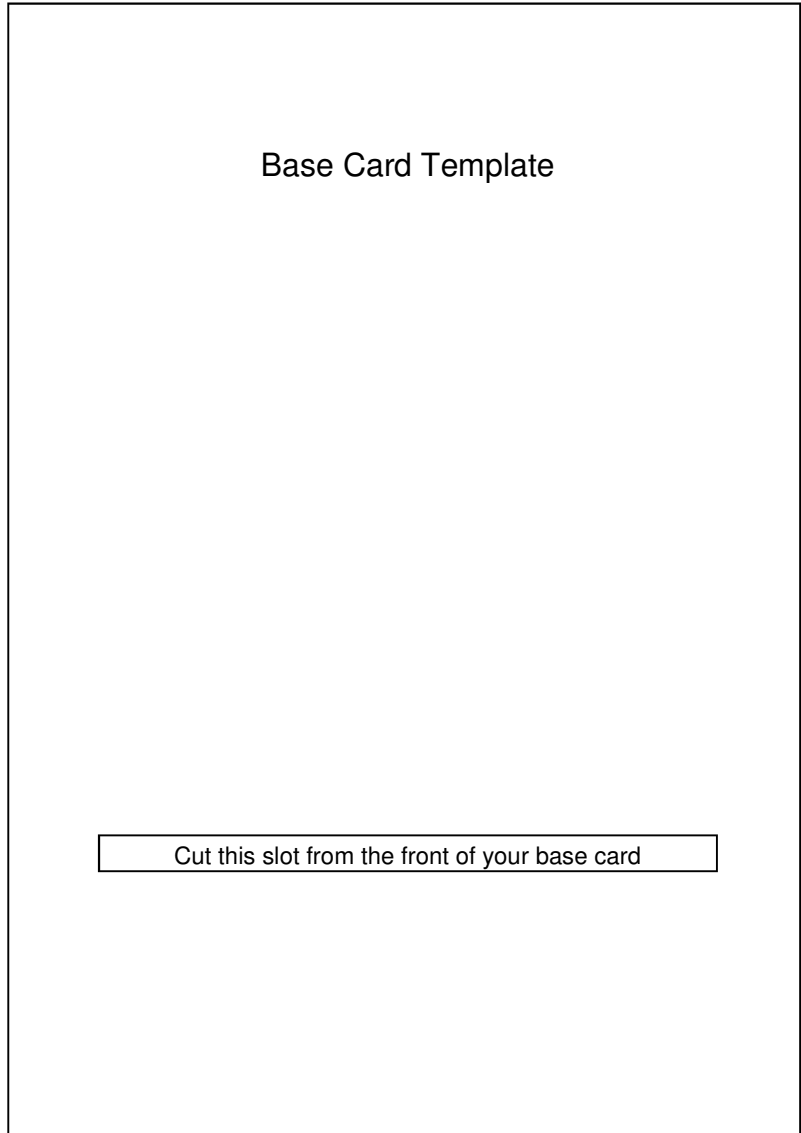
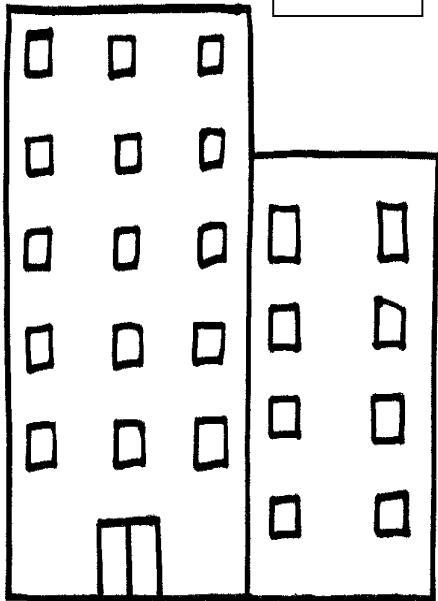
Print off the template sheet. On this sheet there are lots of different sizes of flower so pick out the sizes you would like to use and roughly cut around them. You can use lots of little ones or all large ones, whatever you would like to use on your card.

When you have chosen the flowers you would like to use cut them out along the lines neatly. Because some of these shapes can be quite delicate the easiest way of using them is to glue them to the back of the patterned paper you want to use and then cut around them and turn them over. You can also though draw around them as usual and cut them out. Choose a different pattern or colour for the flower head and stalk. To assemble the flowers add the stalks to your card first and then glue the flower heads on top. Doodle around the edges or ink around them if you want to highlight them. You can add a button or a brad to the centre of the flower heads to give them a different look.

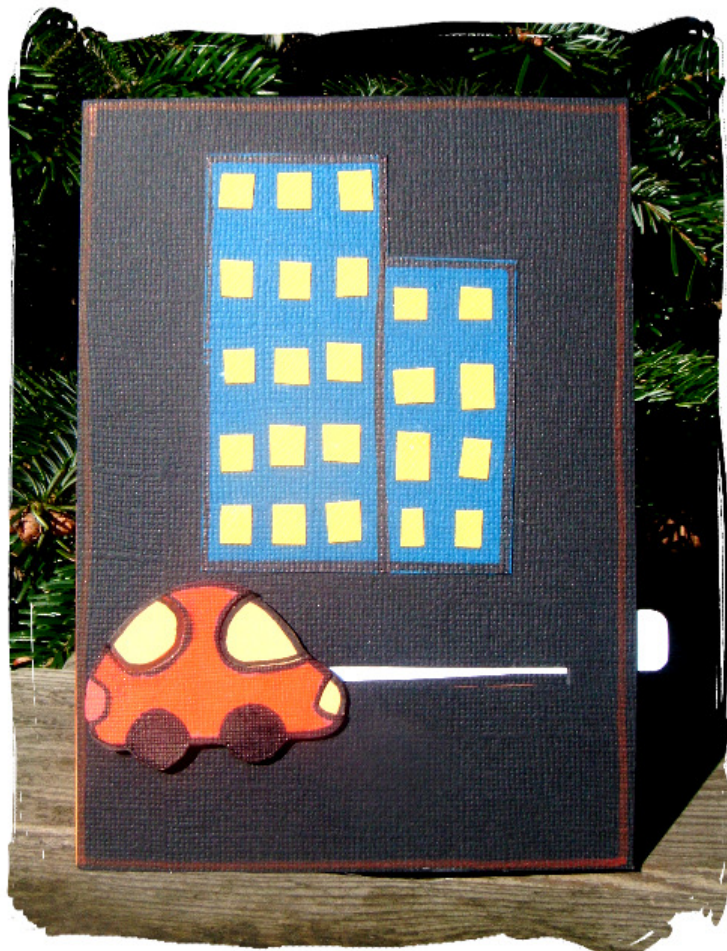
Print off the template sheet. Cut out the Base card template. Fold a piece of A4, (letter size) card in half and place the base card template on it matching the top of the template to the fold on your card. Draw around the shape and cut it out. Take the base card template and cut out the slot from the front, you'll need to cut into it so you cut it from the middle. Open up your card and place the base card template over the front. Draw through the window of the slot on to the front of your card, take the template away and then cut the slot from the front of your card.

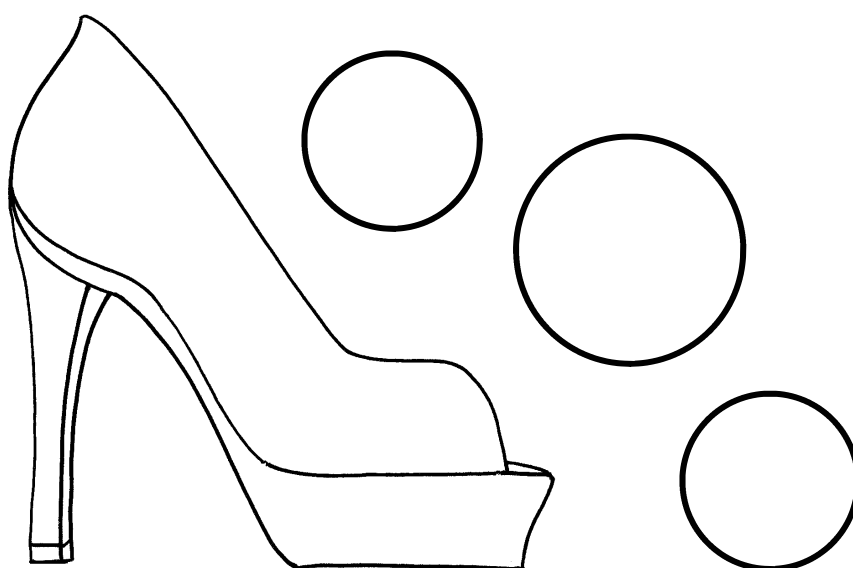
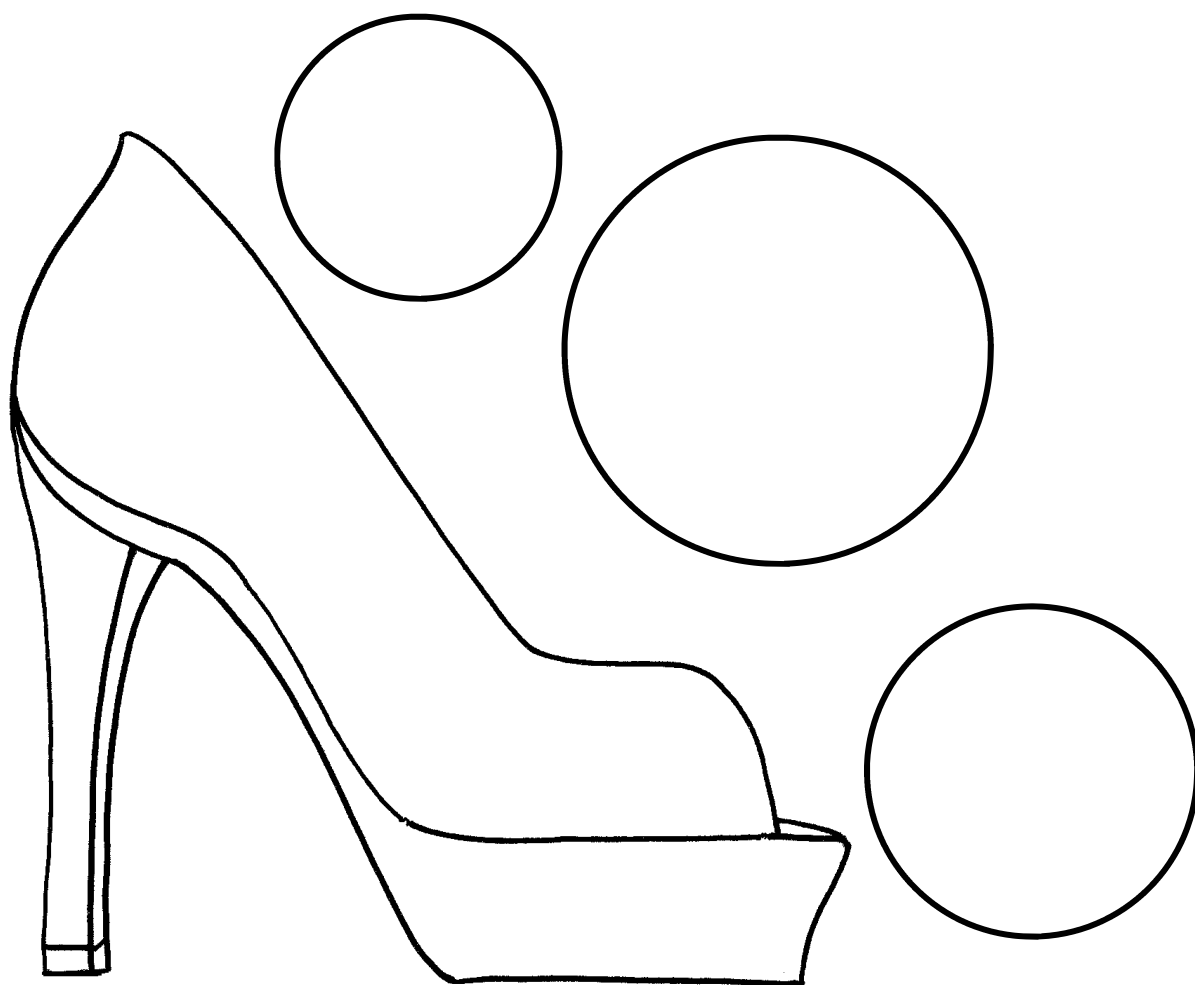
Next cut out the piece marked back panel from the template sheet, draw around this onto a piece of card the same you've used for your base card. Cut out this shape and apply glue to the top, bottom and left edge, make sure you keep the glue right on the edge. Glue it over the top of your slot on the back of your card. Next cut out the building and the car shape from the template sheet. Draw around them on to plain card and decorate them. Glue the building to your card so it's above the slot. Cut out the slider tab from the template sheet and draw around it on to white card then cut it out. Slide the slider tab behind the slot on the front of your card, it should fit in nicely in the pocket you've made. The end will stick out of your card this is so it can be pulled. Take the card embellishment and a foam pad and put the foam pad on the slider tab on the left side while it's in position. Attach the car on top of the foam pad. Your car should now slide up and down the road when you pull the tab.

These interactive cards are great for kids.

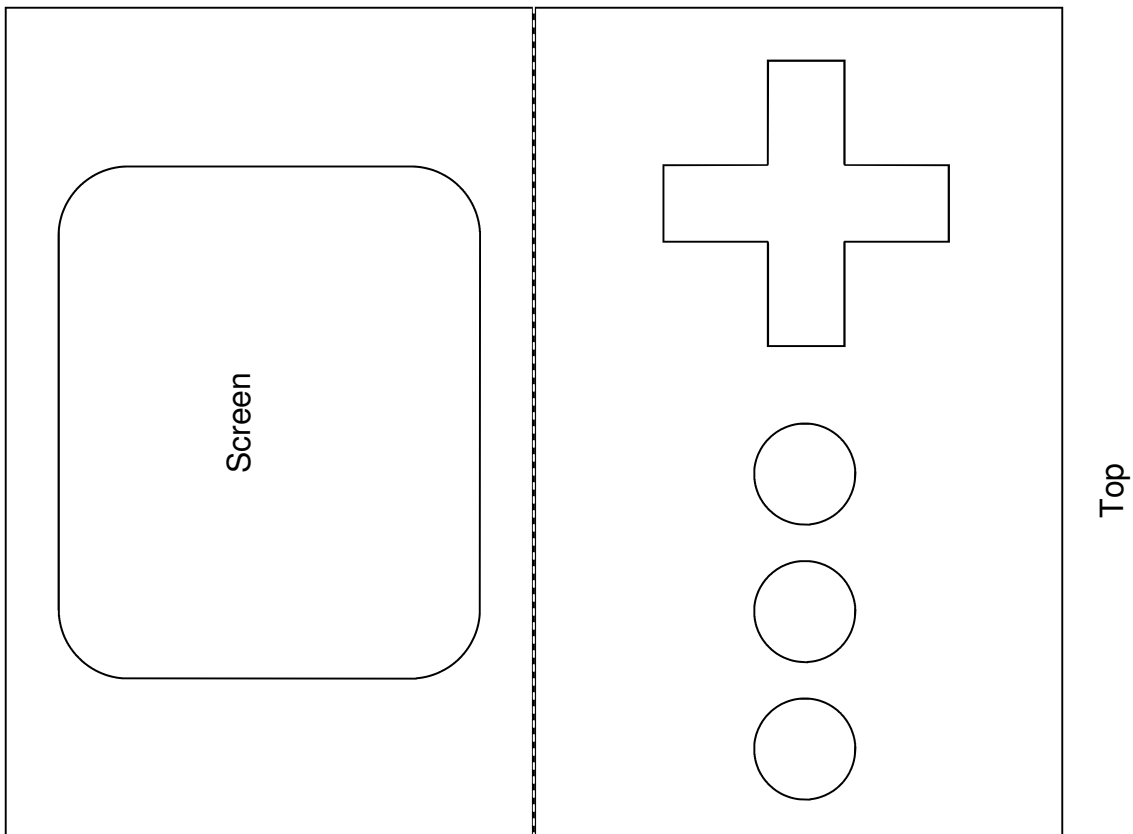
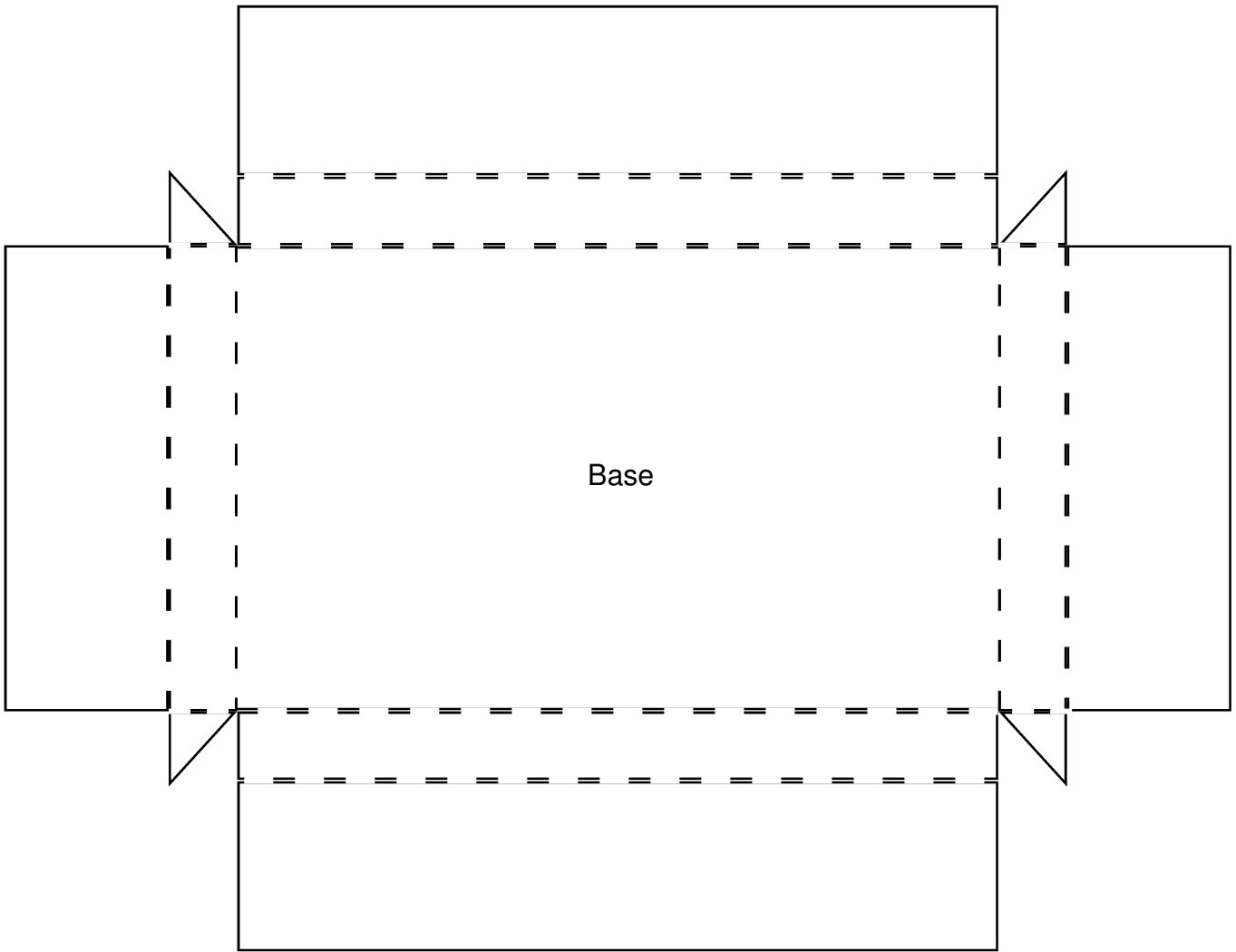
Smaller version

Print off the template sheet. Decide which size you would like to use - this may depend on the size of card blank you're using or you can make two embellishments one for your card and one for a matching gift tag. Both embellishments are made in the same way. Cut out the shoe shape and the three circles from the template sheet. Draw around the shoe shape on to plain card or patterned paper and cut it out. Next draw around the largest circle twice on to patterned paper and cut them out. Draw around the middle sized circle three times and the smallest circle three times on to different patterned or plain coloured papers. You should now have eight different circles of paper. Take one of the circles and cut a spiral shape in to it, if you struggle doing it free hand you can draw a spiral on as a guide first but once you get used to doing them it's very easy. Starting in the middle roll up the spiral so your paper rolls around itself add a dab of glue to the end of the spiral and holding it in your fingers let it go slightly loose then press the glued end to the underneath and hold it till it's stuck. Repeat this for all of your circles. To finish them off add a bead or a flat back pearl in the middle of each flower. Glue them to your shoe so it's almost covered but the end is not covered. Make a large ribbon bow and glue it to the end of the shoe. To finish add your embellishment to the front of your choice of card or tag.

Print off the template sheet. Cut out the base template, cut only along the solid lines and not the dashed lines. Place the base template on a piece of card and draw around it then cut it out. Score along all the lines as shown on the template then fold them up. You're aiming to be folding this shape in to a sort of box shape but the box won't quite have a top. Use the little triangle flaps to glue the sides together. The larger flaps around the edge fold right over, you can if you need to add a little glue to the large top flaps to secure it down. You end up with a box shape but it has a gap in the middle. Next cut out the top template from the sheet and draw around that on to a piece of the same card, this shape is just like a small card. Score along dashed line and fold it in half. Glue this piece on top of the box shape so the open edge is covered over and the top of the card opens out. Decorate the inside of your card using the details on the top template. Cut out the screen and the buttons and draw around them on to coloured card, cut them out and glue them to your card. You can add a message to your screen if you like. If you want to put your card in an envelope you could make a gusseted one but an easier way is just to tie the card together closed with a little bit of ribbon or threads and give it like that, it looks like a small gift box.. When the ribbon is removed the surprise is it's a games console on the inside!
