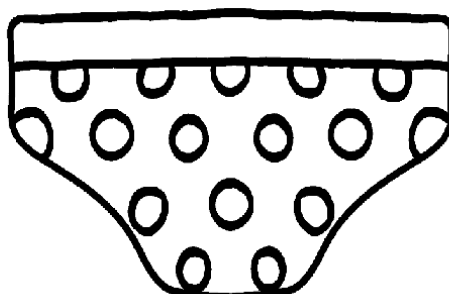
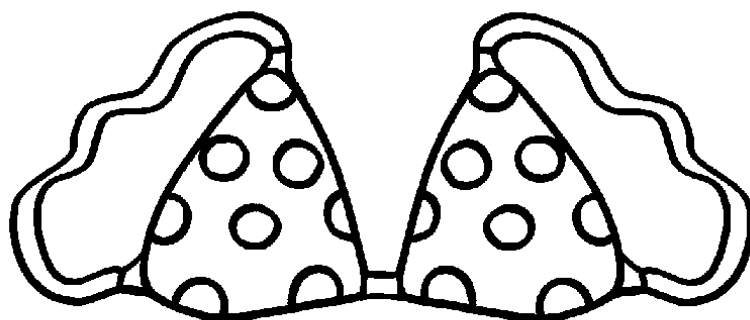
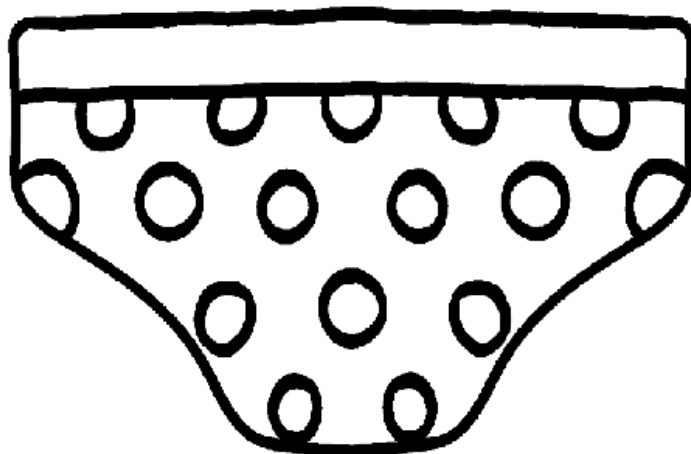
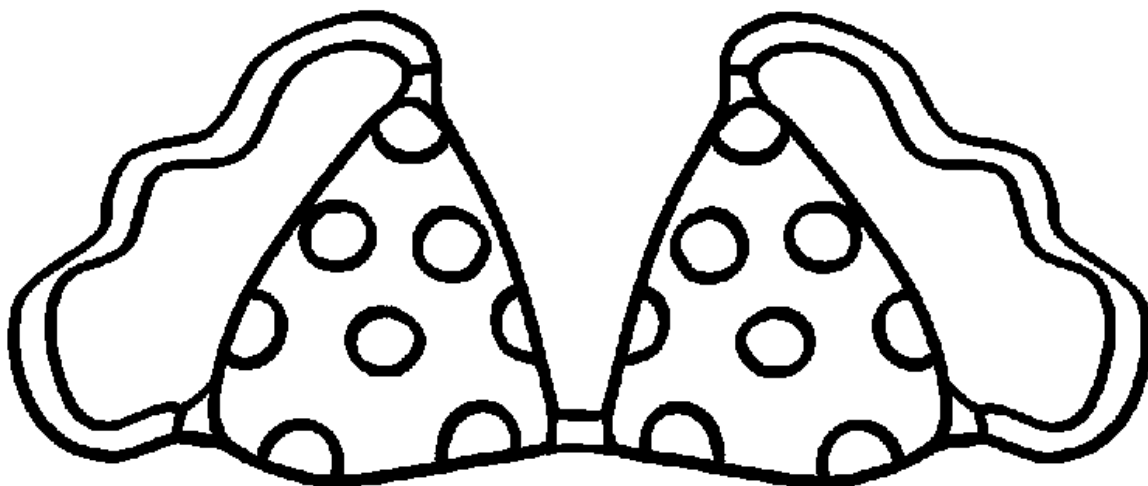
Footy Mad Card

Print out the first template sheet directly on to card and follow the instructions on that sheet to make up your base card. If you can't print onto card you can also use the card template on the second page to cut out and then draw around matching the dashed line on the template to the fold on your card. When you have your base card cover it with patterned paper and draw around the edges of each letter with black pen. The second template sheet has greetings and football shapes to use. The idea is you can make up different greetings adding a message in the blank space at the top and bottom of your card ie Happy birthday to my "Footy Mad" Brother! Use the football shapes in place of the o's. Again if you can't print onto card use stamps to make up your messages.

Bikini Card

So you can make this card a cute summer card or you might want to make something a bit more tongue in cheek cheeky! There are two sizes of template for you to cut out depending on the size of base card you want to use. I've used the smaller one in the sample bellow on a square card from the Crafty Goodies kit. The larger one will work to cover an A5 size card or larger.

So first decide on your size of card and cut out the corresponding size of bikini from the template sheet. Draw around the bikini on to coloured card and cut out. Add the polka dot detail with coloured pens or punched out circles of card. Draw around the edges of the shapes with black pen. Attach the bikini to your card and add a greeting of your choice.

Experiment with making up your bikini with different materials. How about pretty patterned fabrics or coloured craft foam?

Man Boots

Match the dashed line on the template to the fold on your card



Will make up a card that fits a standard 6x6 envelope

Man Boots Card

Print off the template sheet and cut out around the outside edge of the whole boots shape. Fold a piece of A4 card in half and place the template on the card matching up the folded edge to the dashed line on your template. Draw around the template shape and cut it out keeping the card folded to create your shaped base card. Cover your base card with coloured or patterned paper.

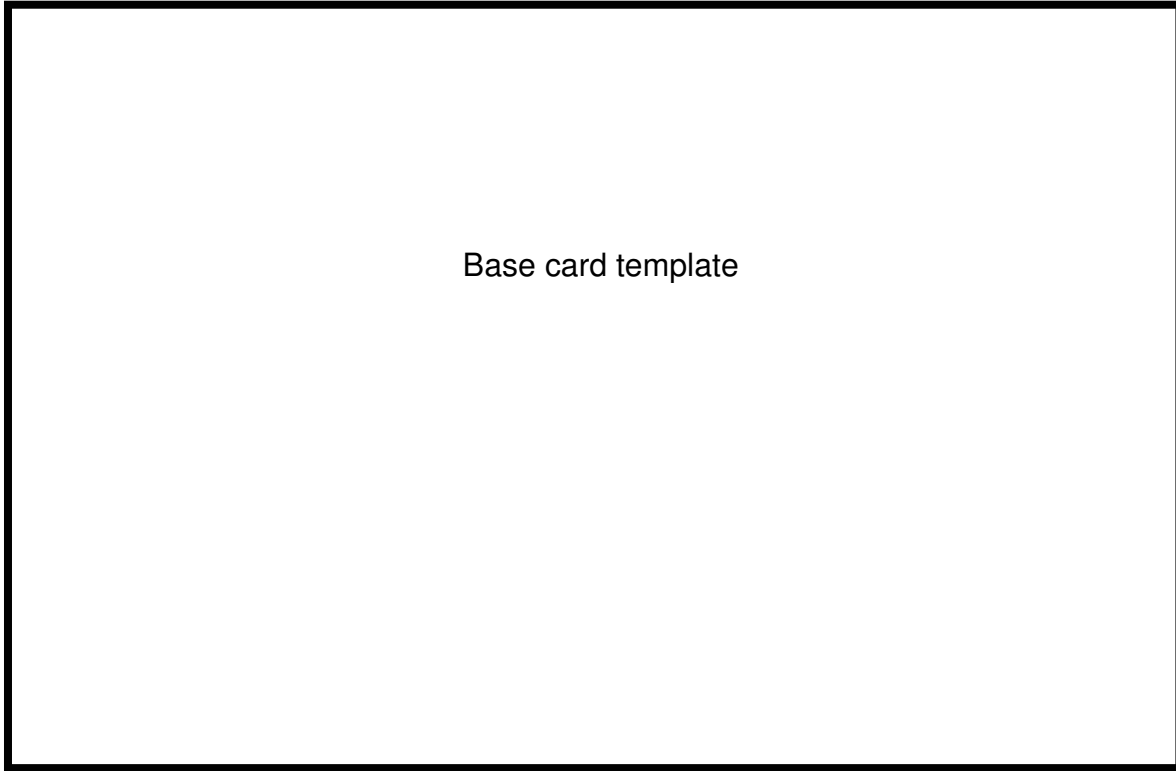
Take the template again and cut out the front parts (the bits with the lace holes in) from it. Draw around these onto different coloured card and cut out. Place the template back over each piece in turn and use a hole punch to punch through each hole. You can attach eyelets through the holes if you're going to add actual laces or attach brads through the holes or simple leave the holes as they are.

Doodle the stitching detail (or add real stitches) on to the pieces and then attach them to your base card. Draw on the rest of the card detail copying it from the template, you could colour in the base a different colour to the tops if you like.

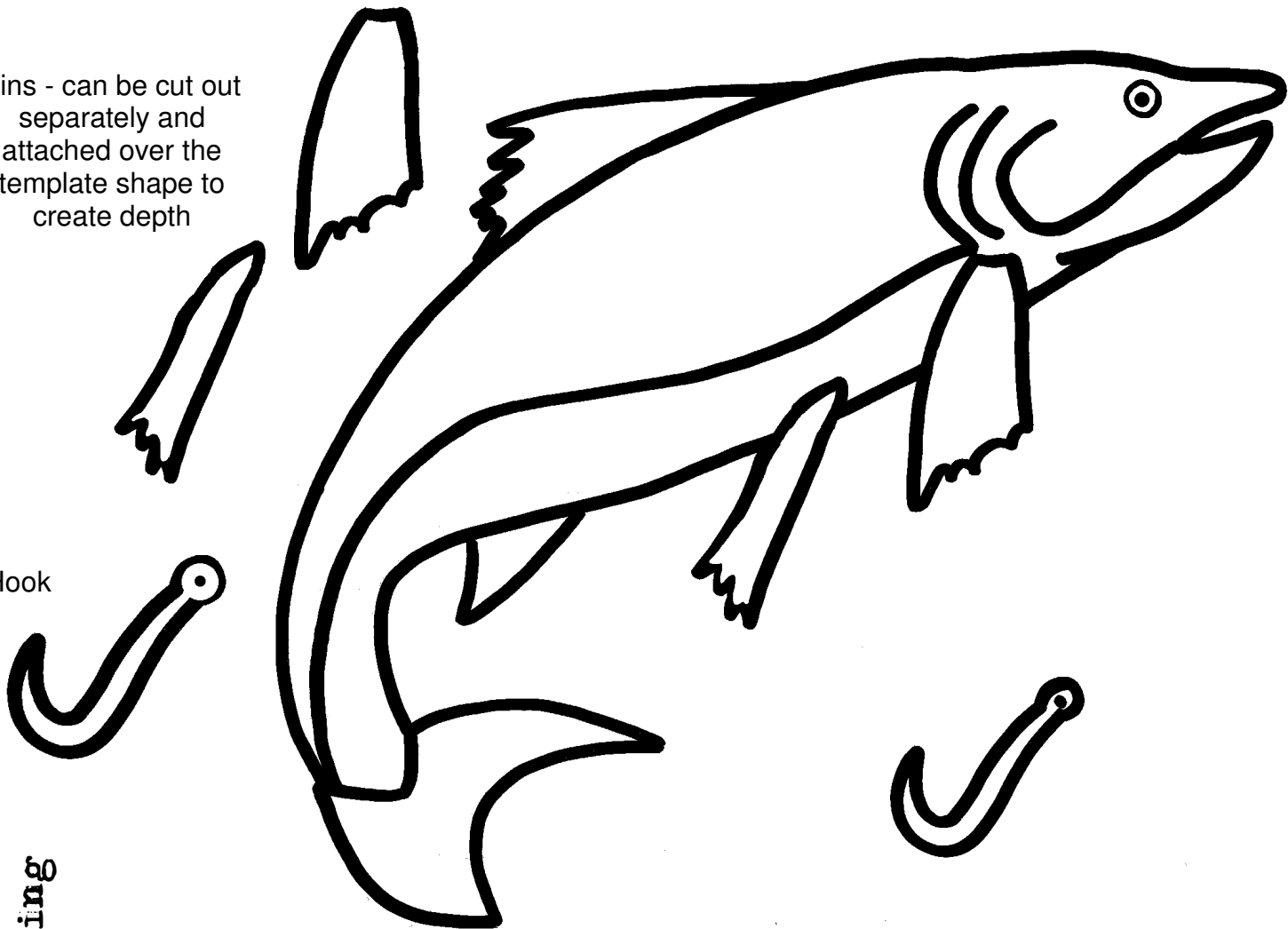

Fishing

Fishing Card

Print off the template sheet and cut out around the outside edge of the base card template. Place it on a sheet of folded A4 card so the top edge matches up to the fold on your card, draw around and cut it out.

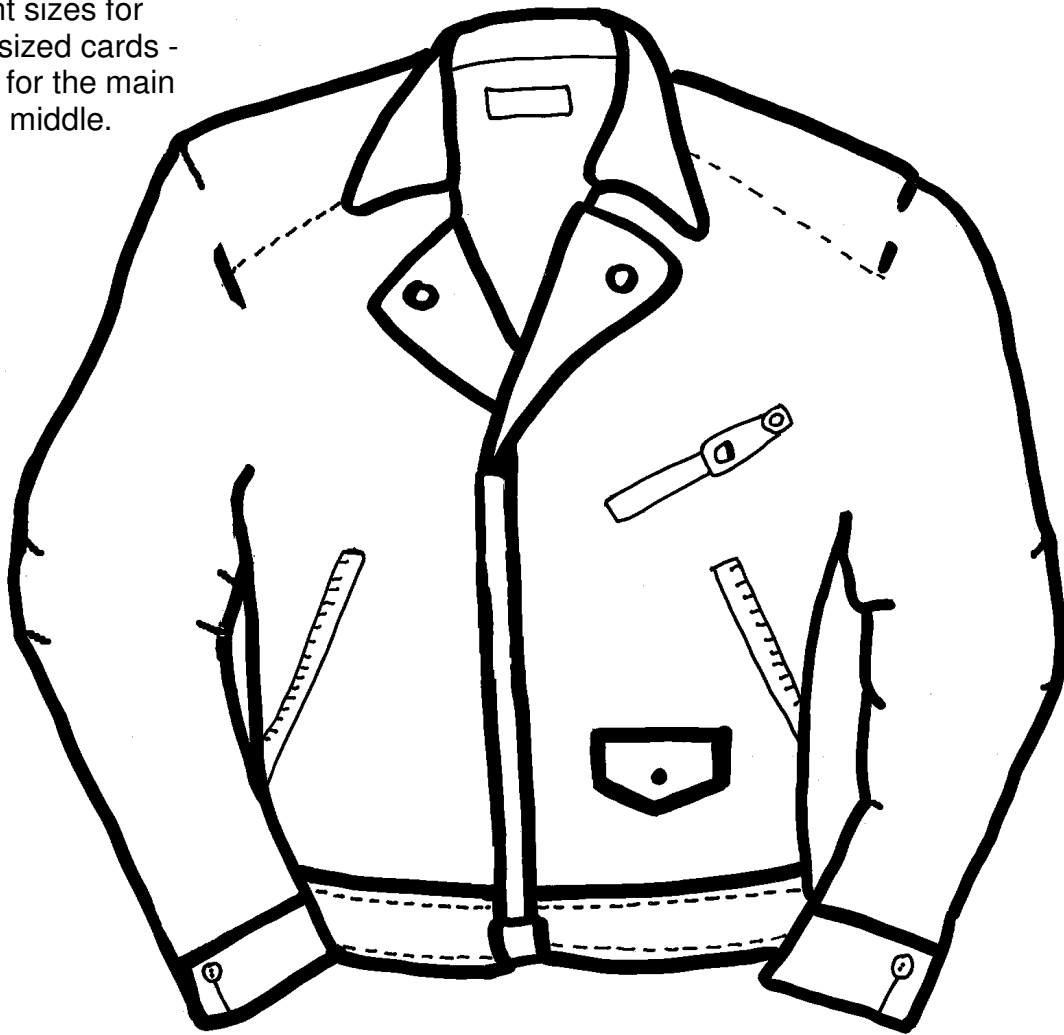
Next cut out the fish shape from the template sheet and draw around on to coloured card (you can make up a colour of fish you choose) then cut out. Cut out the separate fin shapes and draw around them on to more card in the same fish colour, curl them slightly with your fingers and then stick them to your fish shape. Apply glitter to the bottom half of the fish (use the line on the template as a guide) to give him the effect of being wet with the sun catching his underside. Draw on the rest of the detail with black pen. Next cut out the hook and draw around on to some silver card or paper. Punch a hole in the end and thread a length of string or wire through it. Decorate the front of your base card with some water effect (you could cut it from paper like the sample below - this paper is in the Crafty Goodies kit) or make a collage water effect with torn squares of blue paper and glitter. When you're happy with your watery background attach your fish to it so he's jumping from the top of the card. Pop the hook in his mouth and carry the thread or wire (whichever you used) to the back of the card and stick it down.

Leather Jacket

Leather jacket Card

This is another template sheet that gives you two different sizes of jacket embellishment to make up. Choose which size card you want to work with then choose the corresponding size of jacket. Cut the jacket out around the outside and draw around it on to leather embossed card. Cut out the shape. Draw or trace on the jacket details and cover in metallic or black pen. Use the zip shape on the template sheet to draw around and make up a zip embellishment as the main zip in the middle. You can cut the jacket up the centre and bent it outwards slightly to create an open jacket look, attach the zip at the bottom if you're doing this. Or you can keep it together and attach the zip at the top. Use other embellishments like mini brads to add more details. When you're happy with your jacket embellishment attach it to your card along with your greeting to finish.

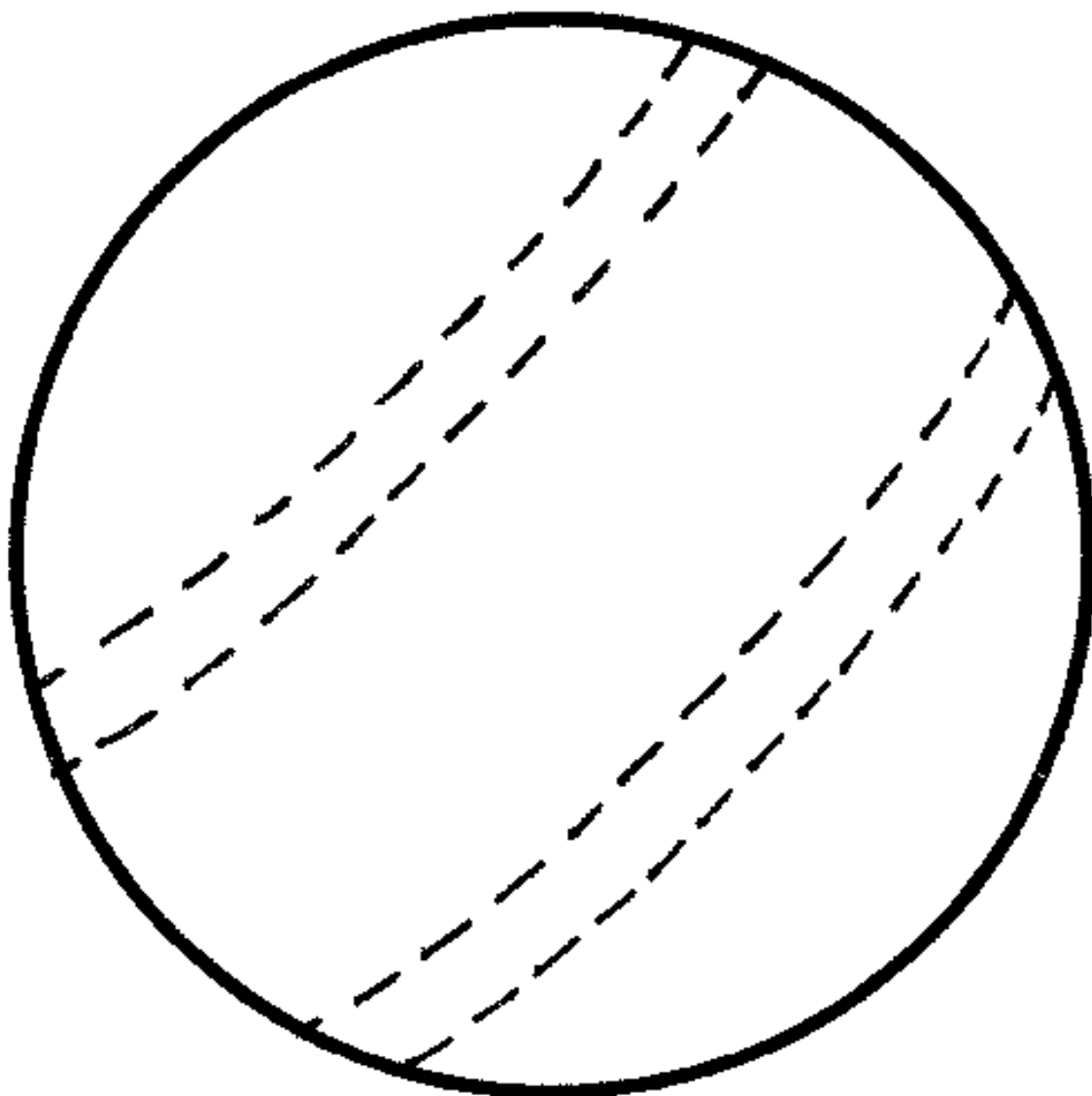

This is the base card to make all the sports ball shaped cards. Fold a piece of A4 card in half and place the template on it matching up the dashed line on the template to the fold on your card. Draw around the shape and cut out keeping the card folded to create your shaped card. Use any of the ball template shapes over the top of the base card to finish your card.

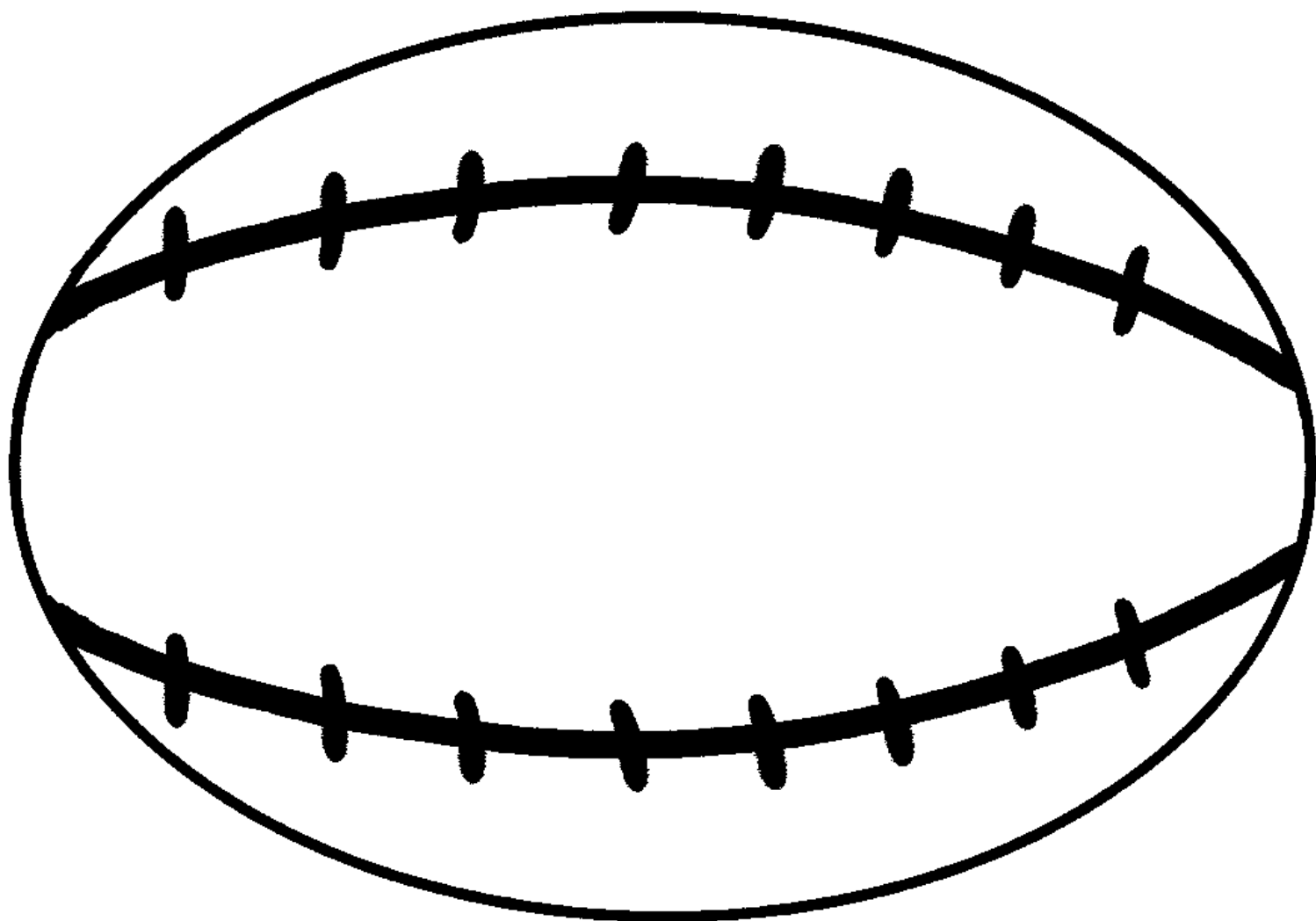




Ball Shaped Cards - Cricket ball

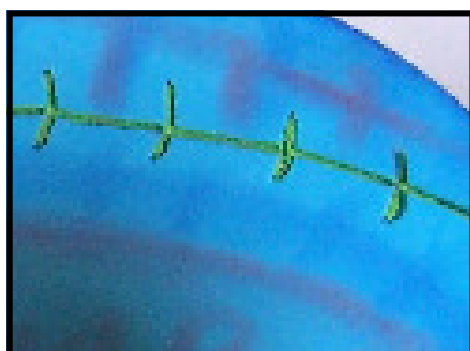
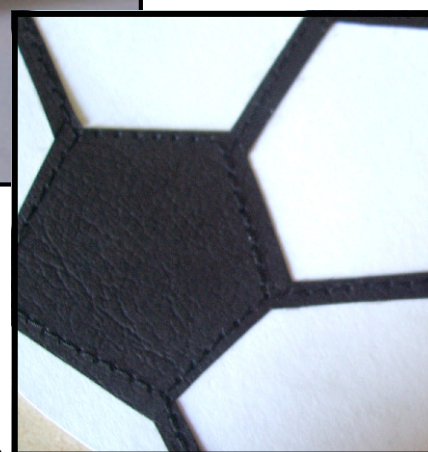
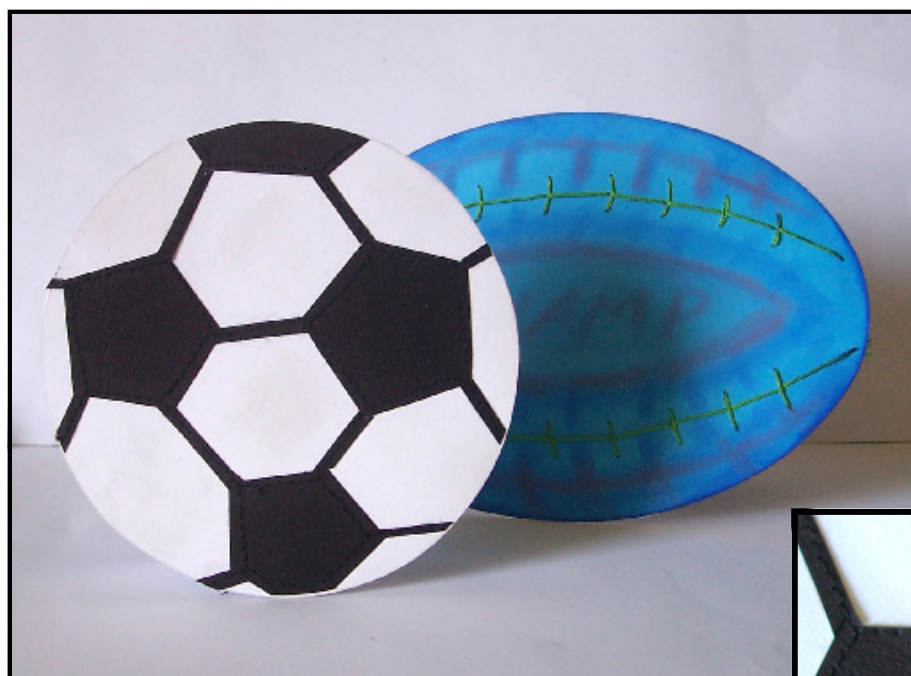
Ball Shaped Cards - Rugby ball

Ball Shaped Cards

Decide which of the ball shapes you want to make and print off the shaped base card template plus whichever ball you chose. Make up the base template first following the instructions on the sheet.

Cut out your chosen ball shape from the template sheet, cutting around the edge to start with. Draw around the outside edge onto your choice of coloured card then cut it out. With the rugby ball and cricket ball you can simply transfer the stitching detail using actual stitching or using pens. With the football to re-create the design attach the template to a sheet of black card with temporary adhesive and cut out the black parts of the template. Reassemble the black pieces on your circle of card and stick down. You can then add stitching detail over the top of you like. Once you're happy with your decoration stick your ball to the front of your base card.

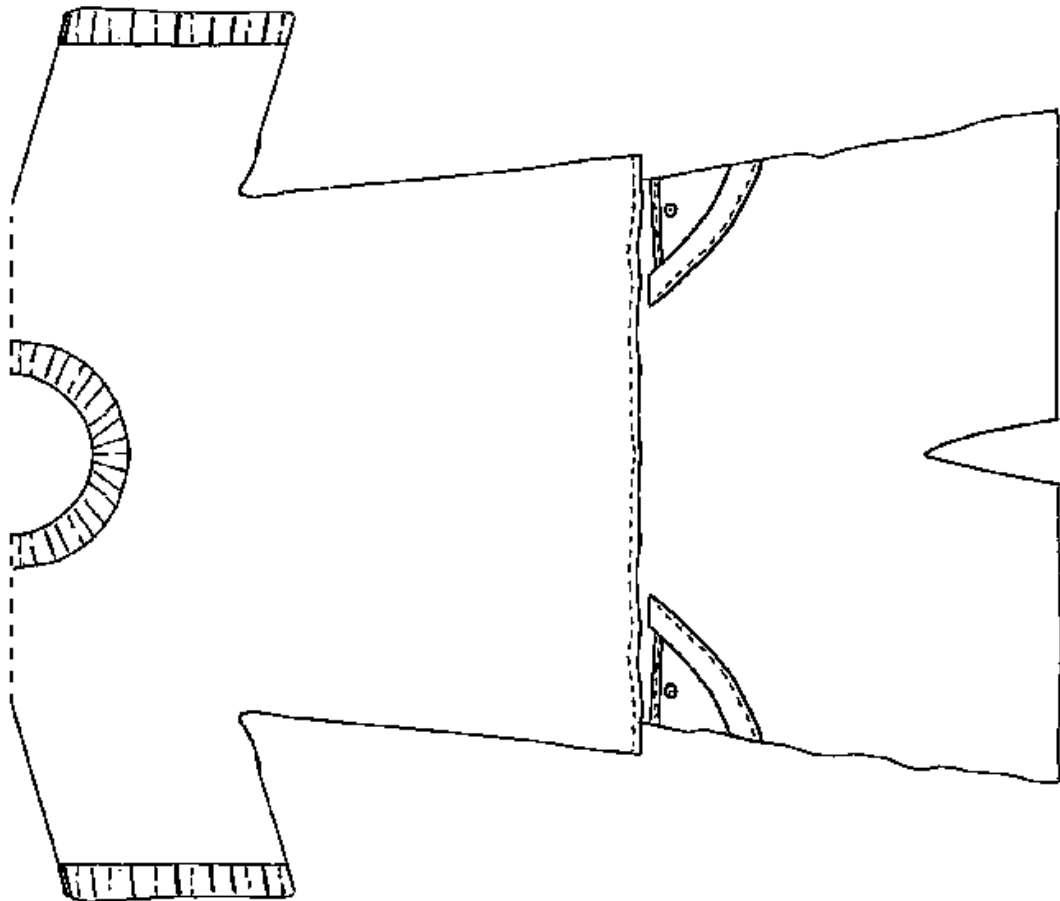
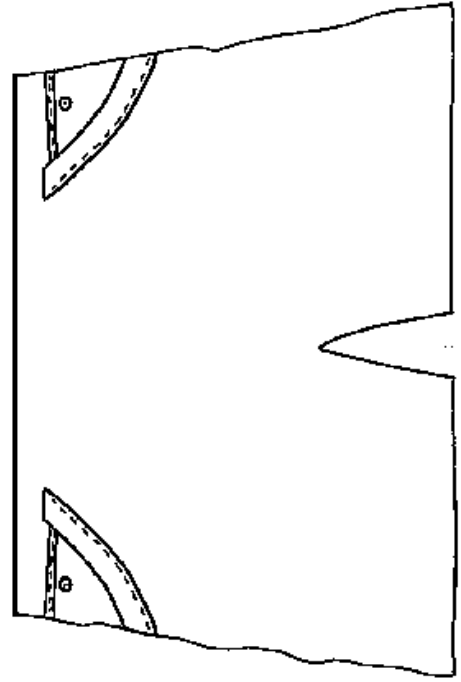
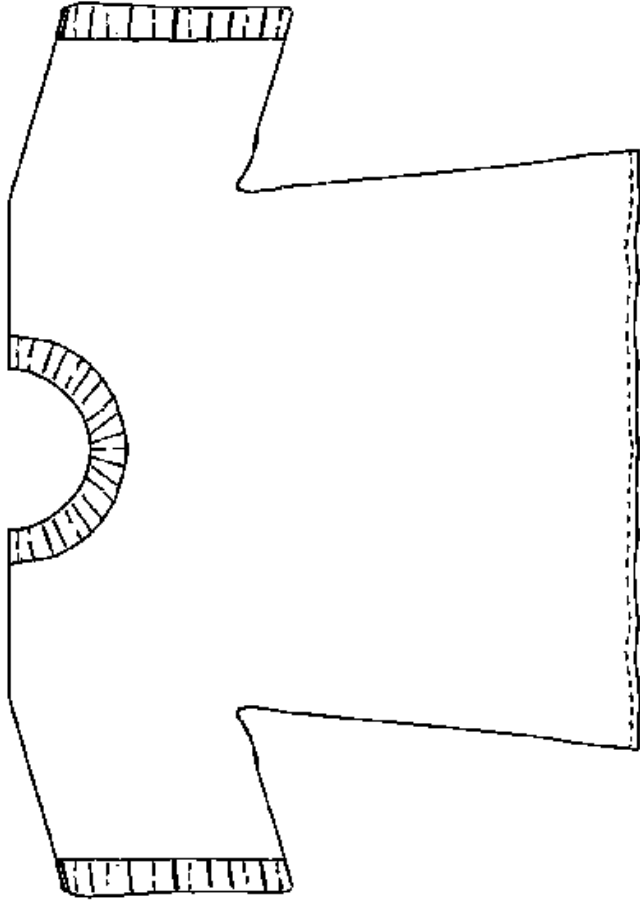

Shaped card template

Shorts & T-Shirt

T-Shirt and Shorts Shaped Card

Cut out the shaped base card template, cutting around the outside edge only. Fold a piece of A4 card in half and place the template on it matching the dashed line on the template to the fold on your card. Draw around the shape and cut out.

Next cut out the individual shorts and T-Shirt shapes and draw around those onto patterned paper or coloured card. Cut out the shapes. Stick down the shorts first on to your base card, matching up edges to get them in the correct place. Now attach the shirt to your base card. Finish off your card by copying the doodled effects along the arms and neck and the pocket detail on the shorts. Use a black pen to go around the edges of your card to finish.

You can use the separate shorts shirt template shapes to make card toppers as an alternative to a shaped card or to make embellishments for a scrapbook page.

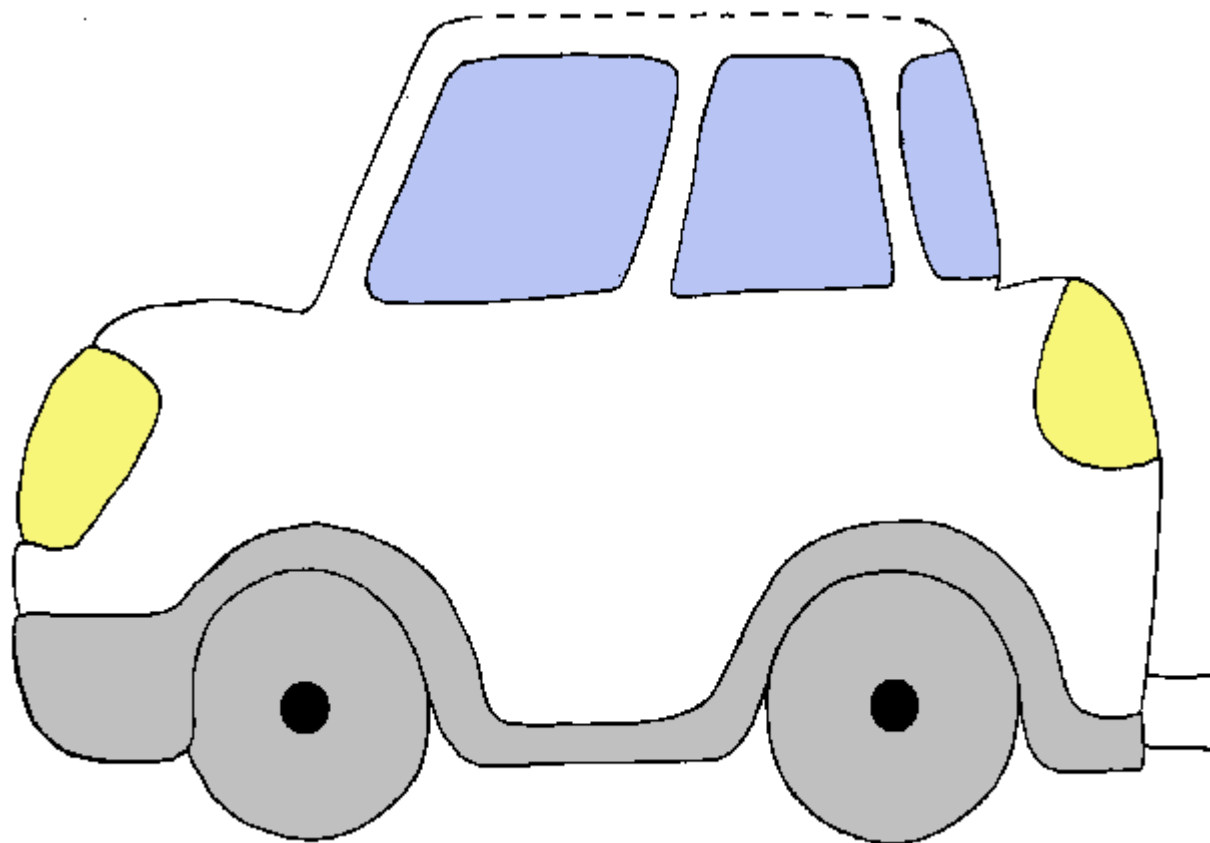

Kooky Car

Kooky Car Shaped Card

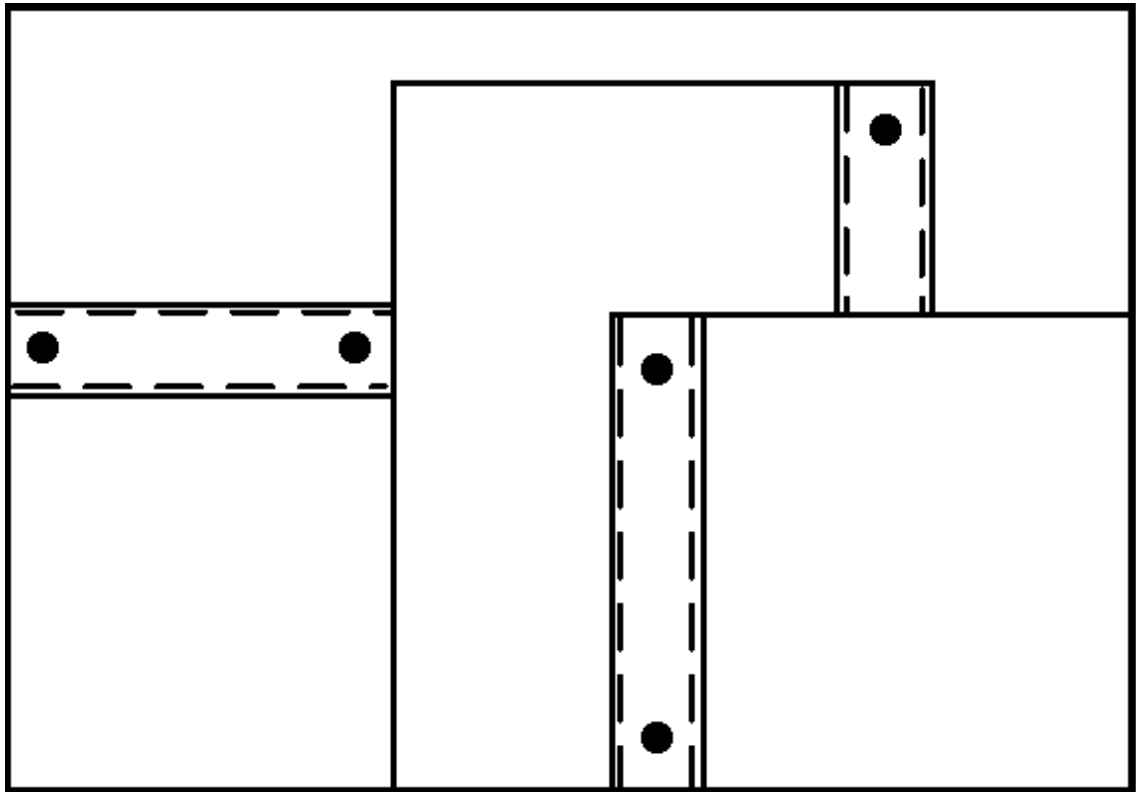
Cut out the Kooky Car template, cutting around the outside edge only. Fold a piece of A4 card in half and place the template on it matching the dashed line on the template to the fold on your card. Draw around the shape and cut out keeping the card folded to create your shaped base card.

Next take the template again and cut off the bottom part (the area shaded grey on the template). Draw around this piece of template on to black or dark grey card, cut it out and then attach it to your base card. Take the car template again and now cut away the lights and the inside of the windows, (the yellow and blue bits on the templates) making sure not to cut into the car shape. The easiest way to cut into the windows is to make a little hole in the middles and then cut into it with scissors. Now draw around the car body shape you should have left and cut it out, again cutting out the windows from the middle. Take your base card and attach some off cuts of yellow and orange card for the front and back lights (place them roughly in the area of the lights). Cut a blue strip of card to cover the top half of your base card. Trim off all the bits of card to your car shape. Place the car body piece (the one you cut out earlier) over your card and add some doodling detail around the edges and on the wheels then colour in the exhaust to finish.

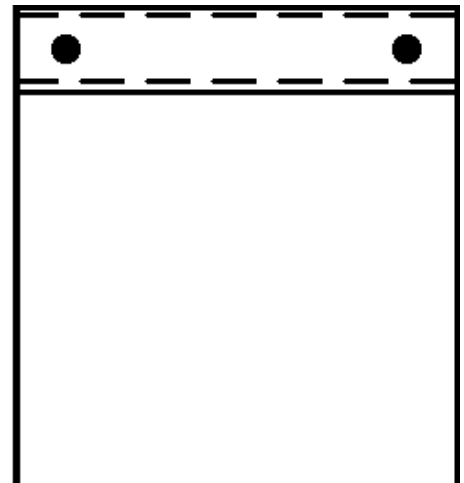
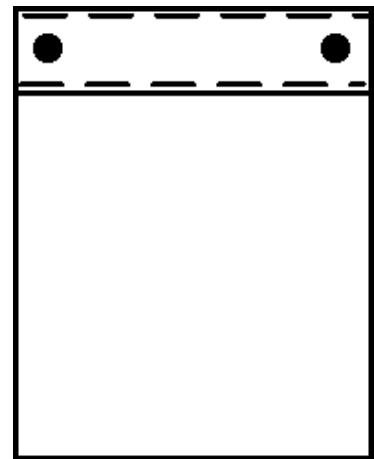
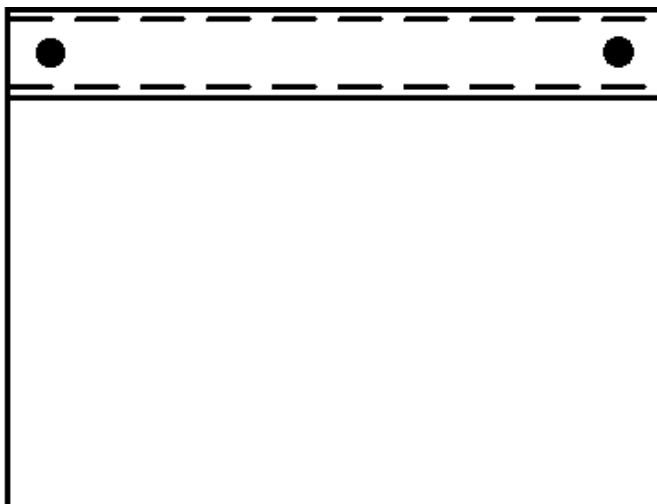

Pockets



Pocket Money Card

This is a really simple fun idea to make a card you can pop money in as a gift. Change up what patterned papers or colours you use to create a multitude of different looks.

You can use the card blank shape to create your base card or use another base card of your choice and add the pocket to it.

First print off the template then (if using) cut out the base card shape, cutting around the outside edge only. Fold a piece of A4 card in half and match up the left side of the template to the fold on your card. Draw around it and cut out. This makes a landscape A6 size card. Next cut the pockets from the template sheet and draw around each one on to a different patterned paper then make a strip to go along the top of each pocket mixing up the patterns you use (you can be also using different colours for your pockets rather than patterns). Attach the strips of card to your pocket shapes using eyelets or brads to add a decorative effect. Cover your base card with some coloured card for your background and assemble the pockets on the front of your card following the guide on the base card template. When you're happy stick them down, remembering to just add your adhesive along the left and right and bottom edge to create a pocket.
