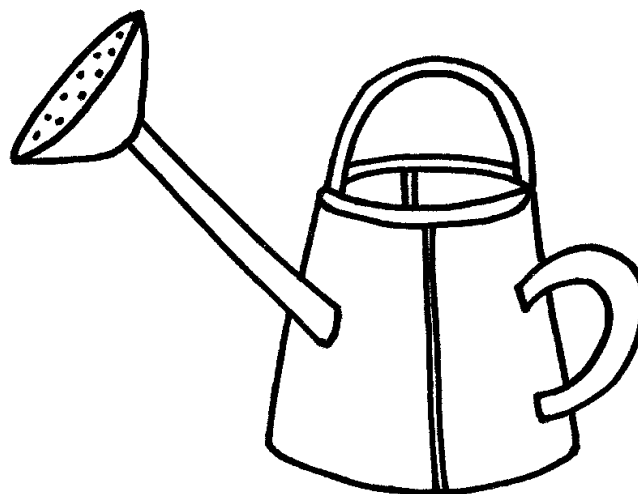


In two sizes for large and small cards or for landscape, (larger size) or portrait (smaller size) orientation on a standard A6 size card.



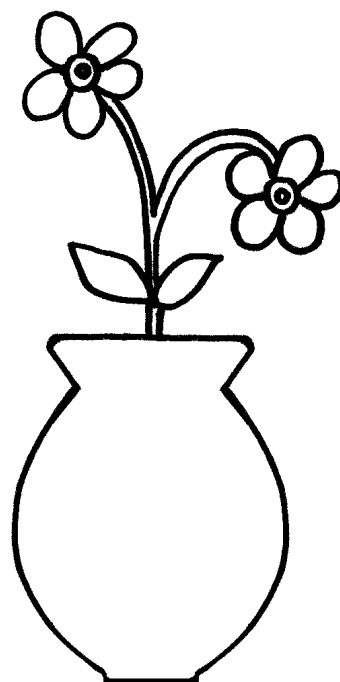
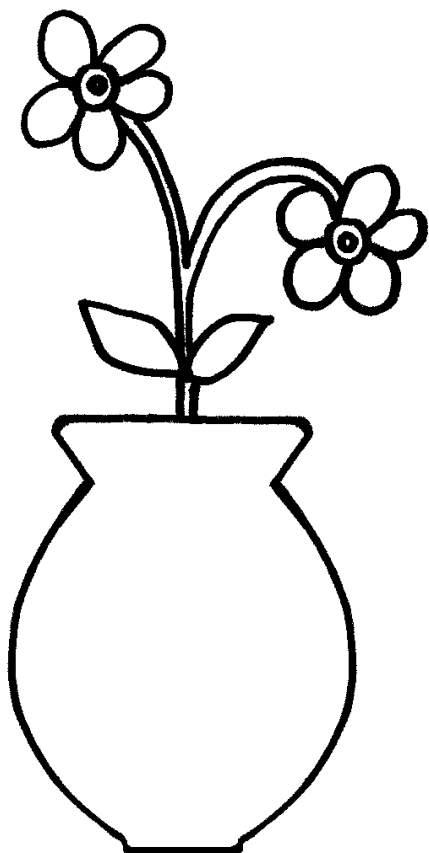
Print off the template sheet. Choose a size from the template sheet you would like to work with - this depends on the size of card blank you're working with or other project if you're not making a card. Cut out the size of template you want to use. Remember to cut out the bits inside the handles. Draw around the template onto a piece of patterned paper and cut it out. Draw on the detail from the template copying it from the template. Build up your card front with matts of patterned paper and add your embellishment on top. Add your choice of message to finish.

As an alternative you can print this sheet on to card and colour in then cut out the image directly or print the template sheet on to a piece of patterned paper and then cut it out. You can also use other materials like fabric or felt to make your embellishment with.

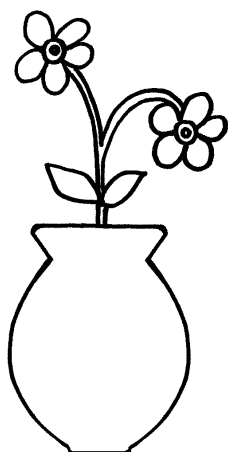
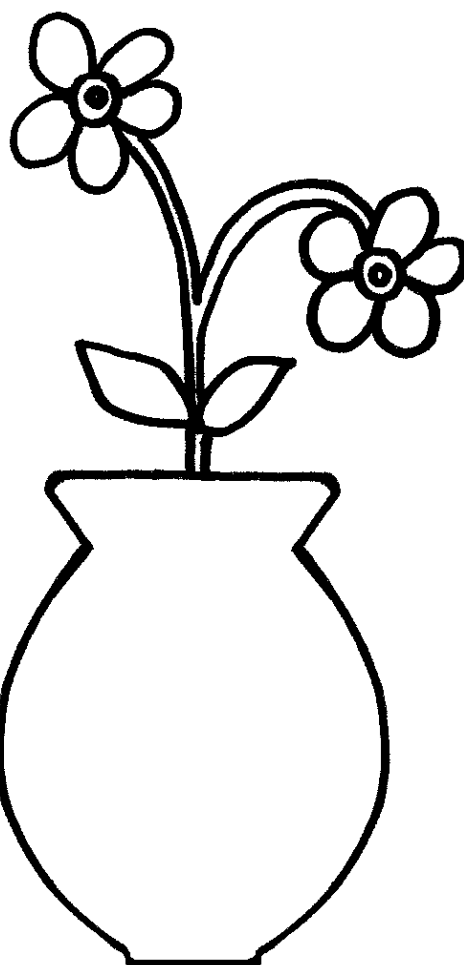

A selection of different sizes so you can choose one or two to fit your chosen size of card blank or tag.

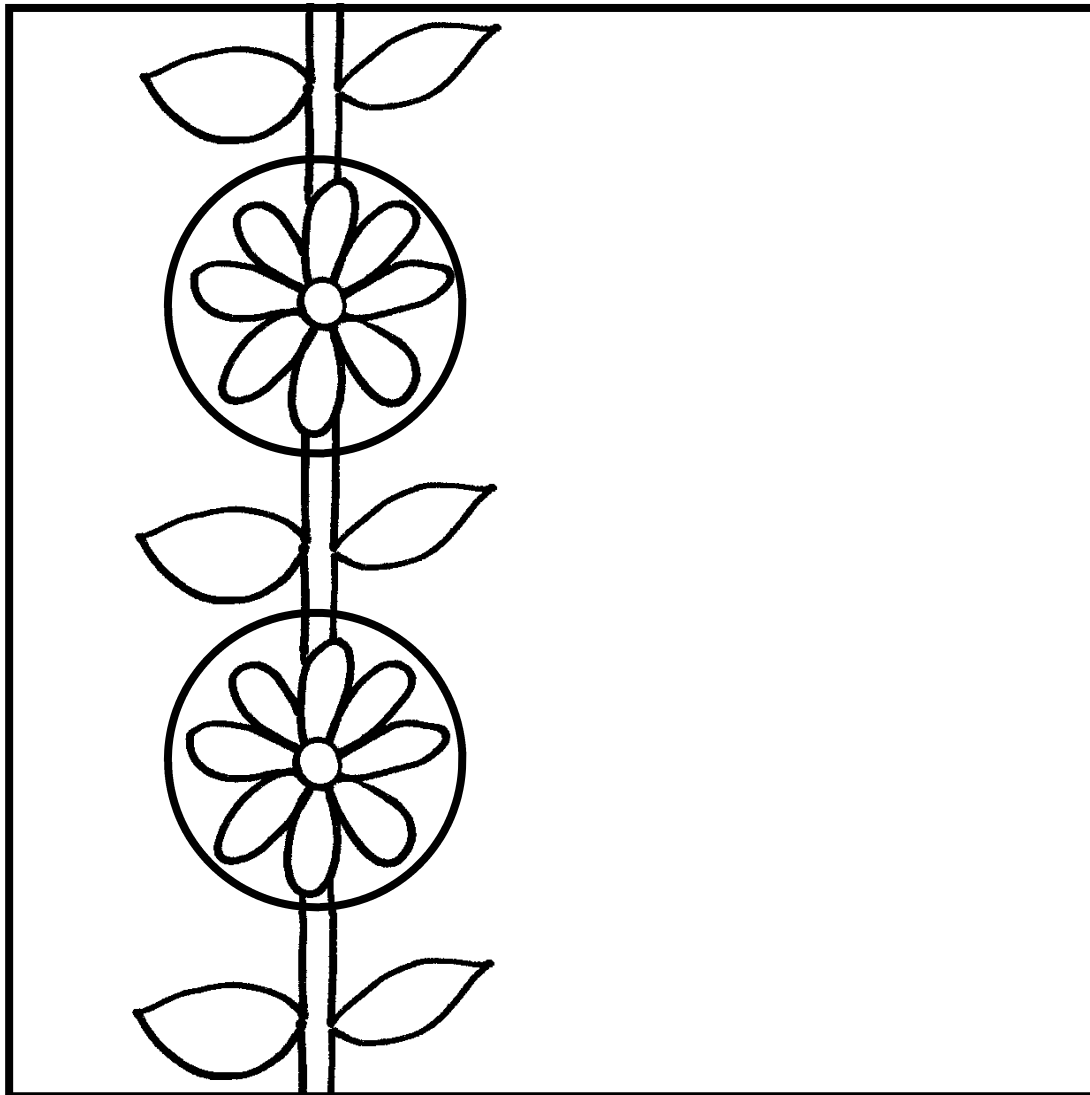


Print off the template sheet. On the sheet there is a selection of different sizes to use so first decide which you would like to work with. If you want to you can make a gift tag at the same time to match your card using two different sized templates. When you know what template you want to use, cut it out from the sheet. Place the template on a patterned paper or coloured paper you would like your flower stalks to be, so maybe green? Draw around the template and cut it out. Next cut off the 'vase' shape from the template piece and draw around that on to a different patterned paper to make your vase. Cut out your vase shape and stick it over the top of the other shape you cut out earlier. Finally cut out the flowers from the template piece and draw around each on onto another colour or patterned paper, you can make them the same or make each one different. Cut them out and stick them over the top of your flower shapes on your embellishment. To finish add something to the center of each of the flowers, a bead, sequin, dot of glitter glue etc. Attach your finished embellishment to your project.

Use to create a pattern cut from different patterned papers or fabrics that runs down the left edge of a square card blank.

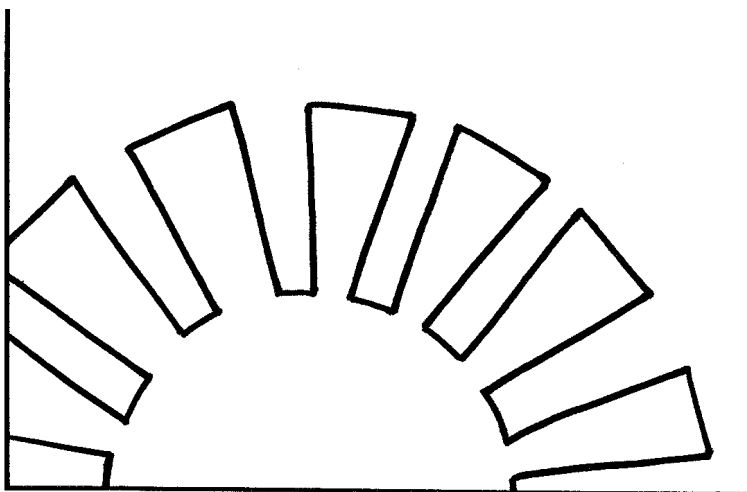
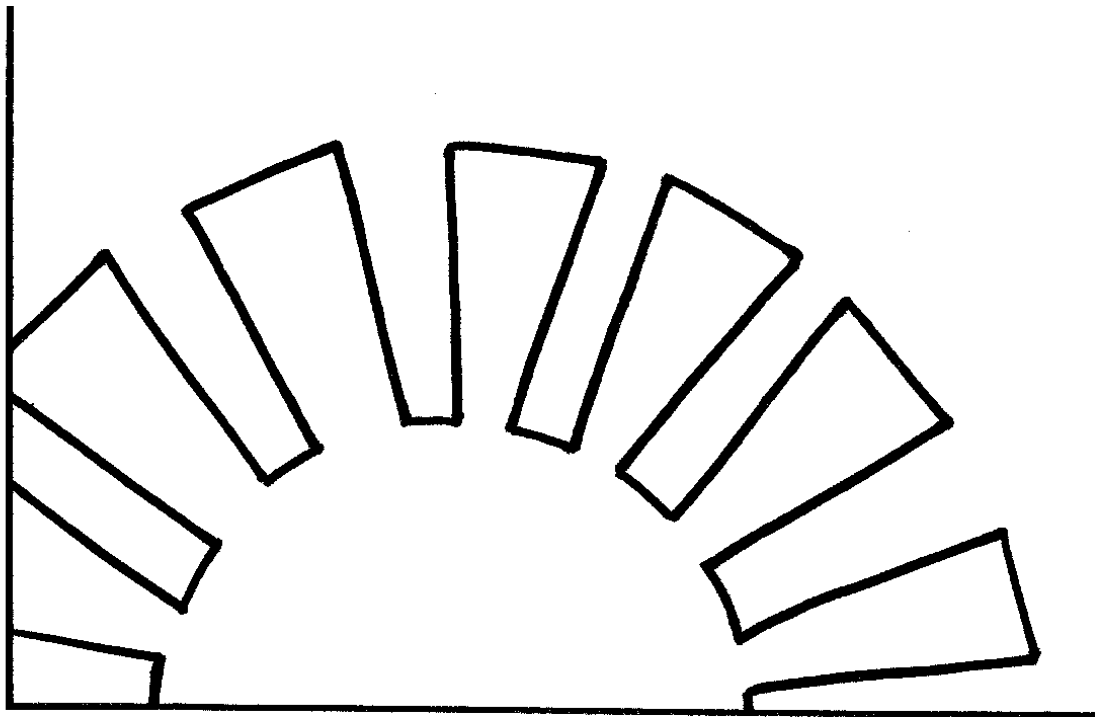
Print off the template sheet. Cut out the whole template in the square from the sheet and use the square to make a card blank. When you have your card blank done cut out the pattern template. Cut the whole shape out working around the outermost edge. Pick out a patterned paper and draw around the template onto it then cut it out. Take the template piece again and this time cut away the round circle shapes so you're left with the flowers and leaves.



Draw around this shape onto another piece of patterned paper and cut it out. Finally cut out the individual flowers from the template piece and draw around each of these on to coloured or patterned paper. You can use the same colour or pick out two different colours. Add a button or a decorative brad in the middle of the flowers. Layer all the cut out pieces up starting with the first piece you cut out and finishing with the flowers. Add the finished embellishment down the side of your card.

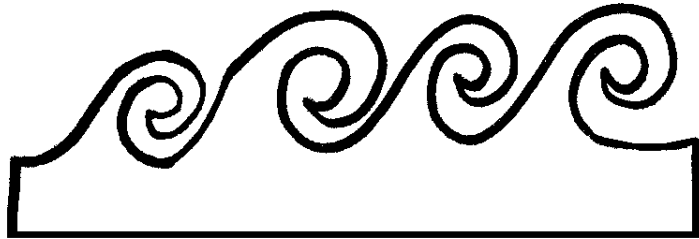
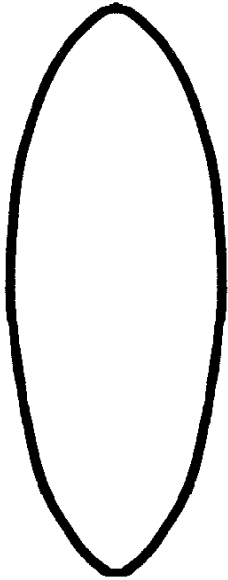
Two different sizes so you can use the one that fits your choice of card blank. The large size works on large cards or landscape DL size cards. The smaller size fits smaller cards or portrait A6 size cards.

Print off the template sheet. Decide which of the two sizes you would like to use on your card and then cut out the corresponding template. Place the template on a sheet of coloured or patterned card, draw around it then cut it out. Cover the front of your card blank with patterned paper. Add your sunshine embellishment to the lower left corner of your card. Finish your card with any extra embellishments of your choice.

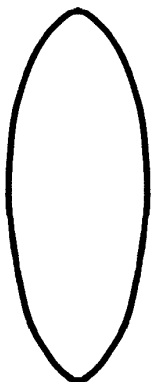

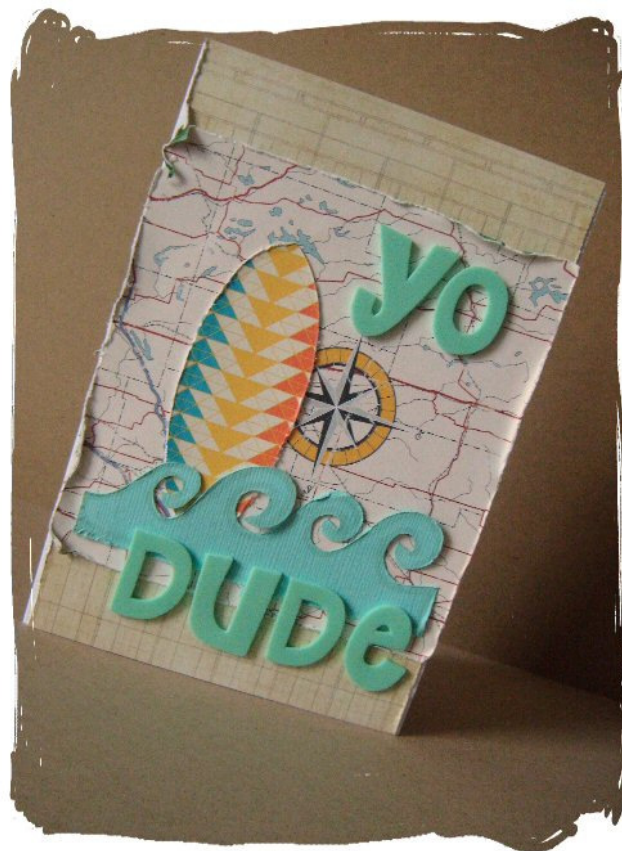
Two sizes, large size for large cards and smaller size for smaller cards and tags.

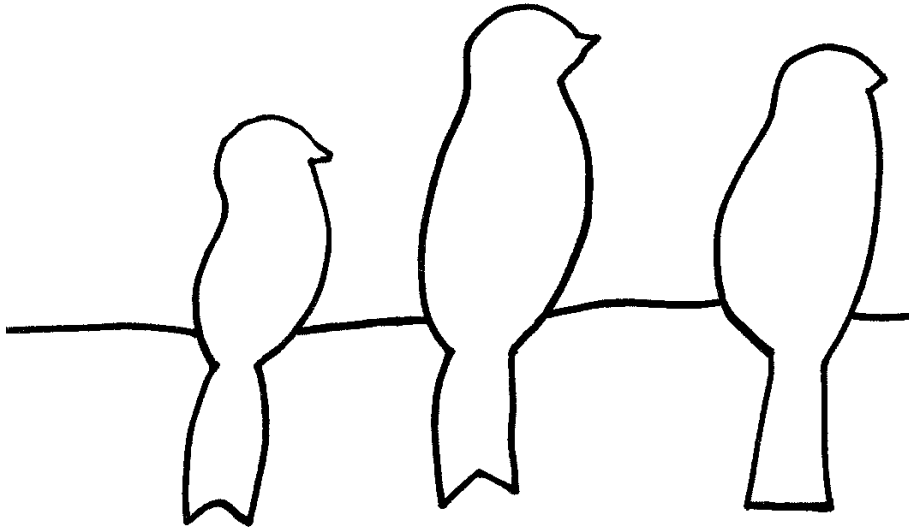


Print off the template sheet. Decide which size of template best suits the card you want to make and cut it out. You can use both the template, the larger one for a card and the smaller one for a matching gift tag. When you have your template cut out place the surf board on a piece of patterned paper and cut it out. Place the waves template on a piece of blue coloured card and draw around it then cut it out. Distress the edges of your waves embellishment. Cover the front of your card blank or tag blank with patterned paper. Add your surfboard embellishment to your card then add your waves over the top. Finish with your choice of message.

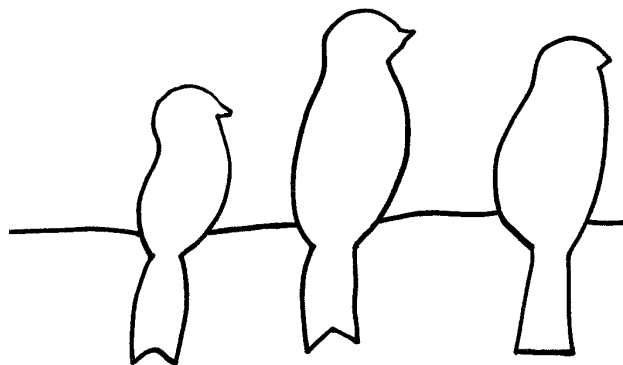

In two sizes for large and small cards or for landscape, (larger size) or portrait (smaller size) orientation on a standard A6 size card.

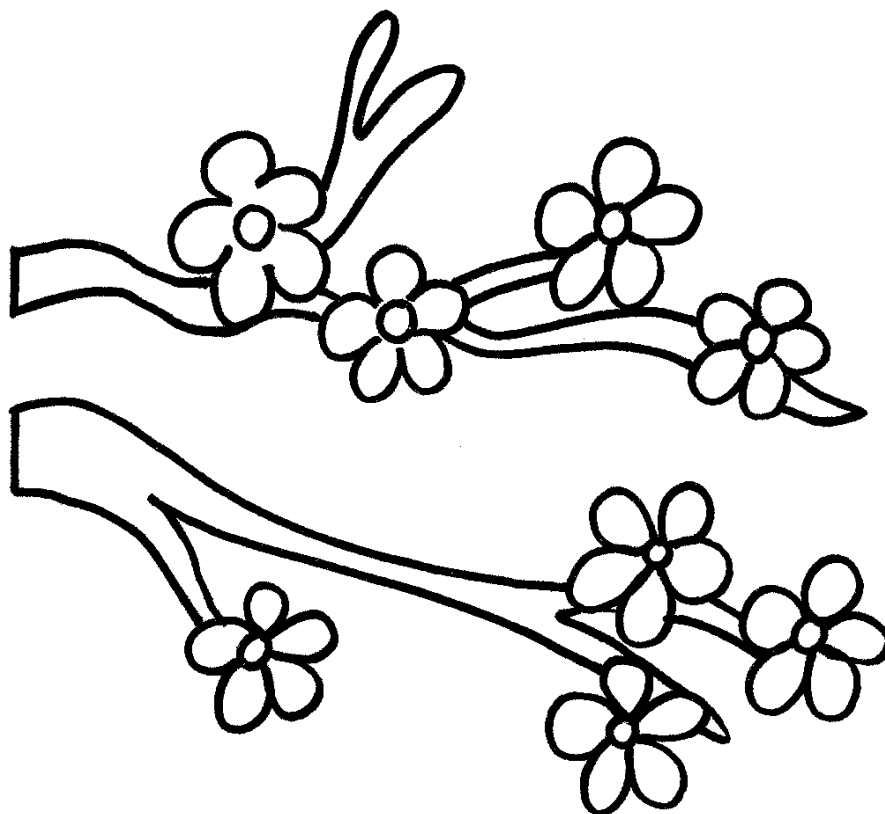


Print off the template sheet. Cut out the size of template you want to work with - choose one that suits your choice of card blank. Place the template on the front of your card and draw on the place of the 'wire' the birds are sitting on. Cut out the individual birds from the template and draw around them on to a dark coloured card or patterned paper. Cut each one out. Draw on the wire or use a line of machine stitching then glue the cut out birds on top. Add your choice of message to finish your card.

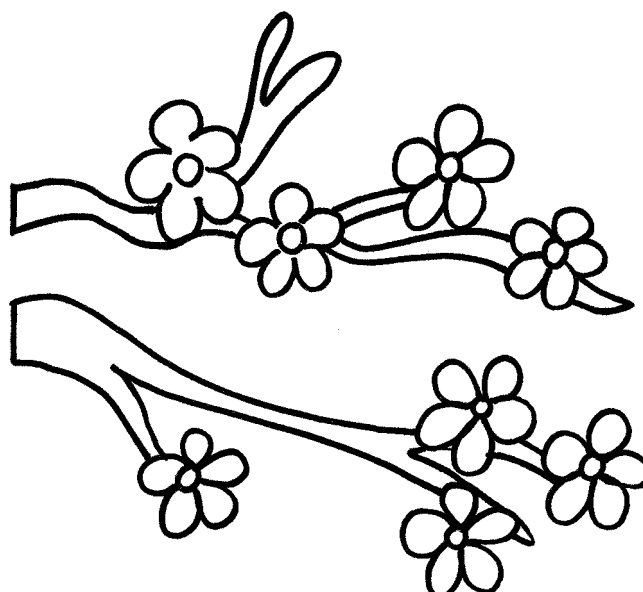

In two sizes for large and small cards or for landscape, (larger size) or portrait (smaller size) orientation on a standard A6 size card.



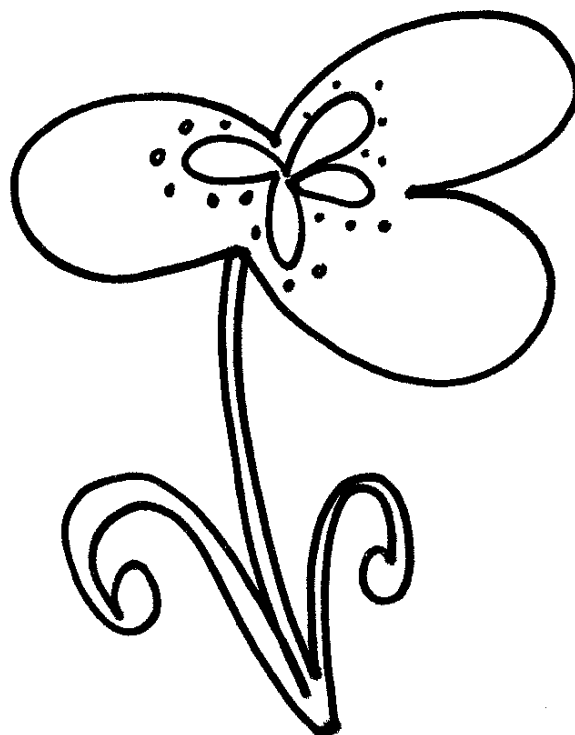
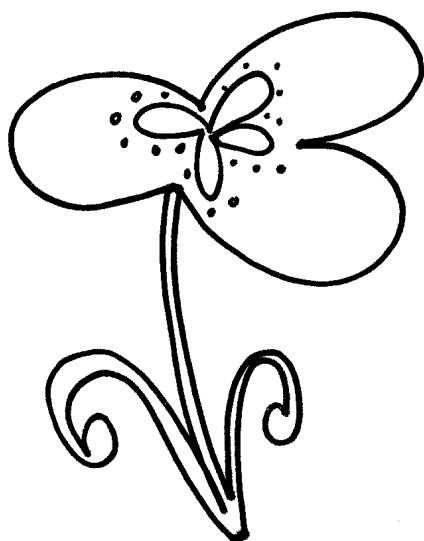
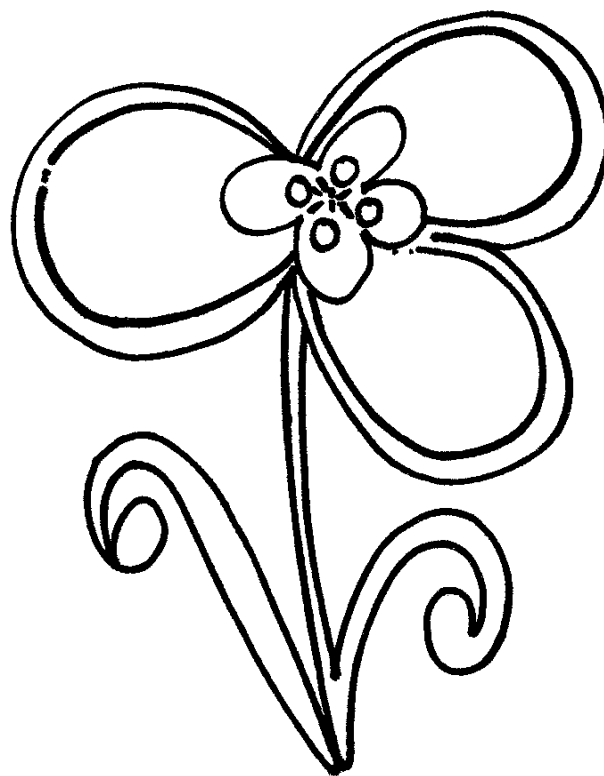
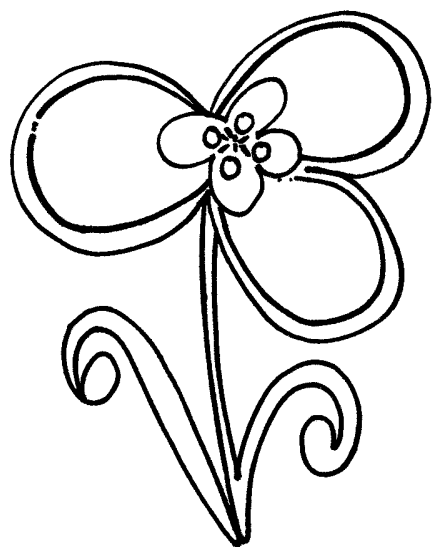
Print off the template sheet. Because this is an intricate design you can print the sheet directly on to patterned paper and cut it out. To do this print off the sheet on normal paper first then use some repositionable adhesive or Pritt Stick to temporarily glue a piece of patterned paper over the top of the printed design you want to use. Pop the sheet back through your printer and print the same page, (13) again so it prints the design over the top of the patterned paper piece. Peel off the paper and cut out the design to use. You can also use the design as a template cutting it out from a printed sheet and drawing around on to patterned paper then cutting out. Cut out each of the flowers from a different pattern design or colour or cover them with glitter to make them stand out.

When you have finished making your blossom embellishments adhere them to your chosen card blank in the top left corner so it appears the branches are popping out from the edge of your card.

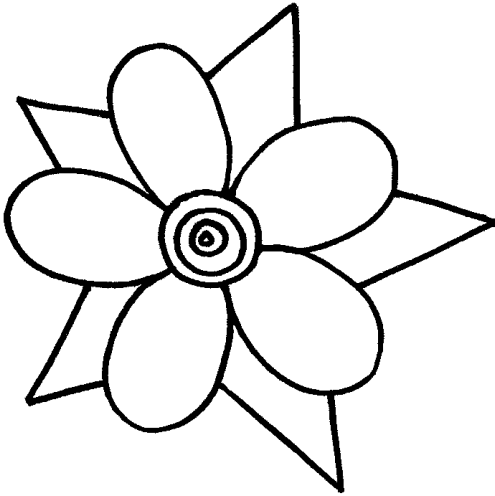
Print off the template sheet. This sheet has two different designs in two sizes. You can pick out one to fit on your choice of card blank or you can use more than one on one card it's up to you. Cut out the template you want to use. Place it on a sheet of patterned paper, draw around and cut out. Take the template piece again and this time cut out the center of the flower. Draw around it onto another piece of patterned paper. Build up the layers of patterned paper to make your embellishment. Distress each of the layers before gluing together to add more texture. Draw on the detail in the center of the flower or use cut out paper or beads/glitter etc. When you've completed your embellishment attach it to your card blank along with your choice of message.

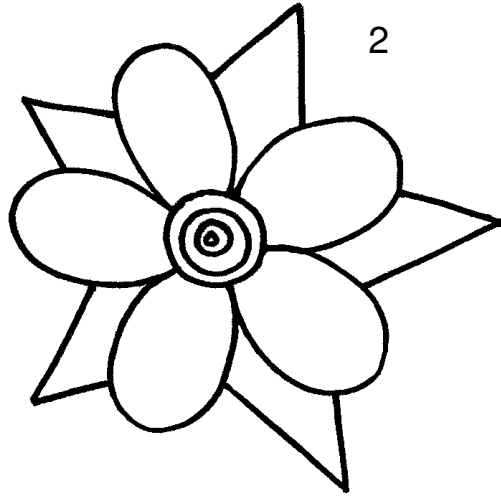

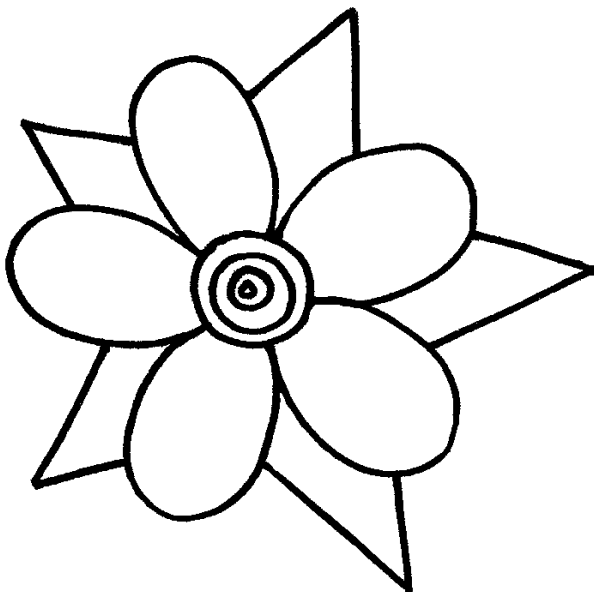

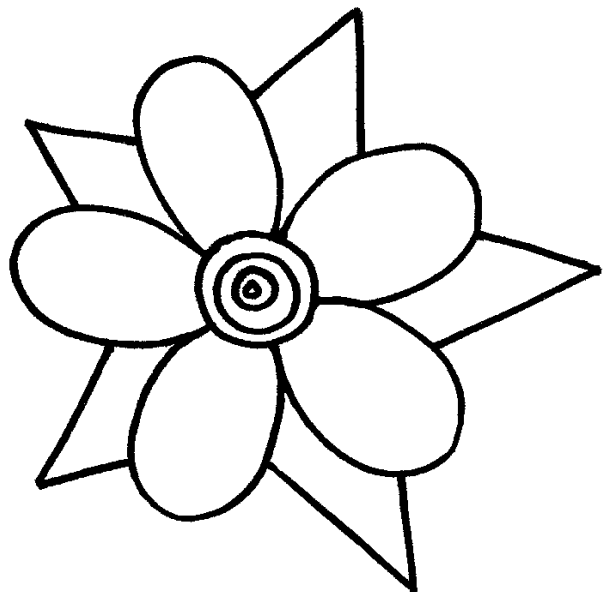


Two different sizes are given, the above size templates fit on a portrait A6, (4x6") size card. The size below fits a large square 6x6 size card. Two images are given for each size cut the whole shape out of 1 and the middle flower shape out of 2 then layer together.

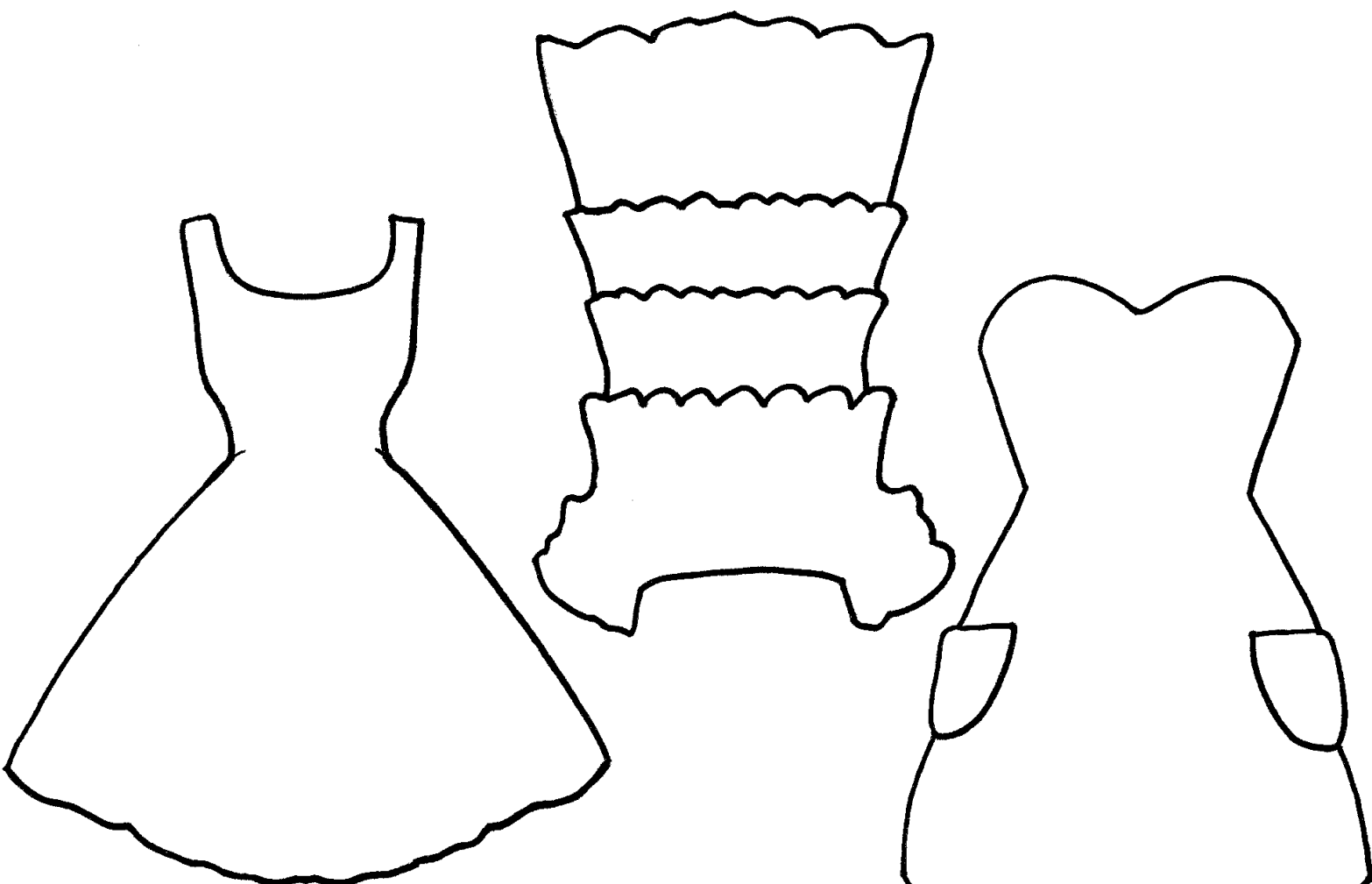
Print off the template sheet. Decide what size would best suit your project and cut out both the corresponding templates. Keep one of the templates whole and cut just the flower shape from the other template. Pick a patterned paper and draw around and cut out two of the whole template shapes from it. Pick out a second patterned paper and draw around and cut out two of just the flower shape template. Layer the two cut out shapes together to make two embellishments. If you want to make more than two flowers you can do this too. To make the center of the flower cut out a small circle of patterned paper then layer smaller circles of patterned paper on top.

You can add beads or a brad to the center if you choose. If you want to give your flowers more shape bend the petals of the second layer before gluing them down or build up more layers in one flower. When you've finished your embellishments add them to your project.

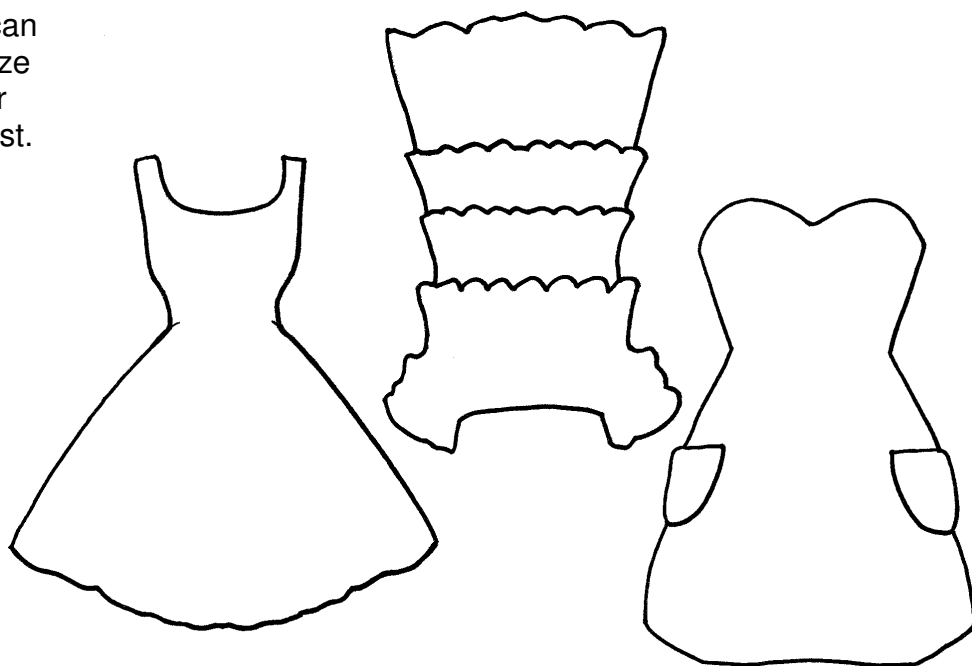

Two different sizes so you can choose the size that fits your project the best.



Print off the template sheet. Decide which dress shape you would like to use and cut it out. Take a piece of patterned paper and draw around the template on to it then cut it out. Draw around the edge of the shape with a marker pen. If you want to you can add shadows or add more colour on top with Promarker pens. Add any other embellishment to your dress you like. You could add a ribbon bow, add gems, sequins etc. When you've finished your dress embellishment to make it into a card first matt another piece of patterned paper on your card blank then add your dress embellishment on top. The dresses are idea to make use of small scraps of leftover patterned paper. Using the two different sizes on the template sheet you could make a card and matching gift tag. Bellow I've made a series of notecards using scraps of patterned paper and off-cuts of card. You could even use them as templates to cut the shapes out of fabric to make appliqués.
