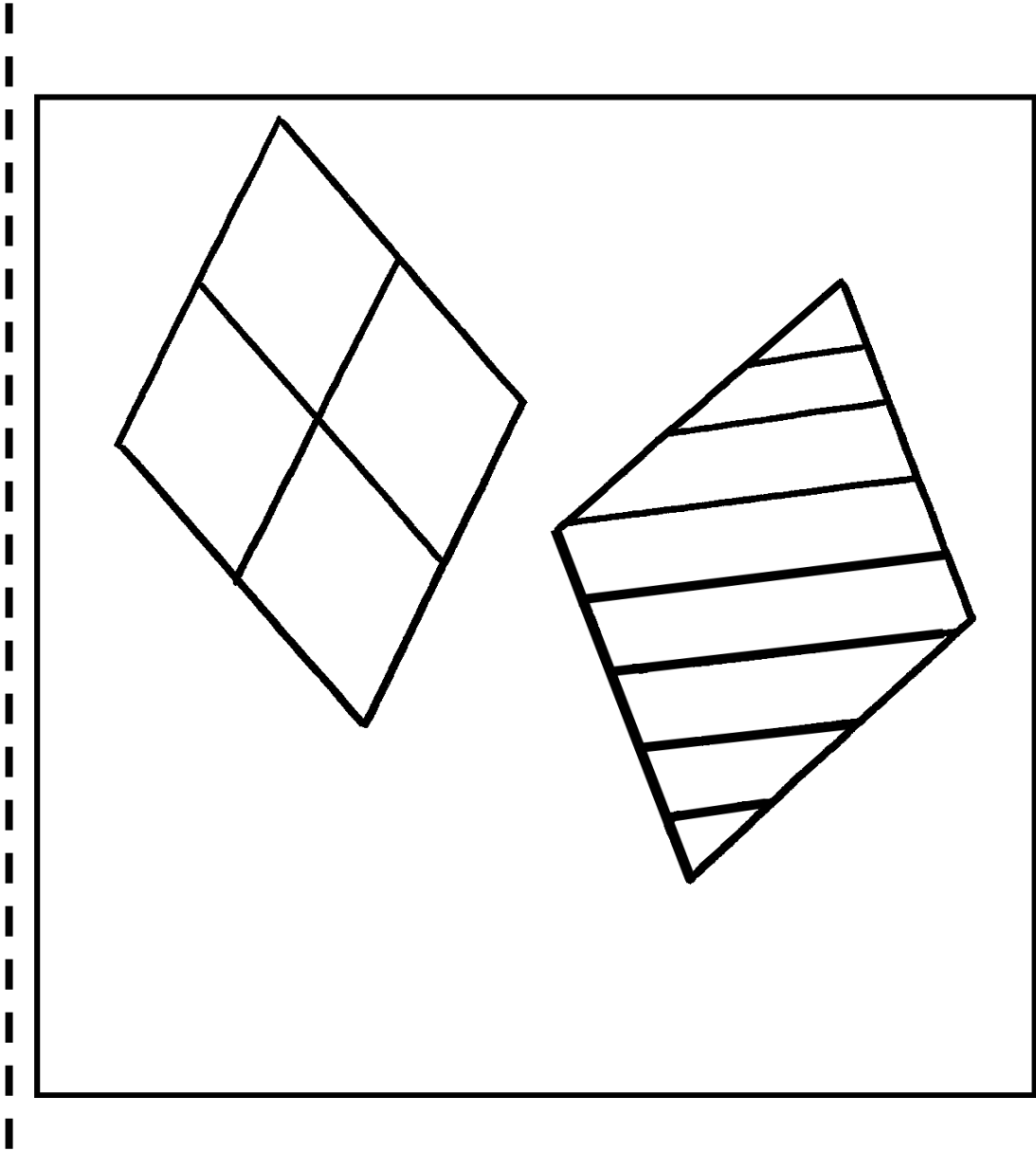

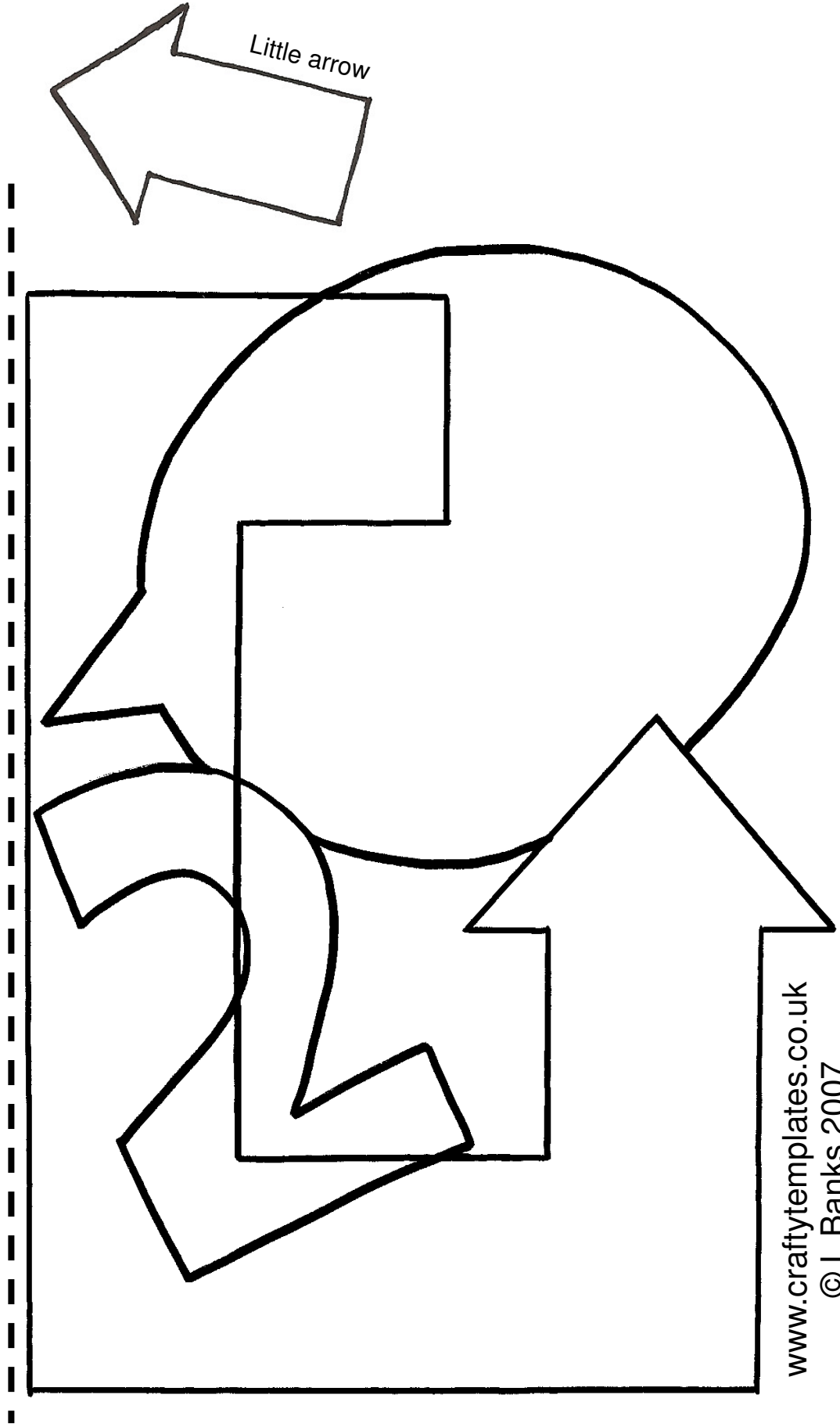

Three Tier Funky Cake

Wedding Car

To make the base card first print off the template. Cut it out cutting around the outermost lines only, all around the edge. Fold a piece of A4 card in half, so you have a landscape folding card (fold it from top to bottom) and match the fold line on the template to the fold on the card. Draw around the template, take it away and cut out the shape from the card, cutting through both sides of card together to create your shaped base card.

Next take your card and some coloured card (the colour you would like your car to be) and cover the whole of the front of your card with it. You'll also need some colours to make up the parts of the car, black card and silver card and colours for the sign and the lights. (alternatively you can trace the detail from the template and colour in with paints, embossing powders, chalks etc.)

Cut out all the parts of the car from the template and draw around them onto corresponding coloured card. Glue them to your card.

Optional bit:

You can add some trailing cans coming from the back of the car if you like. You can buy little cans already from craft stores or make your own from polymer clay. Attach the strings by tying them onto the bumper part of the card before gluing it onto the front of your card, (trap the knots underneath).

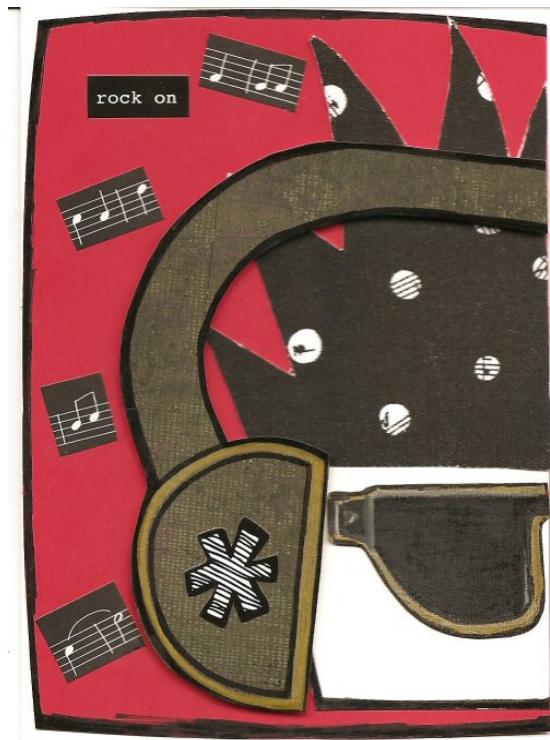
Cool Guy Card

Print off the template twice. Take one template and cut it out around the outside line.

Draw around this shape onto a piece of red (or other colour you'd like as the background) card and cut out. Take the same template and cut out the spiky hair and the face bit. Copy the face onto white card and cut out. Do the same with the spiky hair this time in black (or use other colours as you like) Cut out the sunglasses shape and draw around that on to more black card, cut out and highlight the edges with gold or silver pen. Assemble these pieces on the red card piece, matching the straight edges to the straight right hand edge of the card. Highlight all the edges with black pen. Next take the other template sheet you printed earlier and cut out the headphones bit. Draw around onto black or silver (or other colour) card and cut out.

Gain use gold or silver and black to highlight the edges. Stick down on your card, refer to the template for positioning. Finally stick this to an A5 size card blank or use a sheet of white A4 card folded in half. You can add more embellishments and/or a message if you like. On this card I've used papers and a sticker from the KI Memories Love Elsie range.

Bird Box Card

Print out the template and cut out the box (around the outside lines only) and the bird shapes. Fold a piece of A4 card in half and place your template on it, matching the fold line (dashed line) to the fold on your card. Draw around the template and cut out the shape. Now you've got your shaped base card. Cover your card with a patterned paper of your choice. Cut out the decorative roof part of the bird house from the template, draw around it onto a different patterned paper and cut out. Apply to your card. Cut the heart shape out from the top and cut that from more coloured or patterned paper and stick to your card. The hole in the bird house you can either cut directly from the front of your card or cut out a black piece of card as I've one in the sample. For the bird, you can use plain or patterned paper/card or for a different look try using felt. I've hand stitched around the edges and the wing too. You can make different cards just by changing the patterned paper you use. Make it cutesy or make it more traditional, it's up to you! You could also use the bird shape to make toppers for other cards. I've been making a few of them for scrapbook pages.

Pirate Flag

Print off the template and cut it out, cutting around the outside of it. Fold a piece of A4 card in half and place the template on it, matching the fold line (dashed line) to the fold on your card. Draw around and cut out.

Take the template again and cut out the skull and cross bones part.

Place them on some white card, draw around and cut out. Cover the flag shape card with black or grey paper or card. Draw around the edge of the flag with black pen, make it look like a tattered edge, you could cut it a little too if you wanted but don't cut along the folded edge. Go around the edge of the skull and cross bones with black pen and add the details too. Glue on your card front in the center of the flag.

You can add a message or other bits to your card to finish it or personalize it if you like.

Flying Kites

Print off the template and cut out the square shape. Fold a piece of A4 card in half and place the square on it, matching the fold line to the cards fold. Draw around and cut out. Cut the two kite shapes from the template and draw around them onto some patterned paper. Next take some fibers or lengths of wool and tie some ribbon along it to make the kite tails. Glue the kites on your card and glue on the kite tails in swirl patterns. Finish with a message attached to the front. You can add a sky background on your card for a different look or use a single kite as a topper on a different sized card. Have fun!

Funky Shapes Card

Print off the template three times on paper. Cut out around the edge of the whole template shape on one sheet. Fold a piece of A4 card in half, place the template on the card matching the fold line to the fold on the card. Draw around and cut out the shape to create the shape of your base card. Now cut out the large arrow shape from one of the templates and the bubble shape from the other. Draw around them on to coloured or patterned paper/card and cut them out. Each of the colours or patterns must be different to make each piece stand out. Draw around the shapes with black pen to highlight them. Stick them down on your card, the speech bubble overlaps the top of the arrow but the point of the arrow overlaps the speech bubble so stick them down accordingly. And match the edges up to the edges of your base card. Next take the first template you used and cut the number two shape from it. Draw around this on to patterned paper and cut out. Highlight the edge with black pen and stick to your card, refer to the template for positioning. Now you need to add the message. Apply this in the speech bubble with the little arrow between the two parts of your message if you need it. Cater the message to the theme of your card, the number two represents the 'too' so you could have "Happy Birthday '2' you", "Hello '2' you", "Sending Best Wishes '2' You", "From Me '2' You" etc.

Summer fashion Card

Print out the template. Cut out the template, cutting around the outside edge only. Fold a sheet of A4 card in half, place the template on it matching the dashed fold line up to the fold on the card, draw round the shape and cut out to make your shaped base card. Pick out a patterned paper or colour you would like the beach bag part of the card to be and cover the whole of the front of your card with it. Next take the template again and cut the shoe part of the template from it. Cut each part of the shoe apart and draw around each part of the shoe onto different coloured or patterned papers. Re-assemble the shoe parts on your card, sticking in place when you're happy with them. Take the template again and cut the starfish shape out, draw around it on to coloured card and cut out then stick to the beach bag, somewhere in the center. Finally take the template again and cut the beach bag handle from it. Use the same patterned or coloured paper you used for the bag to draw around the handle in but don't try to match the pattern up. The patterns need to be at odd angles for it to look right. Draw on a stitched pattern along the edges of the handle piece and stick it to your card.

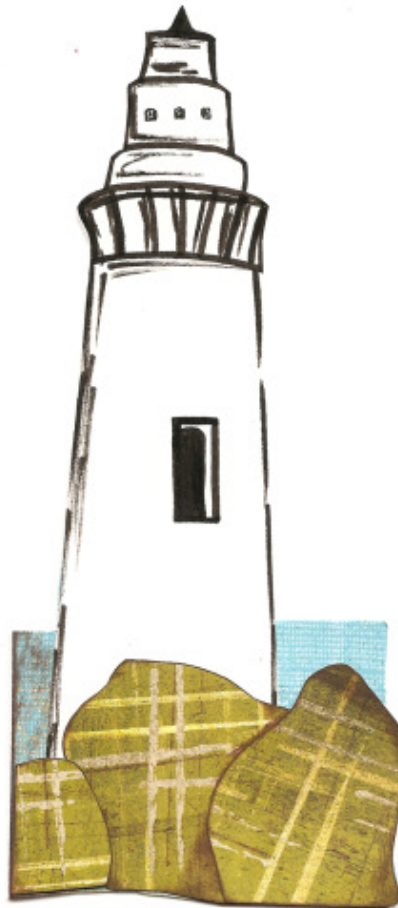

Lighthouse Card

Print off the template. Fold a piece of A4 card in half lengthwise to create a long tall card. Cut out the lighthouse shape, cutting around the outside lines only. Place on the folded card and match up the fold line from the template to the fold on the card. Draw around the outside of the shape and then cut it out to make your shaped base card. Next cover the whole of the card with sea coloured card or paper. Cut the main lighthouse part of the template out and draw around it on some white card, cut it out then trace on the detail from the template, use paints or watercolour or pen for the detail. Finally cut out the rocks and draw around them on some patterned paper. I chose a green seaweed type pattern to go with the sea theme.

Rocket Card

Print out the template. Cut out the rocket shape, around the outside lines only. Pick out a sheet of A4 coloured card you would like your rocket to be, place the rocket template on it and draw around the rocket shape twice. Cut out both shapes then take one of the rocket shapes and place the template back over it. Cut along the dotted line in the middle of the template, so you're cutting through the card as well. Stop at the red line. Take the other rocket shape you've cut out and turn it upside down. Place the template on this piece and cut along the dotted line again, this time cutting from the top to the red line. The two rocket shapes should now slide together to create a 3D rocket shape. Use the other parts of the template to decorate the rocket. Have fun!

Three Tier Funky Cake

This card can be used for a birthday card or a wedding card just by changing which topper you choose to use from the template sheet. In the example I've used the heart to make a wedding card but all you need to do is swap this for the candles to create a birthday card.

To make the base card first print off the template. Cut it out cutting around the outermost lines only, all around the edge. Fold a piece of A4 card in half and match the fold line to the fold on the card, you'll need to turn your card to the side for this. Draw around the template and cut it out from the card, cutting through both sides of card together to create your shaped base card.

Next pick out some patterned paper or you can trace off the pattern from the template and colour that in. I'm using patterned paper, I've picked out three patterns, one for each of the tiers and pink for the 'icing'.

Take the template again and cut off each tier of the cake. Place each on in turn on the patterned papers, draw around and cut out. Stick each of the pieces on your base card. Now cut the icing parts from the template and draw around them on to white card (or another colour you want to use for the icing). Stick these to each cake tier on your card.

Finally pick out a topper to use, cut it out and draw around it onto some heavy weight card. Cover with patterned paper or paint/colour it in. Stick it on your card so it's stuck to the top but overlapping the fold too.

That's it all done! The card will fit in a DL envelope, a 5x7 envelope or a A6 envelope with out the topper.
